Parade, Special Shows And Luncheon Mark Annual Affair

Additional Coast Guard Protection For N. H. Seacoast

Added Coast Guard protection for New Hampshire's coastline is on the way for Portsmouth Harbor, Isles of Shoals and Hampton Beach stations.

Senator H. Styles Bridges has learned that Coast Guard officials plan more manpower and equipment for this area than has been available since the war.

New equipment will include motor lifeboats, motor surfboats, picket boats, pulling boats and an amphibious truck for the Hampton Beach lifeboat station. Extra personnel, although already allocated, will depend on the over-all personnel situation, the Coast Guard said.

The coastal area, which has had limited Coast Guard protection for several months, has sought additional men and equipment to aid the seacoast's fishing industry and yachtsmen.

Circus Attracts Young And Old

A new type of show made its bow on Hampton Beach this season, a miniature circus, stemming from show business itself which has become very popular to children and adult alike.

It consists of hundreds upon hundreds of individual pieces on a scale of one inch to the foot. Complete circus spectacle and individual typical big-top acts working simultaneously on three rings, platforms and in the air are shown in a cutaway big-top modeled after the Ringling-Barnum show. The model show includes the appurtenances of a circus lot from the side shows and menagerie to horse tent and back lot cookhouse.

This model circus was used in making the storm scenes in the movie "The Big Top." Many stories have appeared in magazines and in the news reels.

It was constructed and assembled by the famous Edwards family of hobbyists and wood carvers, and is valued at \$25,000.

Some of the miniature animals that are seen came from Germany and Italy before the outbreak of the second World War. On the circus lot are many people strolling down the midway. There are clowns, circus barkers, a balloon man and many other people usually seen on circus grounds. Sound effects from several sound machines complete the reality of the entire assemblage.
