In fact, any kind of food or clothing, or rather, the quantity of it — is a never-ending source of amazement to her.

Perched on a couch, this diminutive British Miss in a starched new-look cotton, chatted a little about

the beach and the country in general.

"Americans are such easy-going, kind and generous people," she said, all in one breath, "but, of course I'd met several before coming over — during the war you know. My cousin married one. She was a G. I. bride and lives in Ohio now."

Paula remarked that Hampton Beach is "a wonderful place," and then added, "It's really quite different from anything in England. Most of our places have amusements right on the beach." Rubbing her peeling nose, which she acquired along with her first tan, she thought a moment.

"It is mostly like Blackpool," she continued, "That's near Manchester and one of our largest beaches."

She went on talking about Hampton and the surrounding resorts and finally said, hesitantly, "I was very curious about the fireworks and went to see them Wednesday night. I, ah, didn't like them. They reminded me of the guns."

Paula Rostant collected many souvenirs and happy memories to write home about, although Montreal is really "home" now, especially since her father, who "works on ships," spend a great deal of time in Canada and can once more live with his charming daughter.

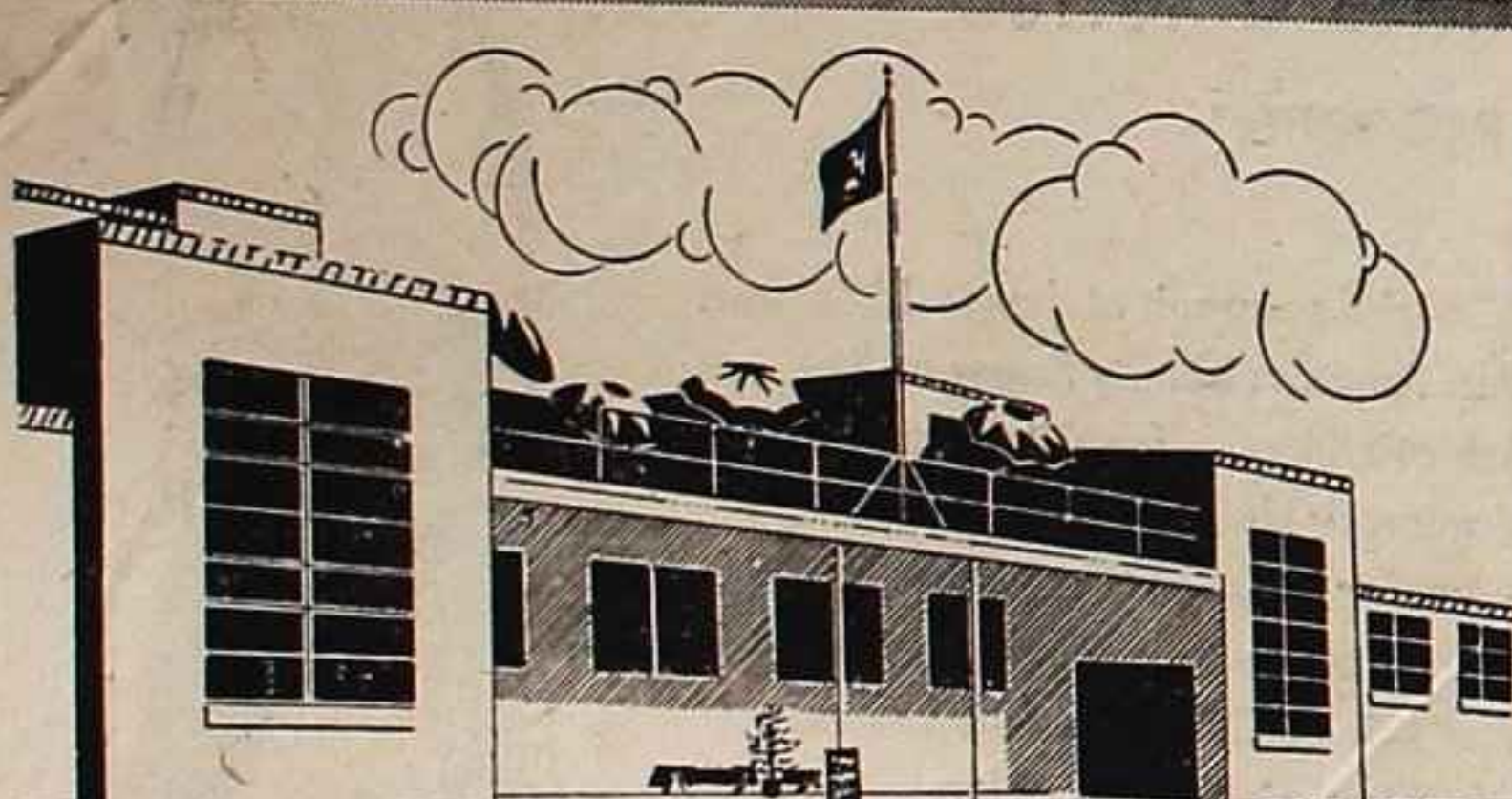

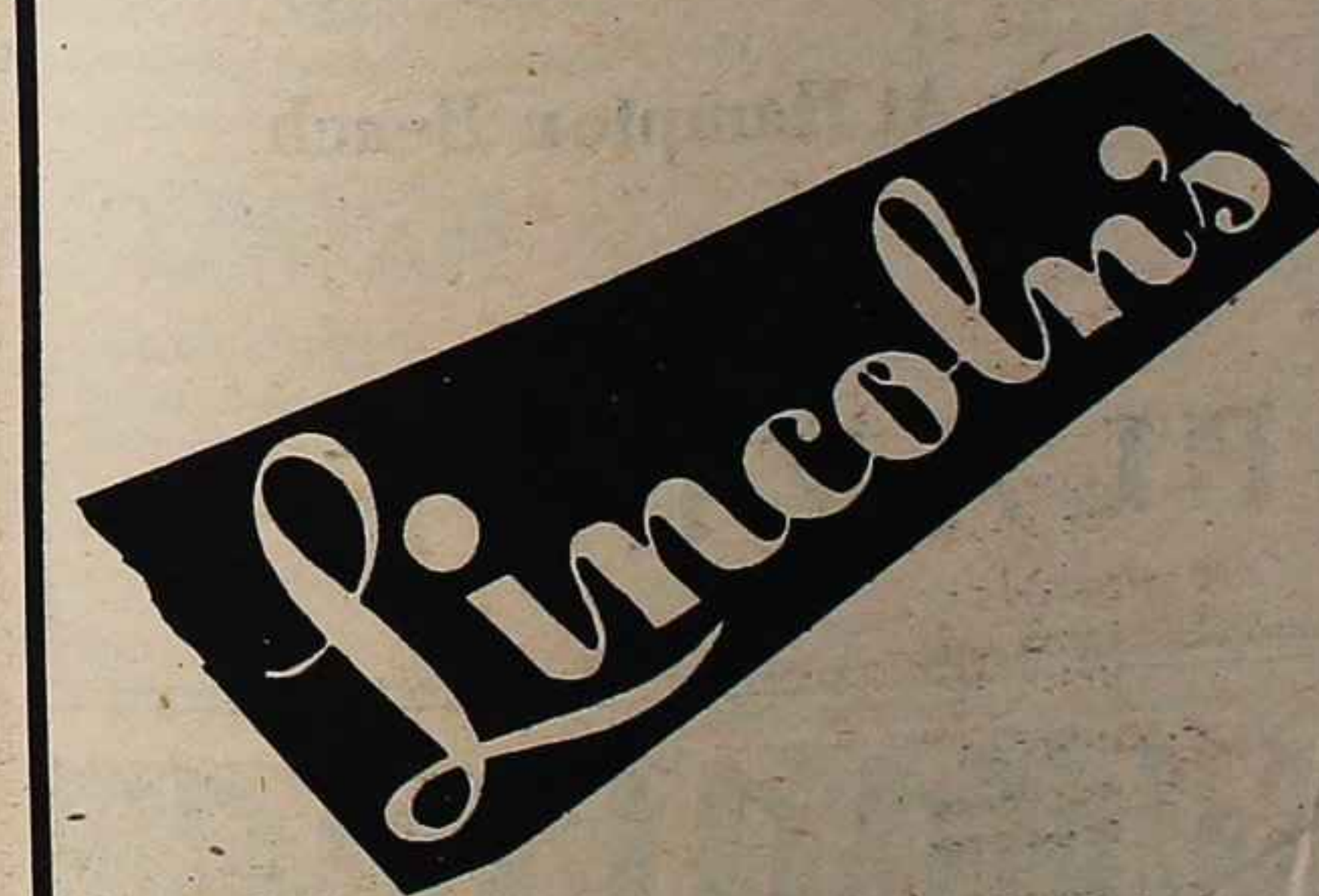

Lobster 'War' May Be Reopened Along Seacoast

A fight to the finish in the short lobster "war," which has been smouldering along the seacoast since last summer, was indicated Monday last when John O. Widen, Rye lobsterman who appealed three separate cases Saturday in Portsmouth Municipal court for alleged lobster law violations.

Widen told newspapermen that he was prepared to go to "the highest court in the land" to establish his innocence. Convicted of two violations last summer, Widen said emphatically, "they are not going to get away with it this time. This is going to be a fight to the finish."

The Rye fisherman was referring to his three convictions on charges brought against him by State Conservation Officer David E. Hammond of Exeter, formerly of Hampton. Found guilty of obstructing an officer, he was given a 60-day sentence in the house of correction at Brentwood. He also was fined \$360 plus costs for having 61 "short lobsters" in his possession and for having an improperly marked lobster bag by Judge Harry W. Peyser.

The State's case was presented by Assistant Attorney General Gordon Tefforey and the defendant's counsel was Lindsey R. Brigham of Exeter. Another angle of the case, which may reopen the lobster war, developed previous to the opening of the hearing when two spectators in the small courtroom were served warrants charging them with obstructing an officer.

The were Matthew T. Betton, Jr., of Rye and Lloyd C. Hughes of Greenland. Each informed the court that they did not have sufficient opportunity to retain counsel and asked for a continuance. Judge Peyser granted the request and each furnished \$200 for their appearance Wednesday, August 4. The original charges against Widen reportedly came from a fight occurring on Widen's boat in Rye Harbor with Conservation Officer Hammond who testified that on two occasions Widen had struck him and also attempted to upset the boat in which the three-year-old daughter of Widen was a passenger.

It was learned this week that Widen did not possess a lobster license when arrested last Wednesday. Ralph G. Carpenter, director of the state Fish and Game Department, stated that less than a month ago Widen's license had been returned to him by a clerical error and that when it was discovered that the Rye man's name was on the blacklist for two convictions against him last summer, the license was rescinded within a week.

Members of the New Hampshire Legal Lobster association at their July meeting at Hampton Beach formally protested to the state Fish and Game Department on the license being issued to Widen. Another angle to the controversy arose when Coast Guard officials over the weekend barred several boats from leaving Rye Harbor because they failed to meet the requirements of the Coast Guard. Among the boat owners to be restricted was Matthew T. Betton, Jr., of Rye.

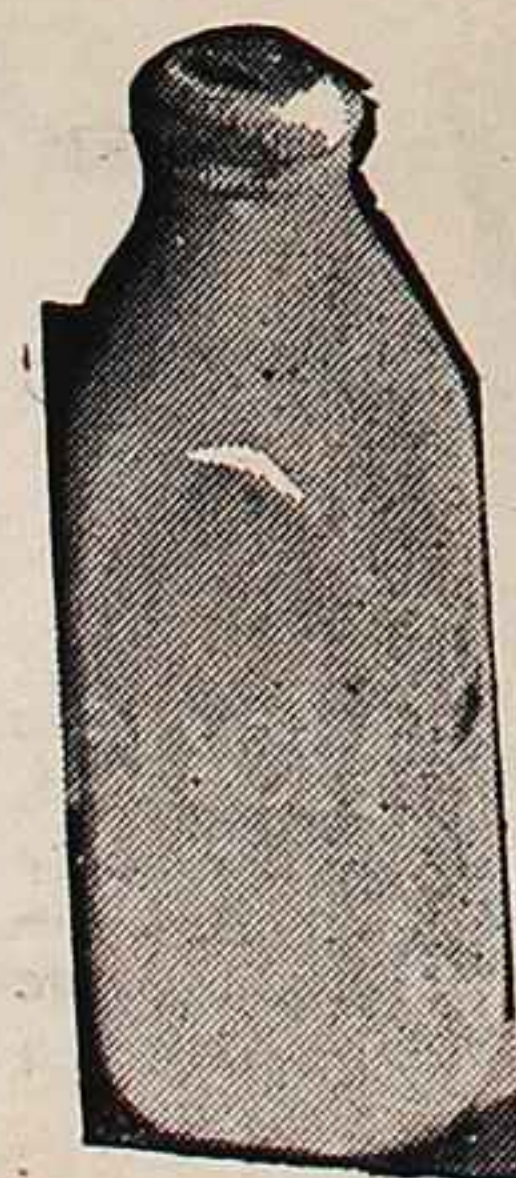

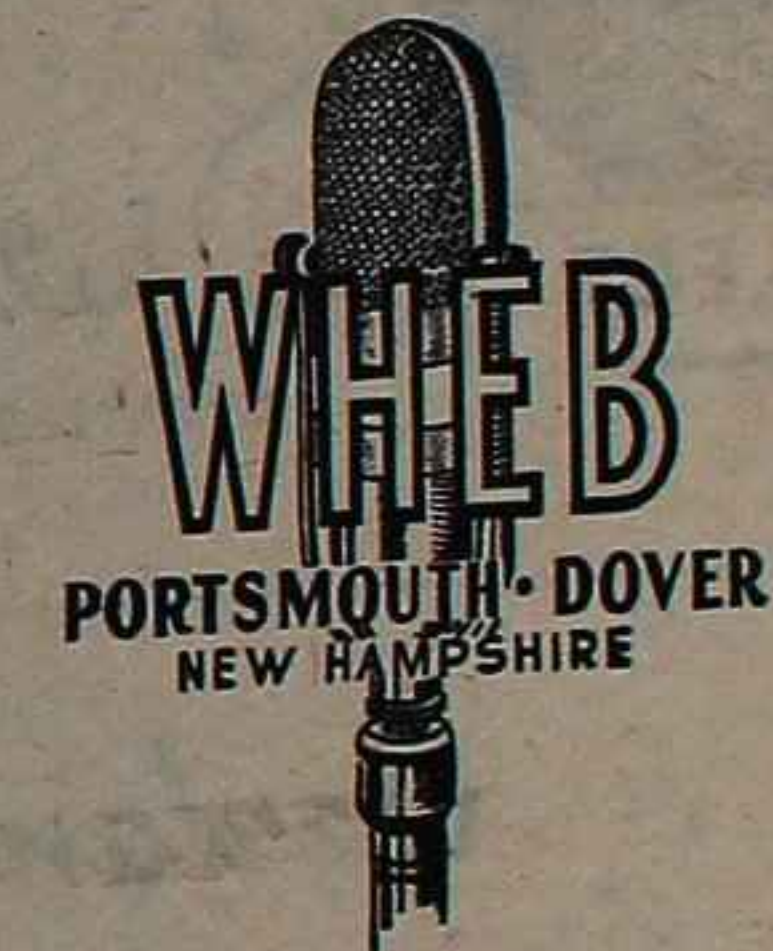

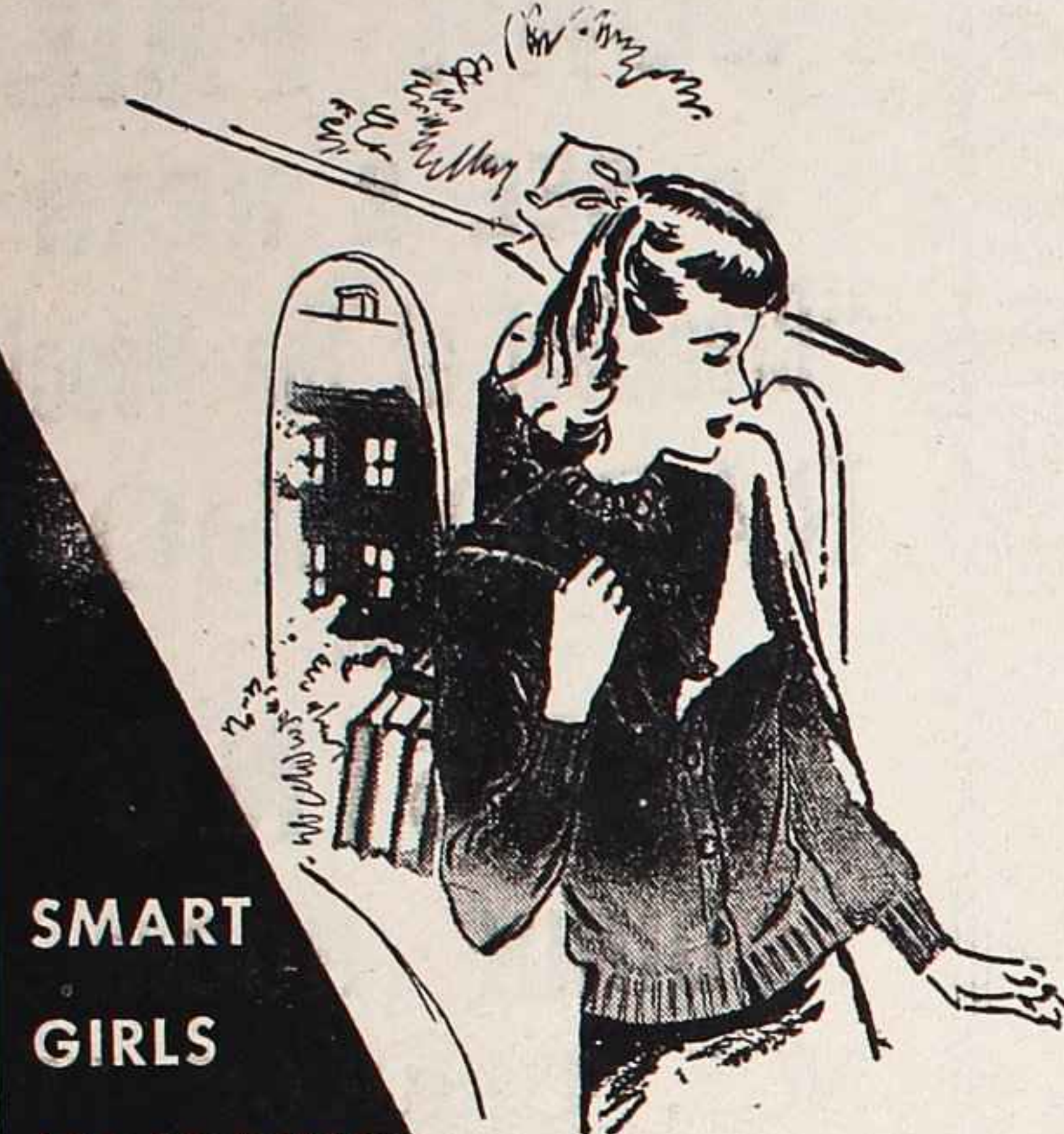
