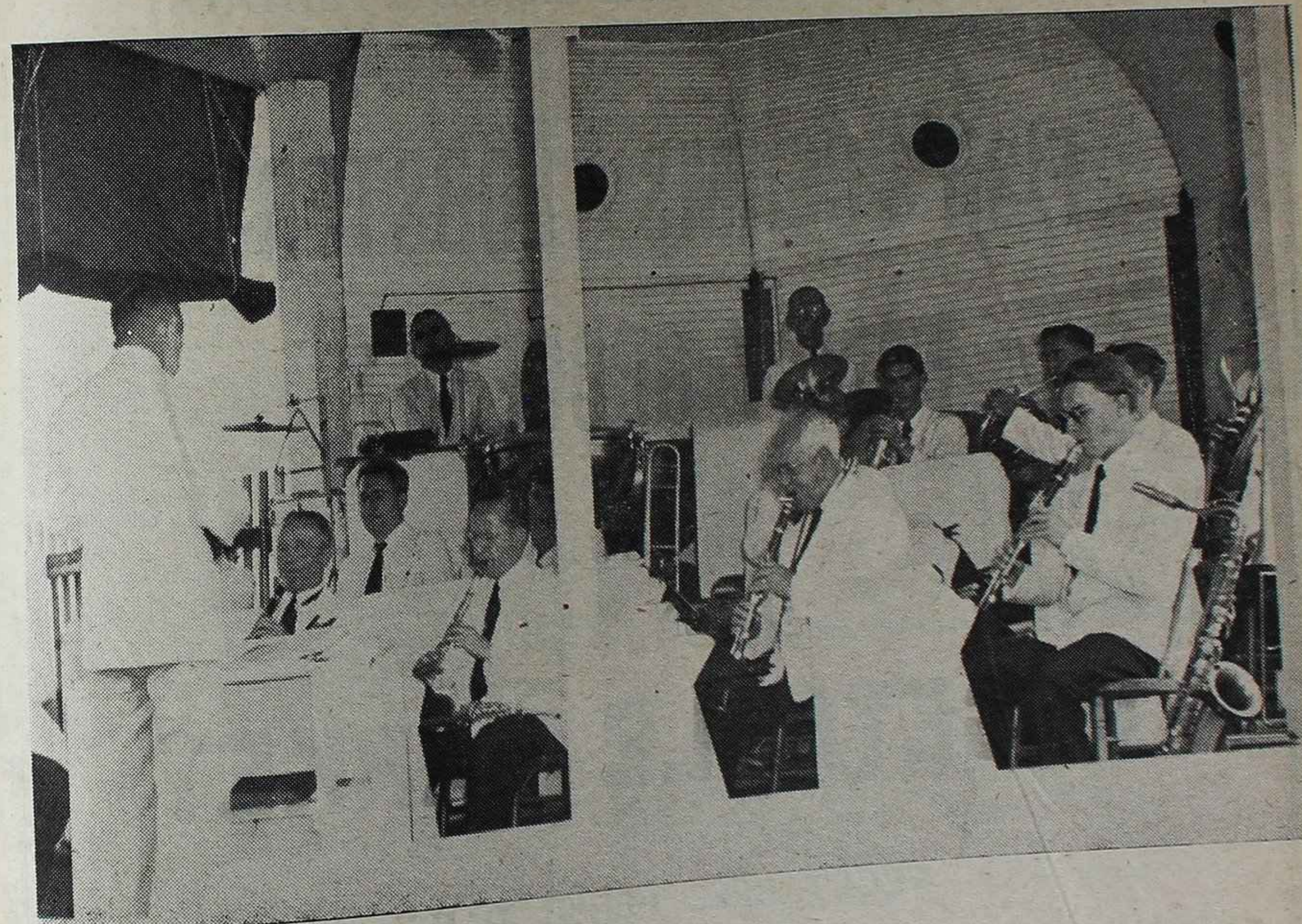

# Beach Panorama

Have you ever interviewed a whirlwind? Several Fridays ago I talked with Hal McDonnell for a story for the following week. He is a whirlwind.

I went to the band room to see

him between afternoon concerts and after waiting a few minutes, he motioned me to his office. I settled down, prepared for at least half an hour of questions, etc., thinking that after his many years-34 in all-at the beach, he'd have a great deal to say.

Crash-bang-in 10 minutes I had three pages of notes and was on my way out.

All that weekend I was afraid to look at those pages, knowing it would be a laborious task to decipher the hieroglyphics. I never really recovered enough to write up the story until it got to be Monday, August 26, and the last Beach-comber deadline was on the horizon. Then I had to go through with it-ready or not.

But, seriously, that isn't all true. I saved it till the last for a special reason.

On the last official night of the season, Hal and the boys play the last band concert. With Bill Elliot coming in for the final half hour or so with all the past summer favorites and the songs of the last fifty years, this concert has become a symbol. To the people who have spent the season at the beach, the "last band concert" is terrifically sentimental. No matter how tired people may be after working hard all summer-no matter what exciting plans some may have for the Fall-somehow or other, the last Sunday night makes them say, "Oh, if only this were the beginning instead of the end."

To the men on the bandstand it means the end of another busy summer-a season of four concerts a day-280 hours of entertainment for the thousands of McDonnell fans.

granted because it's there day after day. They listen to it and enjoy it but they may not appreciate its uniqueness. For it is unique in that it provides classical as well as

popular music for your listening pleasure.

Most of these musicians have worked together for years. Young and old, their musical minds are one with their conductor, Hal McDonnell. A real showman, his personality is magnetic. Some time ago, when he was replaced for two or three years, people felt the lack of something on the bandstand. Even those who hadn't come to know Hal too well missed it. They still enjoyed the music but something was gone - spirit, flavor or what have you. Then popular demand brought the spirit back, and since then the summers have been seasoned with that McDonnell flavor.

Born with a silver baton in his hand, he learned to walk on sharps and flats. His years of practice and study brought him while still young, to the attention of famous conductors - among them, Sousa and Prior. After a few years with each, he gathered together his own organization.

Besides his summer work here he has trained, and is still teaching hundreds of pupils, for he holds the title of Superintendent of Instrumental Music at Searles High school in Methuen, Mass., at

Tewksbury, Wilmington and at Phillips Andover Academy.

Kidingly I asked him that clever question "What do you do with your spare time?" (I did have time to get in one whole question.) I thought he didn't know that there was such a thing because, ever since I can remember, he's been rushing somewhere to performances, to rehearsals, to lunch, to meetings. But my question brought

on a smile. He looked relaxed even while he just talked about his hobby.

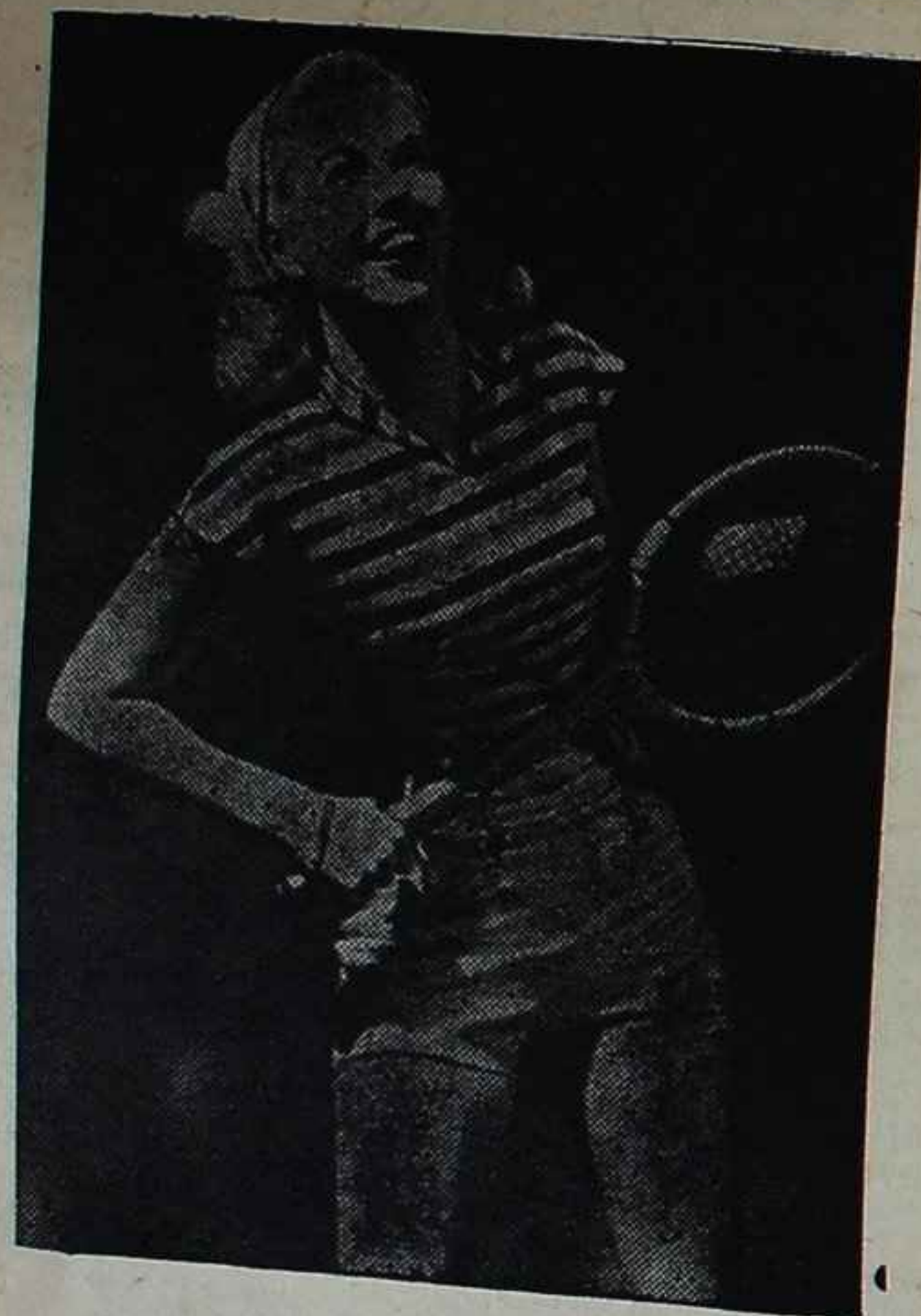

by. Taking a picture from the wall, he beamed while I looked at his beautiful boat, the "HalMac." She accommodates eight passengers, has broken a few records and two years ago was Hal's summer home.

Probably no one could tell you more about Hal, the musician, than two members of the band. Starting out with him 22 years ago when he signed his first contract with the Chamber of Commerce, they are his father, Stephen McDonnell and Henry Lajoie, both sitting in the front row — one on either side of

the conductor. Henry a solo clarinetist, is also identified with the Colonial and Palace theatres in Haverhill. Hal's father was formerly with the Higgins and Downs Concert Band. However, the McDonnells played here even before the contracts were signed — in fact 12 years before. And with them for the last 30 years has been John Winslow the tuba player. A teacher and conductor in his own right is Peter Conforti, baritone, who is well known as a school band leader in Manchester. Prior to coming to this part of the country he was at the Academy of Music and the Paramount Theatre in New York City.
