

The Constitution, says Stanley Reed, solicitor general of the United States, "is a living, vital institution whose function is to guide and not to curb necessary governmental

Just what does Mr. Reed mean by that? Can he mean that when certain governmental processes are regarded by the majority in power as necessary, the Constitution should not be permitted to stand in the way no matter what its words? What else can he mean by speaking of the Constitution as a living, vital institution that was not intended to curb "necessary government processes"? And what are necessary government processes? A Constitution is designed to define and to limit the powers of government and to say what a government can and cannot do. And its greatest function is to prevent the government from doing that which it should not do. Its greatest function is to curb those who would act arbitrarily. 


