Rye Summer Resident Has Been Physician For 63 Years

Dr. Charles W. Adams, 84, of Franklin, N. H., and a summer resident at Rye North Beach

recently celebrated his 63rd year as practicing physician, and is one of the oldest practicing doctors in the state of New Hampshire. His grandfather, William Trefethen, built his home at Rye Center and it was in Rye that his mother and sister were born.

Dr. Adams' father was the Methodist minister in Rye and his mother was the former Lyda Ann Trefethen. They started housekeeping in the home which is now the residence of Mr. and Mrs. George Ellison, Rye Center.

June, 1884, marked the beginning of a career for Dr. Adams, for on that date he started practicing in Franklin, with \$2.56 in his pocket and a debt of \$1,500. Dr. Adams' success is explained by his modesty. "I like to look ahead to what I can do, not back on what I have done," he says. "It makes me tired to look back."

He was one of the organizers of the Franklin hospital and a promoter for the home for the aged. Among his numerous activities are included the presidency of the Franklin Savings bank, director of the Franklin Building and Loan, ex-mayor of Franklin, member of the legislature for two sessions, member of the state medical board for 26 years, the longest period any member has served, a member of the board of education, and member of the board of health. Assisting him in his duties is a nurse who has been with him for 46 years, and whom he now refers to as his "office girl."

Relatives in Rye are Miss Emma Foss, the doctor's niece, and Mrs. Annie Ellingwood and Mr. George Locke, cousins. He has one son, Charles, a Harvard graduate who is treasurer of the Franklin Savings Bank and executive vice-president of the Franklin National Bank. He also has one grandchild.

Dr. Adams always looks forward to his annual vacation at his cottage in Rye, which he purchased in 1940.

Tax Rate
A record tax rate of \$33 per thousand, an increase of \$2.50 over last year, was announced today for Hampton by Elroy G. Shaw, Chairman of the Board of Selectmen. The 1946 rate was \$30.50.
Increases in the budgets for town government expenditures and the school district voted by the taxpayers in March necessitated the jump in the tax rate.
The new tax rate was approved by the state tax commission earlier this week.
At the same time it was announced that the Precinct tax rate would be \$5.40 a decrease of \$.40 from last year.

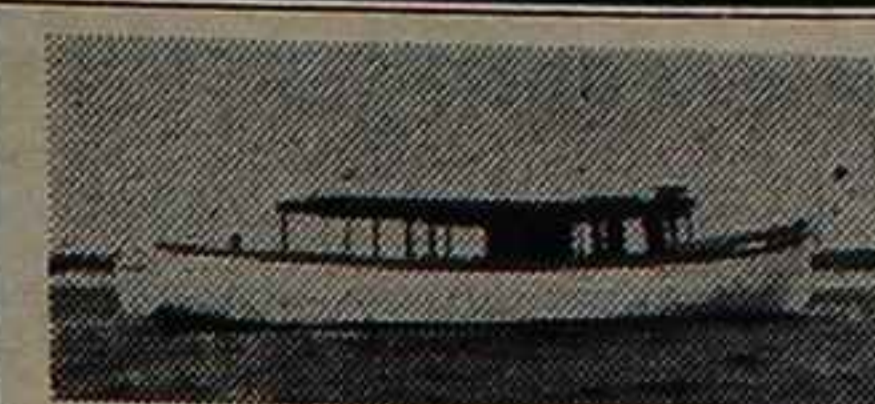

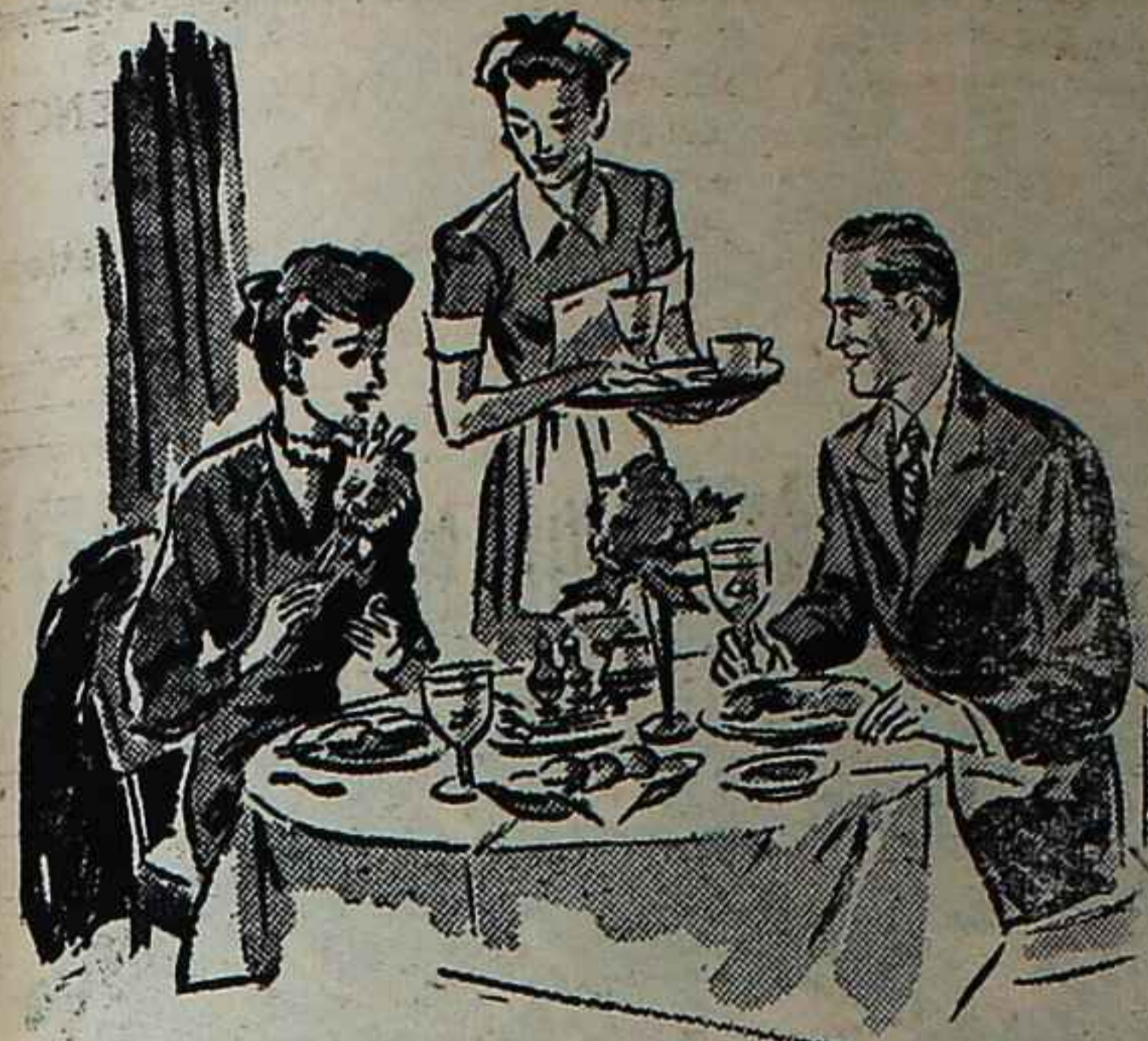
