





Assisting him in his duties is a nurse who has been with him for 46 years, and whom he now refers to as his "office girl."

A record tax rate of \$33 per thousand, an increase of \$2.50 over last year, was announced today for Hampton by Elroy G. Shaw, Chairman of the Board of Selectmen. The 1946 rate was \$30.50.

Increases in the bugets for town government expenditures and the school district voted by the taxpayers in March necessitated the jump in the tax rate.

The new tax rate was approved by the state tax commission earlier this week. At the same time it was announced that the Precinct tax rate would be \$5.40 a decrease

of \$.40 from last year.
