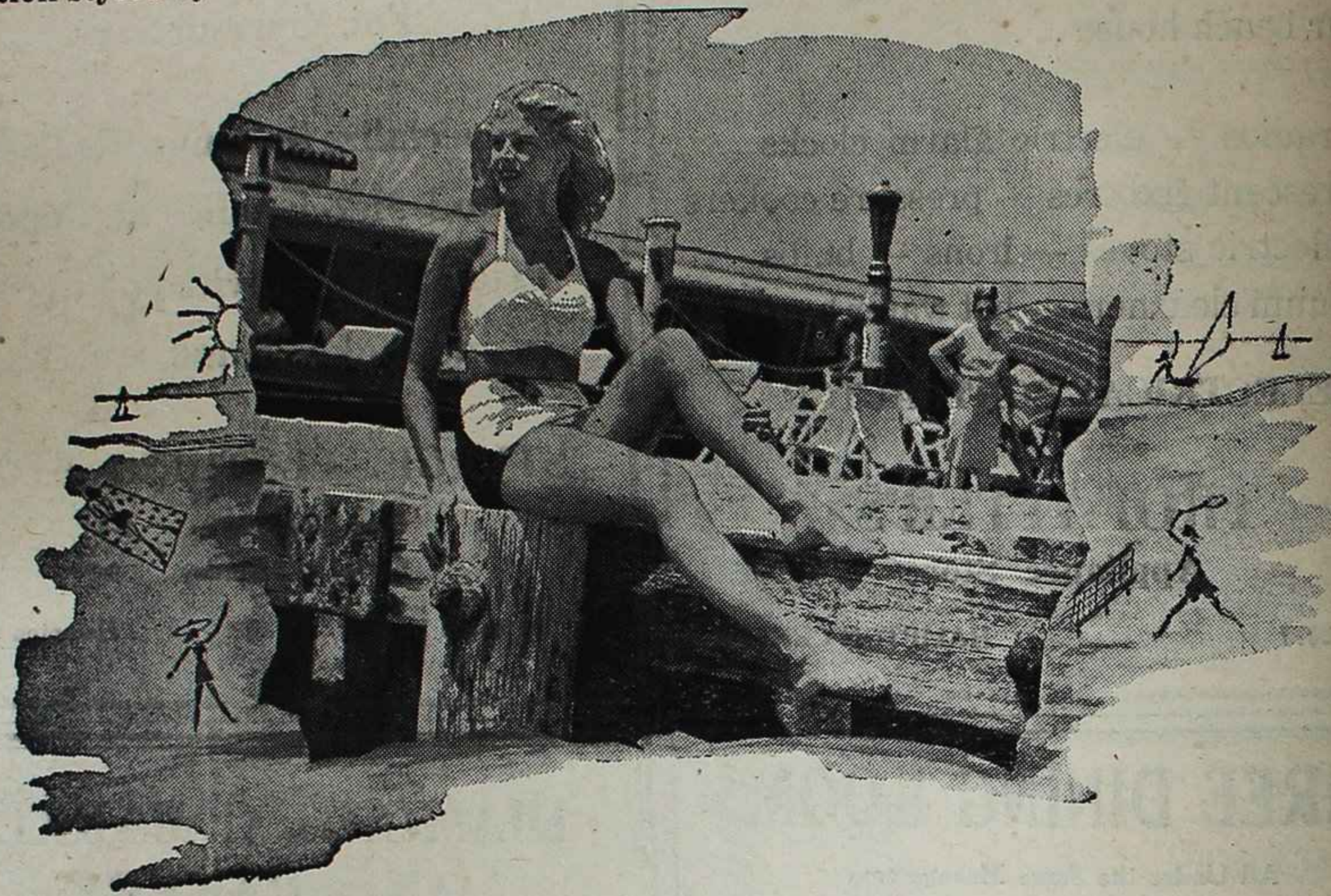

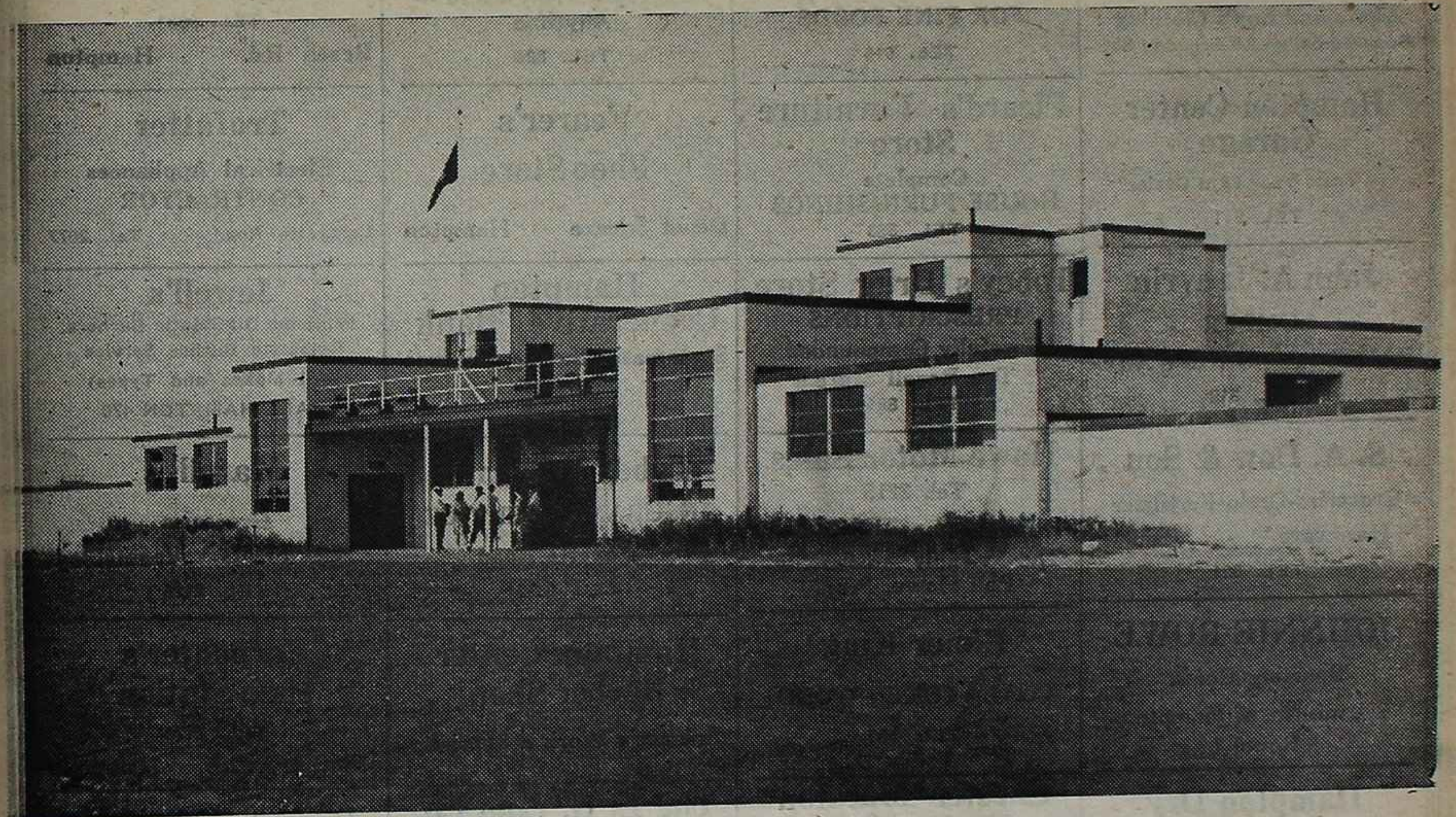

## Holiday Weekend Crowd Equals All Records

### Beach Resident Reports Seeing 'Flying Object'

The mysterious "flying saucers" which have the entire nation on tenterhooks are believed to have been seen at Hampton Beach on Saturday evening.

Mrs. Marion Tucker of Church street reports that she sighted what she now believes must have been one of the so-called "saucers" about 7:30 in the evening while sitting on her piazza.

Mrs. Tucker had no idea at the time what it was she saw, but knows that it was perfectly round in shape and was traveling northward on a verticle plane, quite a distance out at sea and quite high in the sky.

Having been a plane spotter in the Civilian Aircraft Warning Service for nearly two years during the war, Mrs. Tucker gained considerable experience in sighting planes and estimating distances and she states that if the object was a plane, "it was the funniest looking airplane I have ever seen. The object was perfectly round and had no wings or tail and looked just like a big plate."

### Estimate 225,000 Persons Visit Beach Over The Long Fourth

#### Nashua Man Hurt When Struck By Bat On Holiday

William Lapza, 55, of Nashua, is still under observation at the Exeter Hospital where he was taken after an accident on the beach Friday afternoon when he was struck by a baseball bat. According to Police Chief John Malek, Lapza suffered severe lacerations about the left temple and lower lip and a possible skull fracture when the bat accidentally slipped from the hand of Robert J. Dinan, 22, also of Nashua, who was playing softball.

The accident occurred on the sands opposite Bradford Avenue. A short time after the accident, Dinan reported it to Police Headquarters. No charges have been preferred.

This accident was the only serious one reported over the holiday weekend despite the heavy flow of traffic at the beach and the record-breaking crowd. Three slight automobile accidents were reported

One of the largest holiday crowds in history, equalling all former records, flocked to Hampton Beach for the long Fourth of July weekend with businessmen estimating that nearly 225,000 persons visited the beach over the holiday period.

Despite the heavy traffic which poured onto the beach from both north and south arteries, only a few minor accidents with no serious injuries resulting were reported.

Hotels and rooming houses were filled to capacity and hundreds of vacationists found refuge in Hampton village homes for both nights with many others walking the streets till dawn or sleeping in their cars.

The lone accident reported to police caused minor injuries to six persons early Sunday morning in a two-car crash near the Mile bridge. Mrs. Dorothy Mahoney of 35 Bridge street, Manchester, and Betty McHugh of 271 Concord street, Manchester were shaken up when a car operated by Mrs. Mahoney was in collision with an automobile driven by Ernest J. Mailhot, Methuen.

Game Warden "Framed"**

Charging that Coastal Warden Alfred M. Jenness was "framed" by fishermen engaged in the short lobster racket, the New Hampshire

Legal Lobster association met last Wednesday in Community Hall, Hampton Beach to prepare a formal protest to Governor Charles M. Dale.

Members of the association which includes lobstermen, sportsmen, civic and business leaders angrily denounced the "politics" which protects the men engaged in taking "shorts" and demanded that something be done to clean up what they described as a "rotten situation" in New Hampshire's lobster fishing industry.

Jenness "Framed"  
It was the consensus at the meeting that Jenness had been "framed" and that a ring of lobstermen operating out of Portsmouth and Rye Harbor were responsible for Jenness' suspension.

Local fishermen testified that the lobster take had fallen off so sharply during the past four years due to the taking of "shorts," that they could no longer make a living. It was stated that in 1945 the haul from 160 traps averaged 450 pounds a day whereas today the fisherman is lucky to bring in 30 pounds a day.

Testimony was offered by some of those present that their lives had been threatened by members of the short lobster ring if they didn't "keep their noses out of other people's business."

Charges were also made that the "short" lobster racket was being protected by persons in high places and that a member of the ring had boasted that he had sold "shorts" to everyone in the State House except Carpenter.

The highlight of the meeting occurred at the very outset when three members of a rival group of lobster fishermen tried to force their way into the meeting. The three were ordered from the hall just before the meeting got underway. One of them was recently arrested by Officer Jenness for allegedly taking 290 "short" lobsters.

About 20 minutes after the meeting had gotten under way the trio returned with eleven companions from the Portsmouth-Rye Harbor area. The meeting was held up and

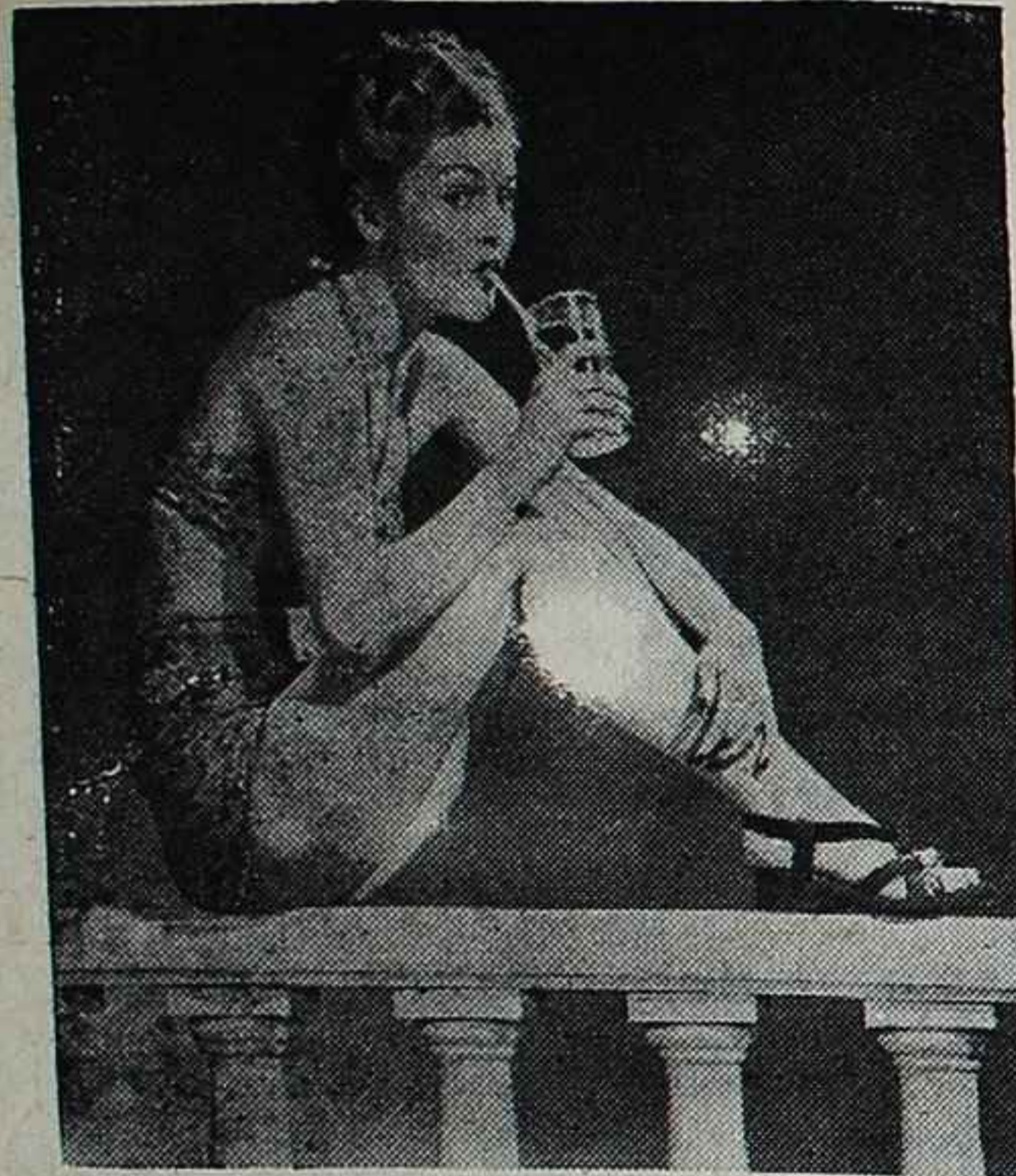

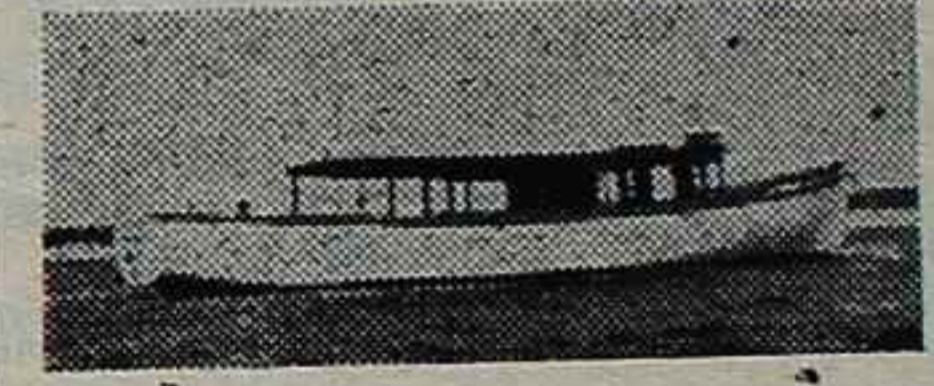

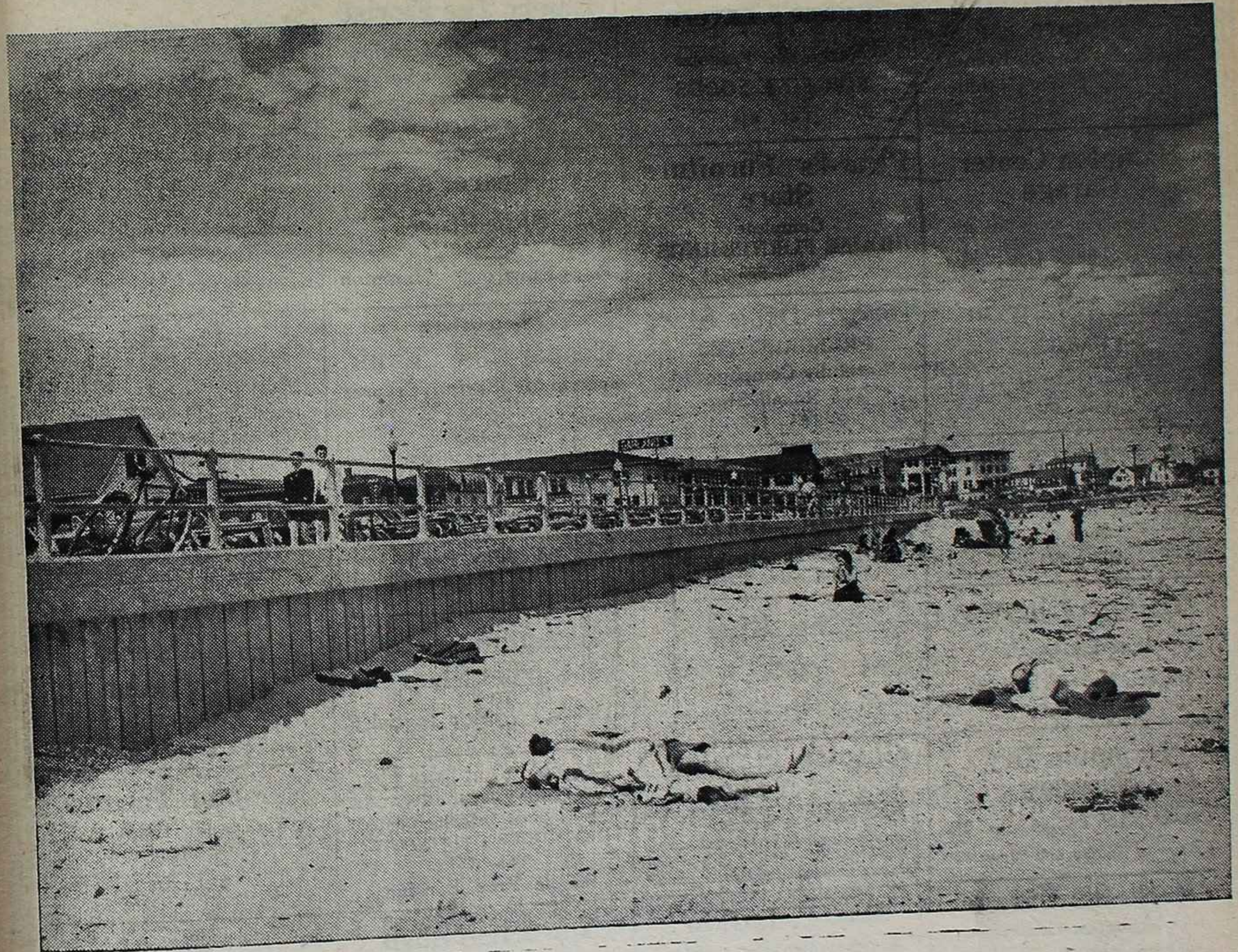
