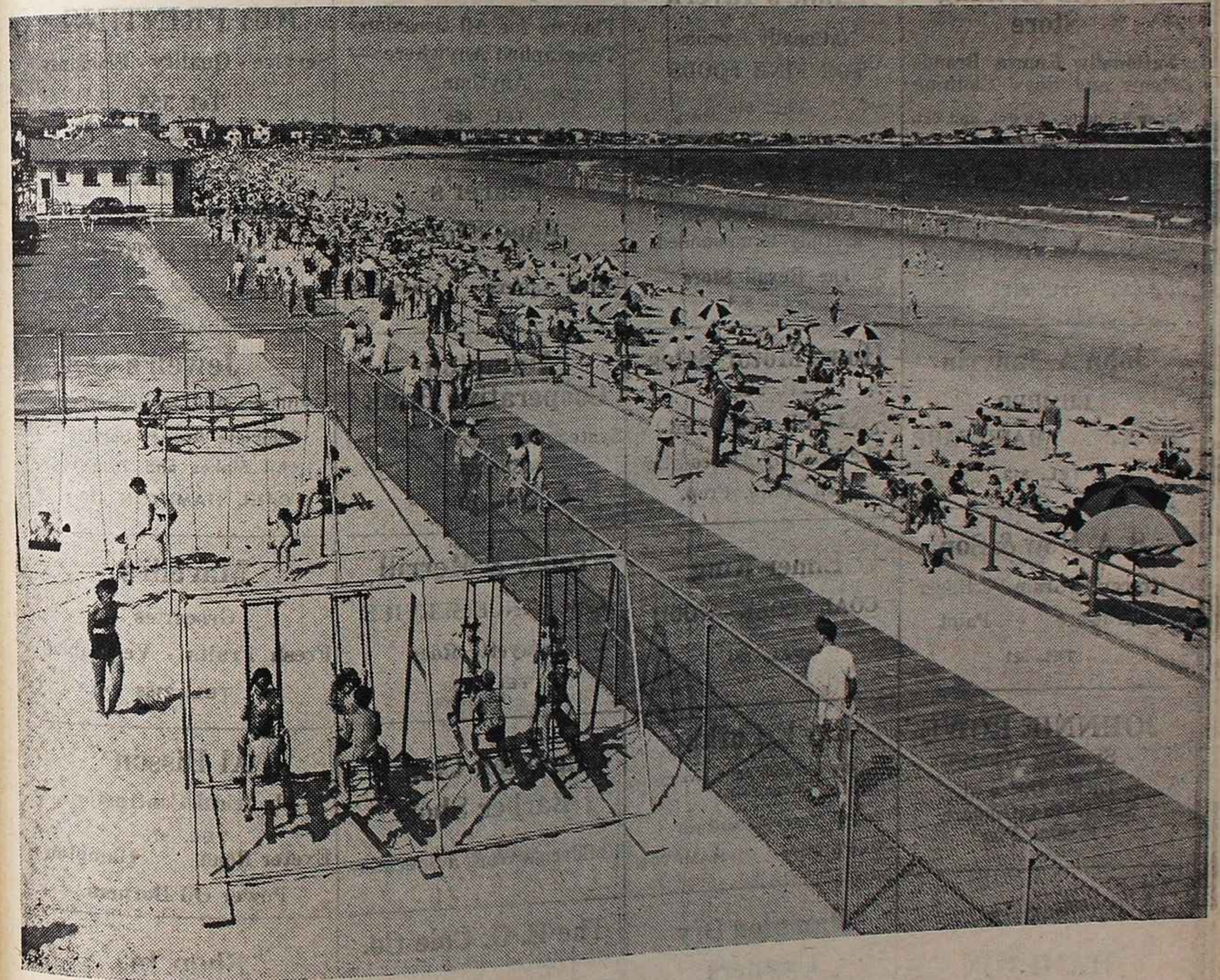

Missing Nurse Believed To Have Visited Beach

The search for 22-year-old Ruth Eisenberg, missing for three weeks on a trip from Bridgeport, Conn., to Portsmouth, shifted to Hampton Beach early this week where a girl resembling the Newark, N. J., nurse reportedly was seen.

Miss Eisenberg is believed to have been driven to Hampton Beach by a Brooklyn, N. Y., couple on July 20—the day she disappeared.

Aided with a number of photographs of the attractive girl, Police Chief John J. Malek and other Hampton policemen made an intensive search of boarding houses and hotels in the belief that the girl still may be somewhere on the beach.

Chief Malek stated, "We are almost certain we have yet to discover someone who actually saw her."

He identified the Brooklyn couple as Mr. and Mrs. A. T. Barnash and said they drove the girl believed to have been Miss Eisenberg as far as Hampton Center.

Meanwhile, a search also was in progress for a missing nurse.

Coast Guard 'Duck' Rescues Nine At Beach Sunday

High westerly winds along the seacoast Sunday made it difficult to handle small boats with the Hampton Beach Coast Guard responding twice to the Mile bridge.

Sunday morning it picked up six persons, four men and two women, when their fishing boat capsized near the bridge. The persons were able to cling to the piling of the wooden structure. At 4 o'clock in the afternoon another call was sent to the station, when a small boat containing two men and a woman from Lawrence, Mass., became caught in the tide under the bridge. The trio were identified as Arthur Demers, 26, Rene Demers, 14, and Lorraine Nolet 19. When the Coast Guard amphibious duck arrived in charge of enginman 1/c Real St. Marie the three were clinging to the bridge piling. None could swim, according to the Coast Guard.

At Rye Beach a boat owned by Lighton Remick went out after reports had come into the police station of a boat being seen with a person waving a distress signal.

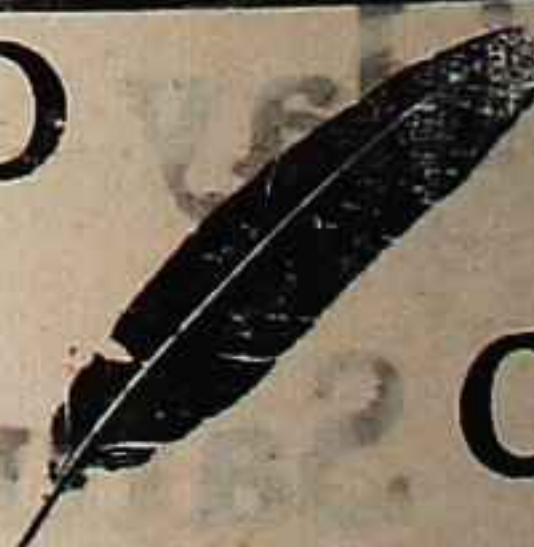

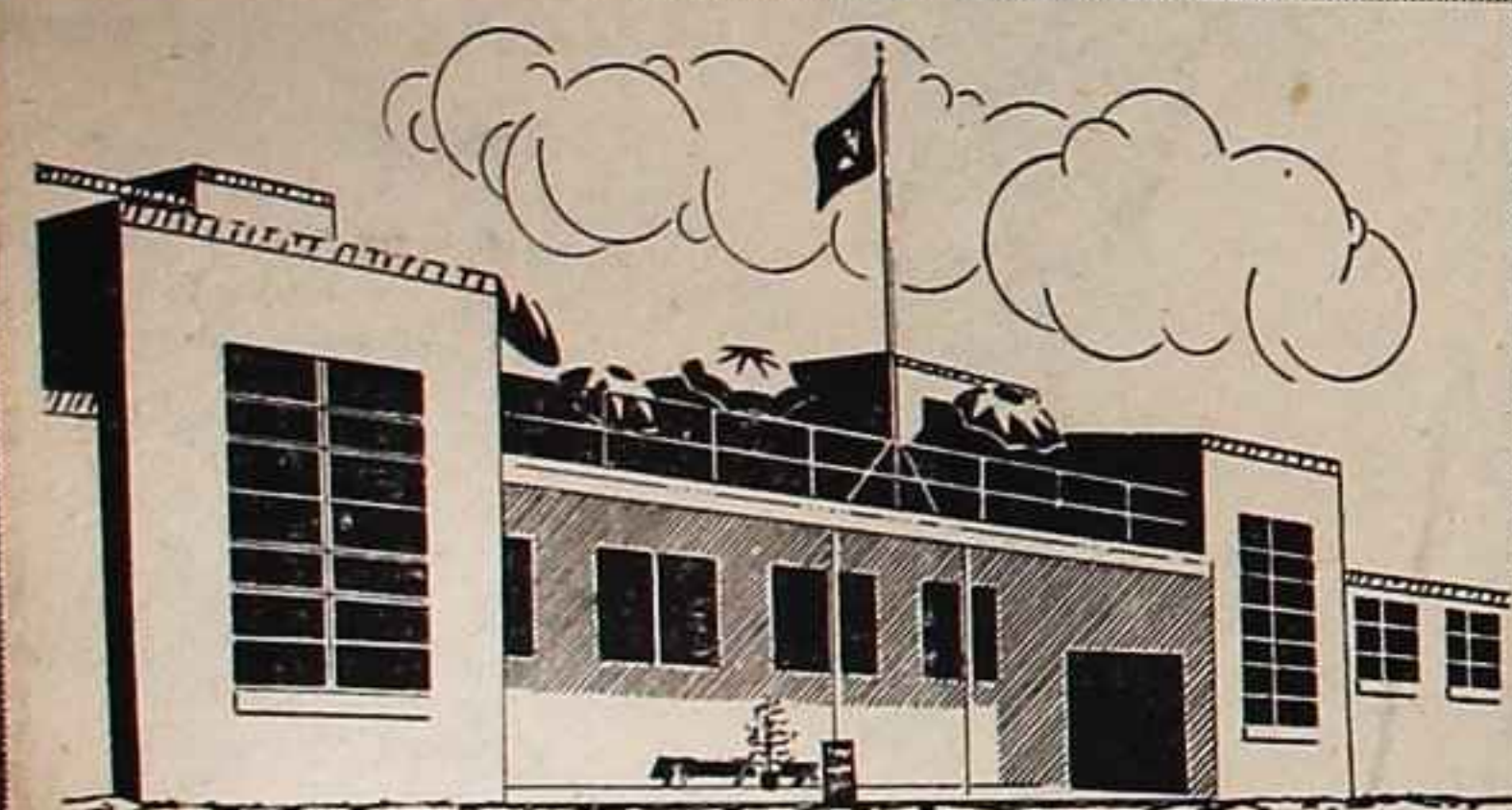

**Bowling Record

Besides being a veteran proof reader, Mr. Parker is a veteran bowler with a record of 162 single string and 375 three strings. He has bowled in the church and Wonalucet leagues of Concord and a great deal more time and money than anyone his years in bowling. His favorite opponent in non-league competition is Ernest Boutwell, manager of the Warren Street alleys. As captain of a Wonalucet team his average is 95.

Mr. Parker is 73 years 4 months old but, having been a long distance runner on the Brown University

team in his college days, is agile for one of his years.

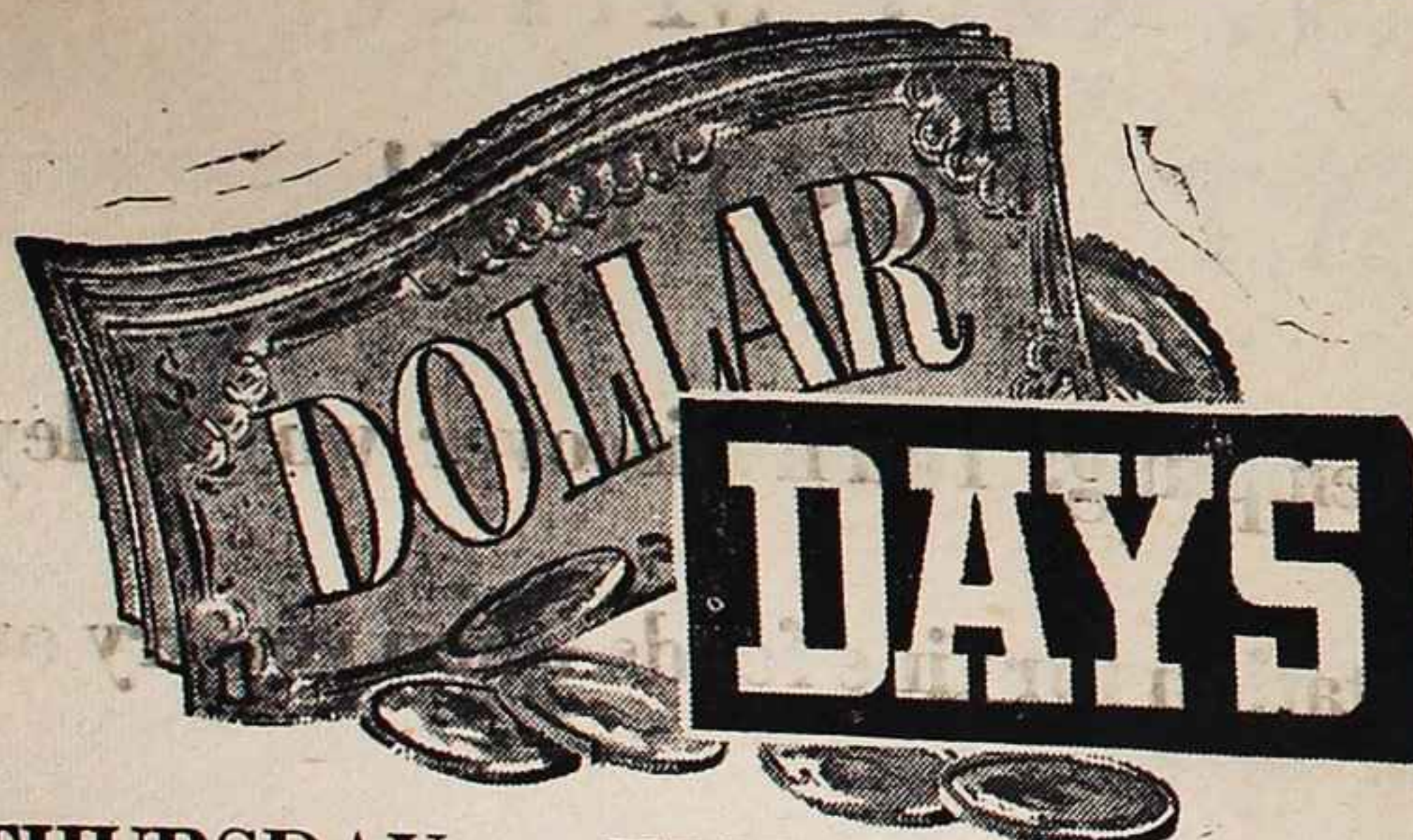
To fitly celebrate a vacation at the beach, Mr. Parker asked manager James P. Liston of the Casino alleys for competition in a bowling match. Mr. Liston selected one of his star pin-toppers, Paul Pearson to start and James Sabatis, the strike and spare expert, was substituted for the rest of the gruelling contest.

A considerable gallery watched the marathon contest and admired the oldsters' stamina. Sabatis had the better of the argument on account of his ability to get spares when needed. In this his familiarity with the alleys was a help, as the lack of it handicapped Parker. Throughout the last eight or ten strings the veteran was too tired to do himself justice and his pinfall of 5016 for the 54 strings, or an average of 93 was a disappointment.

Mr. Parker is no novice at marathon bowling. On his 55th birthday April 13, 1940 he bowled 65 strings in 3 and one quarter hours, or a string every three minutes for an average of 101.9.

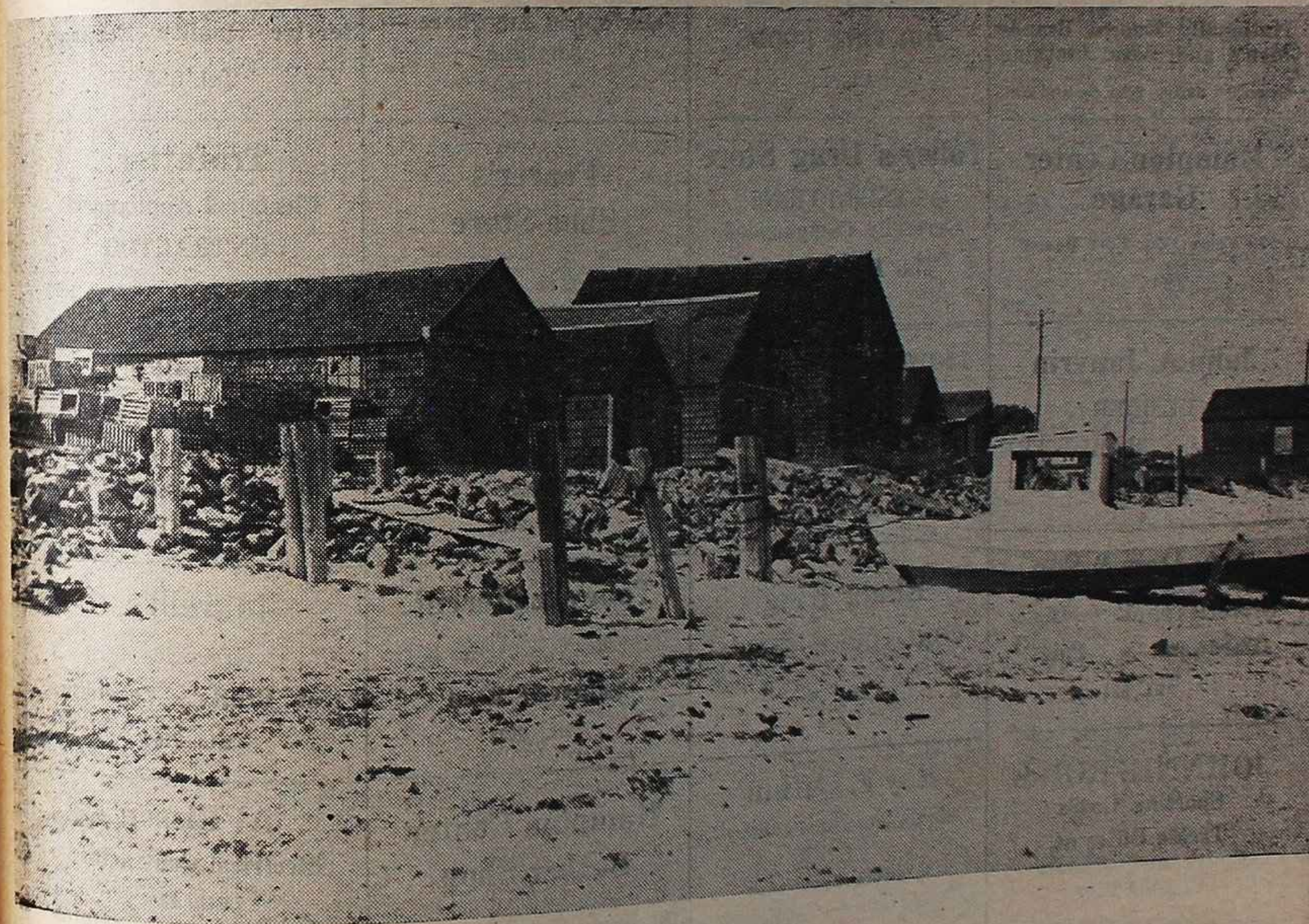
