## Modern Two-Way Radio Protects Beach

### Bottle Launched At Beach Picked Up In Portugal

Two youngsters spending the summer at Hampton Beach got an answer this week to a note they put in a bottle over 11 months ago and set adrift in the Atlantic.

The two children, Kenneth Tarbell of 131 Parker street, Lowell, Massachusetts, and Doreen Turberry, 463 Lowell St., Manchester, both of whom spend the summer in Hampton, wrote a note last August and put it in a bottle along with several postcard pictures of Hollywood movie stars. The bottle was sealed and thrown overboard at the beach.

The children and their parents returned to their respective homes for the winter and thought no more of the incident. Yesterday, nearly 12 months later, they received a reply to the message. The bottle had finally come to rest on the shores of an island in the sea of Portugal.

The letter, which was mailed to young Tarbell on July 7 and received at his Lowell home on July 14 reads in part as follows.

"My dear freand, today I found this bottle with those picture of that favorite actress and your

letter. I just write to you so you can know that this bottle was found on the ocean Portugese. I want to let you know that I am a marly man and I have a big family, I beg you if you have some old close of of yourself so you could sent it to me for my children is want old close. Dear freand are you Portugese or American. I like to know please do answer my letter."

The letter finally closes with the address of the sender and another plea to send old clothes in a barely legible hand. Along with the letter

### DIES SUDDENLY WHILE ON VACATION HERE

Lewis A. Traull, 42, of Newtonville, Mass., died suddenly in front of Campion's store on the Casino Thursday morning. The victim, who was spending a two week's vacation here, was alone at the time.

According to Chief of Police John J. Malek, Deputy Medical Examiner Dr. Robert Leonard said death was caused by heart failure.

One of the reasons for the increased efficiency of the local police department is the new two-way radio shown on the cover.

Purchased by the Town at a cost of about \$2,000, the two mobile units were in operation on May 28 and since then have proven very valuable in emergency as well as routine check-ups.

An accident that occurred once on the highway serves as a good example of the necessity of the radio. Taking place in State Police territory, the local police officer who investigated it had to race two or three miles to the call box in the center of town and call Concord who relayed the message back to the ambulance in Hampton to remove the injured persons to the hospital in Exeter. Now, with the flick of a button many lives may be saved and potential accidents averted.

Operating on 152 megacycles FM, the outfit, WPQX, one of the first to be installed by police in the state, is hooked up with New Hampshire State Police, who in turn can supply information through their nationwide teletype.

Each unit, one in the police car and one in the station has a transmitter and receiver. Information on licenses and registrations from any
