### Blind Youth Is Given Purse By Beach Audience

Morris Paradise an 8-year-old blind boy who came from Nashua on Monday evening with his uncle, Ulysses Gear, to compete in the Talent Parade was found to be ineligible to compete for prizes due to the child labor laws of this state. He had already sung two songs, "Now Is The Hour," and "You Can't Be True Dear," when it was learned that he would be unable to receive an award.

A listener in the audience, Lieut. Fred Link of Troy, N. Y., came up to the bandstand and made an announcement to the effect that he would like to make an offering for the boy. While this announcement was being made over the public address system someone in the audience asked "why not let us all in on it?" In a few hours a total amount of \$400. had been collected from the crowd.

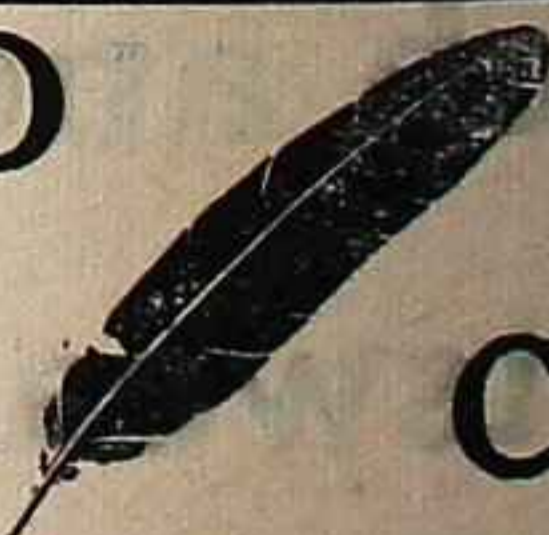

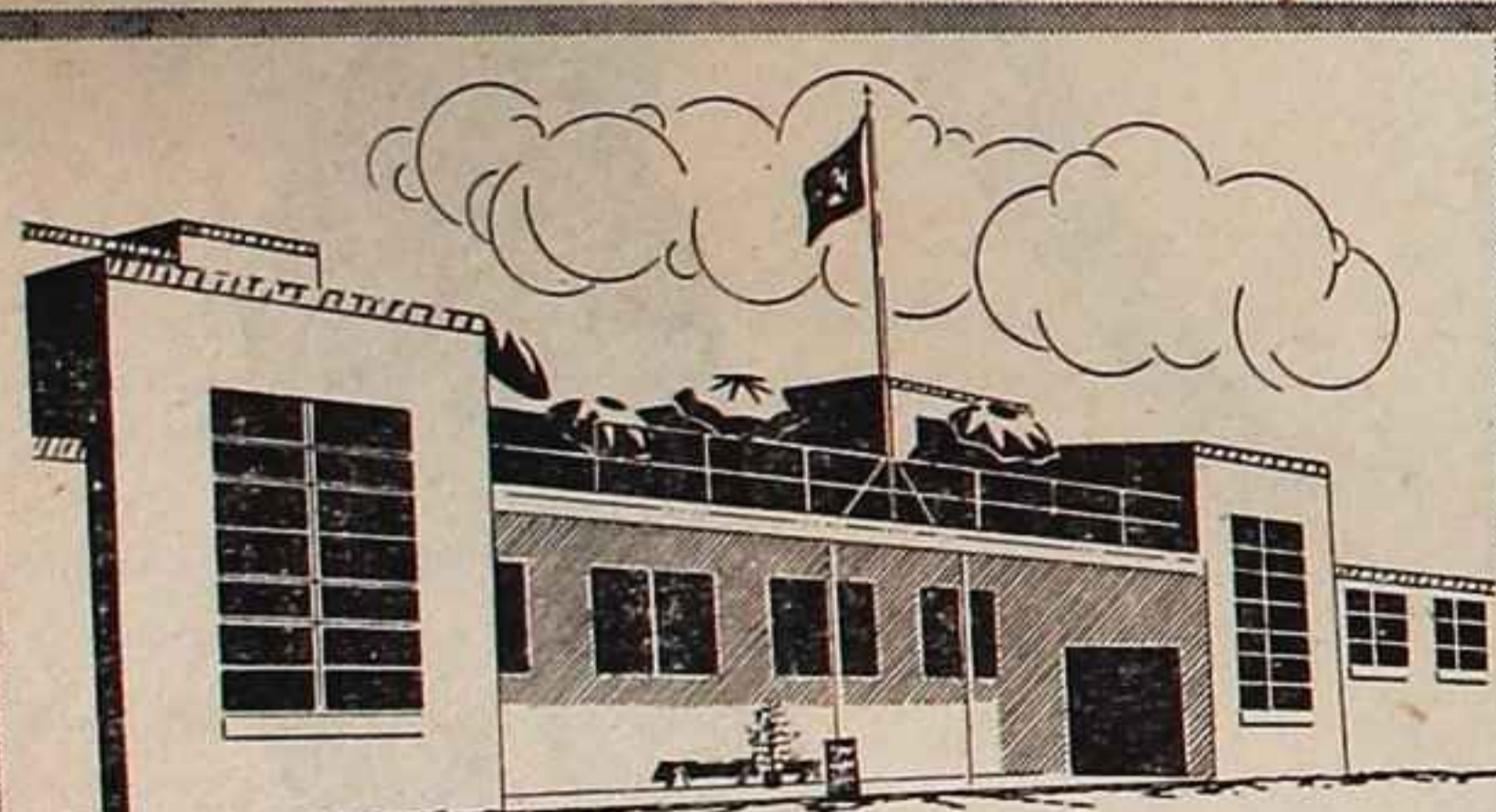

Opening Monday evening, August 23, "Deep Are the Roots" follows the current production of "Joy to the World" on the Town Hall stage. It is being produced here in accordance with the same policy of the West Newbury Summer Theatre to bring the people of the Merrimac Valley timely and vital Broadway plays they might otherwise be barred from seeing.

West Newbury is the first summer theatre in the country to play "Joy to the World," comedy-satire of the recent Hollywood investigations which created a sensation of Broadway this spring. And West Newbury is one of the few summer theatres to dare to produce "Deep Are the Roots."

For although it played on Broadway for three years, winning thunderous praises from almost every critic, the story of "Deep Are the Roots" is so powerful and its theme is so shocking that Hollywood did not dare make it into a movie. It is about a young Negro war veteran and the daughter of a white Senator whose love transcends the lynch spirit of their Southern town—but is doomed by the deep-rooted barrier between them.

Henry Scott, who starred in the original Broadway, Chicago, and Boston companies of "Deep Are the Roots," has been brought to

West Newbury to play the handsome and dynamic young Negro lieutenant who returns from fighting for democracy abroad to find the war still to be fought in his Southern home.

He will be supported on the Town Hall stage by Helen Martin, also an original member of the Broadway cast, and Hilda Haynes, who played the mother in the New York production.

Making her West Newbury debut in the role that shot Barbara Bel Geddes to fame, Joan Stanley will play the Senator's daughter whose love for the young Negro war veteran ends in tragedy. Miss Stanley was in the Broadway play, "Heart of the City," toured in "The Male Animal," and has been doing the feminine leads in NBC's Kraft Television Theatre.

"Deep Are the Roots" will run from Monday, August 23, through

Saturday, August 28, at the West Newbury Summer Theatre, with the usual matinee on Wednesday. Tickets may be reserved by calling the box office—West Newbury 160.

EVENING'S AERIAL CIRCUS

When day is done and dusk begins to pull its puckering strings over a hot August countryside, when families sit on farm porches and thin brittle night sounds begin to scratch against the thickening silence, the chimney swifts pull on their evening performance. *Chaetura pelagica* is one of the best aerial acrobats of the bird family. He isn't much to look at; four to six inches long, a sooty, drab cloak, chunky head, short bill and wide spreading mouth so he can scoop in insects efficiently. His tail is spiked with sharp spines which help anchor him against the wall of the chimney.

In flight the swifts are as graceful as ballet dancers. Their wings have a foot spread; they ascent and drop downward with remarkable rapidity. When an August day's heat is sullenly subsiding and Dog Day stickiness is heavy in the air, the swifts put on their act. They flutter up from the chimneys and in a moment are in full action. They climb in steep spirals, dip and swirl unpredictably. They sidle and go into tailspins and suddenly reverse their downward action with a burst of rapid wing action.

Occasionally a vagrant breeze comes out of the west and for a few moments the swifts ride the air currents with outstretched wings, turning, twisting, gliding as if enjoying the free ride. There are those who do not like the swifts in their chimneys but the countryman rather enjoys the twittering, chirruping and occasional whirring of wings as he drops to sleep. Swifts nest in trees, caves and occasionally in old barns and corn cribs, but they prefer the sooty interiors of house chimneys for their twig nests glued on with their special saliva. It is just one of the

common birds of the countryside but their interesting evening performance is part of the appeal of a summer's night. When first frosts begin to paint autumn colors the swifts migrate to South America. *Chaetura* has a folklore name of Chimney Sweep but it would be more accurate to say he sweeps the skies on these summer evenings.

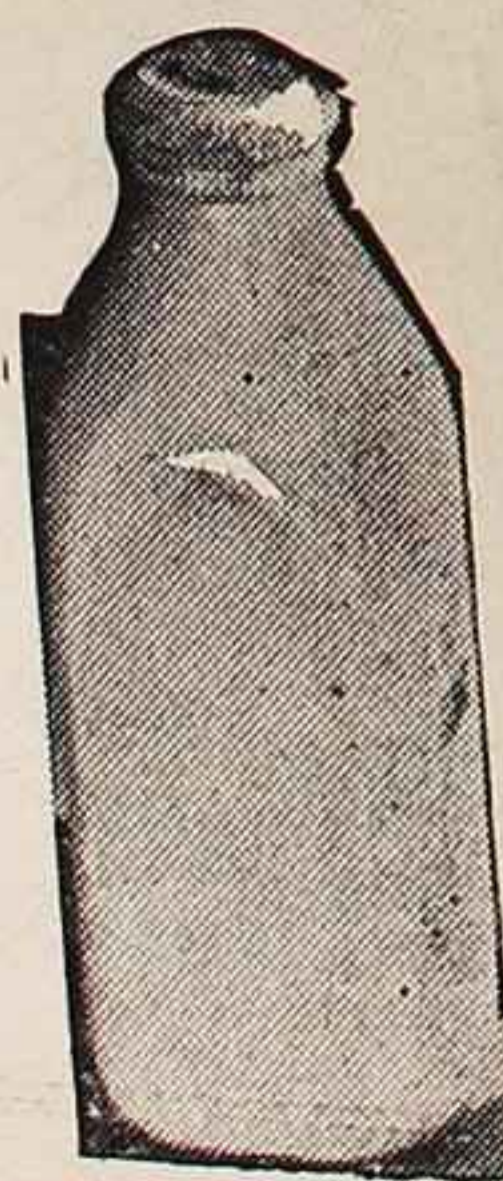

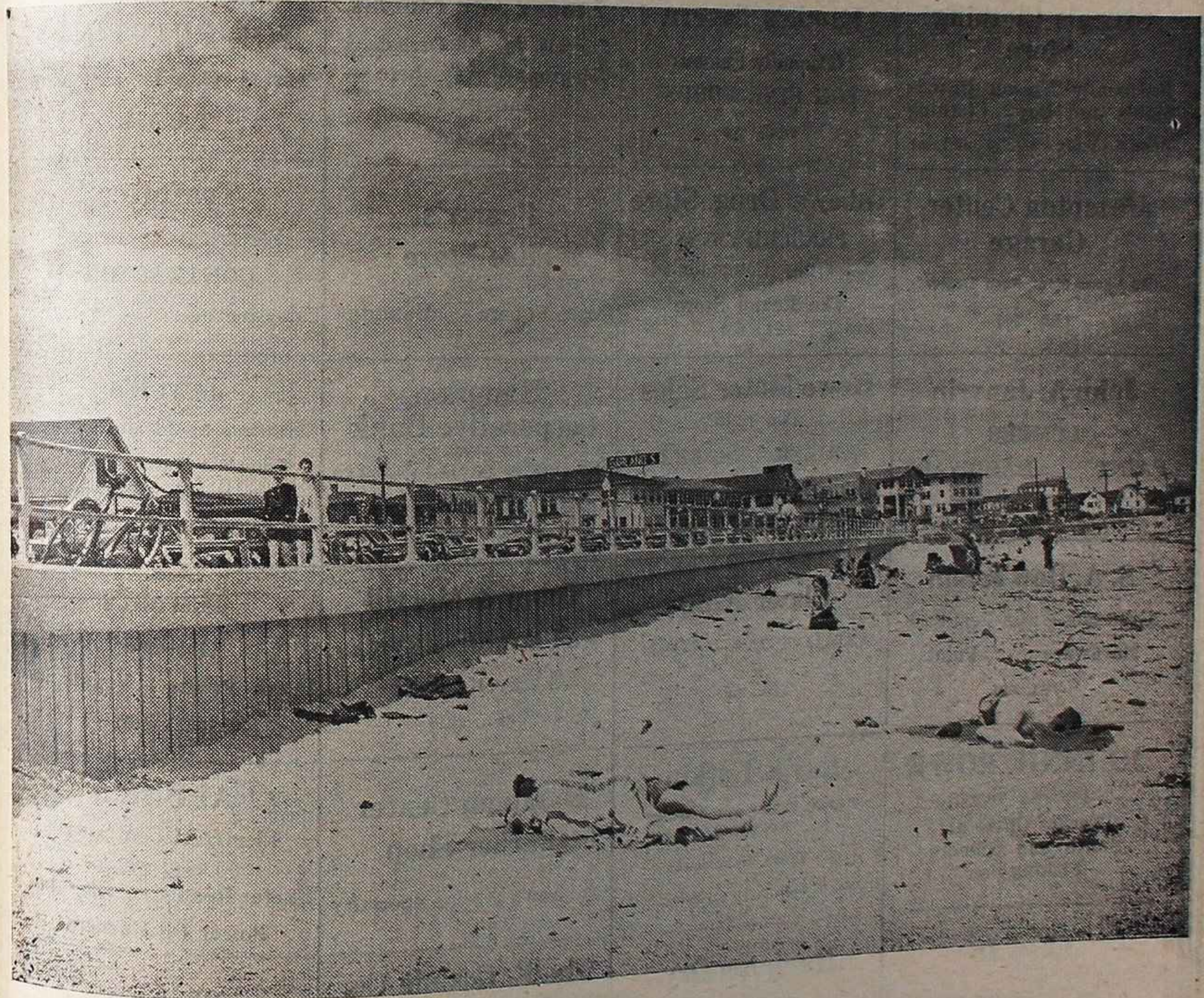
