#### Summer Calendar Margaret Issued By State

CONCORD, N. H., June 30 - The latest edition of the New Hampshire Recreational Calendar, a 12page folder of vacation events and attractions in the Granite State, was recently issued by the State Planning and Development Commission, it was announced today.

Information listed includes summer theatre schedules, historic buildings and museums, art exhibitions, facilities for summer study, square dancing, tennis, golf, horse shows, water events, boat cruises, arts and crafts, fairs, celebrations and Old Home Days, plus thumb nail descriptions of several outstanding attractions.

An impressive increase in the number of vacation events scheduled in New Hampshire each year is indicated by the fact that it was necessary to increase the size of the Calendar by two pages this year, just as last year it was increased two pages over the summer before, the Commission said.
