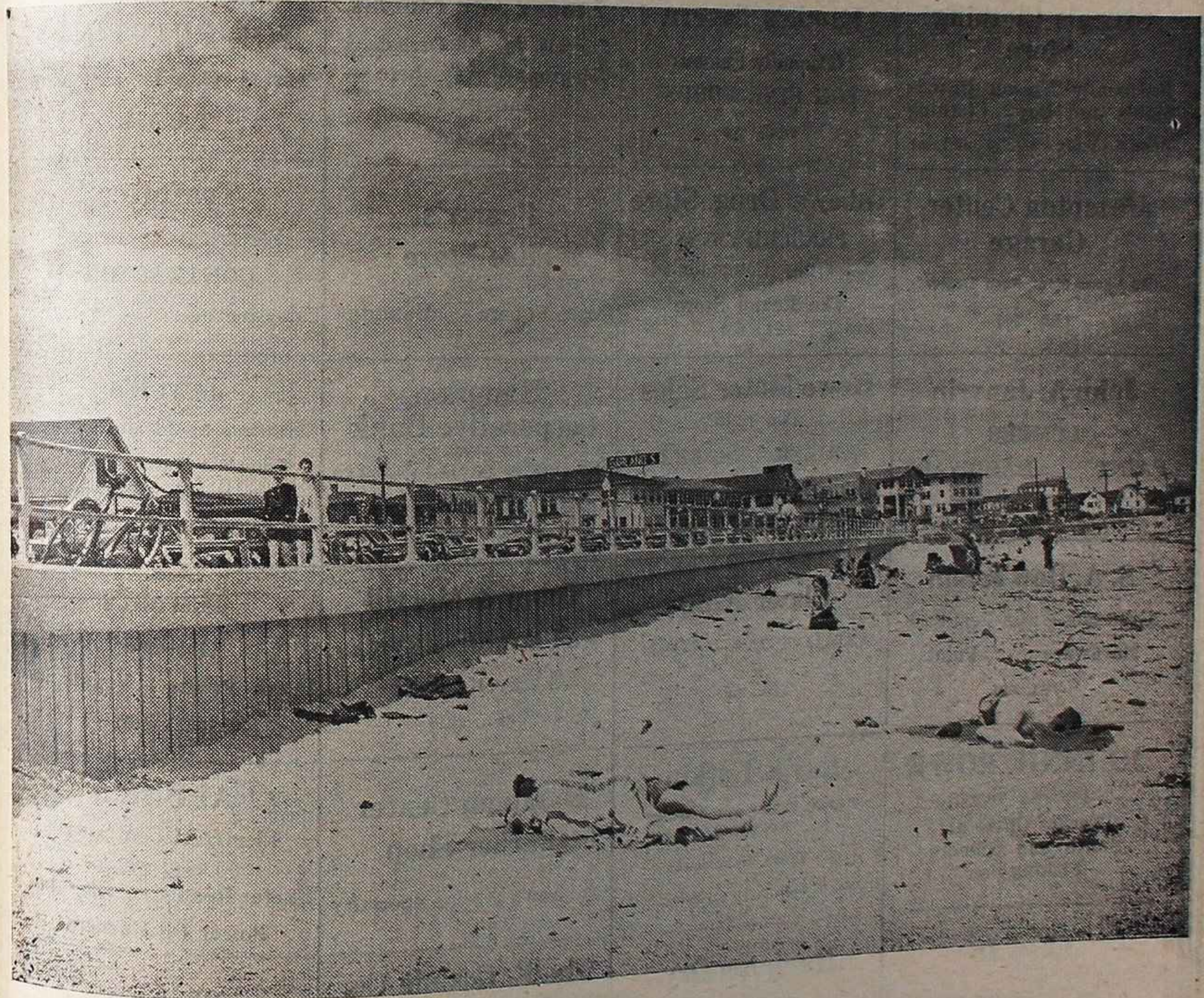

Bay State Men Dominate Field In Three-Mile Swim

A 67-year-old retired policeman, Michael F. Rynne of Lowell, Mass., stole the show last Thursday in the annual three-mile swim to Boar's Head and return.

Russell Doucette, 33, of 50 Standish road (Squantum) Quincy, Mass., won the event in 2 hours, 10 minutes, but a larger share of the cheers went to Rynne as he finished in 3 hours, 45 minutes, despite the handicap of an ailing leg.

"They said I was too old to pound a beat," said the grey-haired Rynne, veteran of many a long distance swim in Boston harbor and his home city's Merrimack river, "so I enter these swim meets to show I'm as good as ever."

Second among the 15 starters was Stephen Gobush of 3 Summer street, Lawrence, Gobush finished in 2 hours, 19 minutes. Sixteen-year-old Charles H. Erwin of 83 Queen street, Lowell, was third in 2 hours, 25 minutes.

An accompanying rowboat capsized in the surf as the swimmers returned, but no one was injured.

FRIED CHICKEN

If more people could have fried
chicken more often a major share
of civilization's contemporary frus-
trations would evaporate and a
man would not mind so much when
his better half made pointed allu-
sions to the housekeeping condi-
tion of the farm shop. Things be-
gan to go downhill in this nation
when suburbanites, townfolk and
villagers gave up their family flocks
of hens. From about the first of
July until September the country-
man wants his fried chicken regu-
larly once a week. After that he
wants a roaster once a week with
mashed potato stuffing generously
flavored with herbs and onions.

The crime bill in this nation is a
staggering figure and some of the
most heinous offenses are com-
mitted against fried chicken.
Cooks fry it too much and the un-
happy result is dry, leathery and un-
appetizing; some have new-fangled
ideas and concoct blatant sauces
to mess it up and a man has to pur-
sue a slithery chunk of meat
through a slough of barbecued
gravy. Some foods are meant to be
eaten without all the fol-de-ral
concomitants that seem to be the
fad of the moment. Gliding the lily
is a peculiar attribute of 20th cen-
tury living.

For superb fried chicken choose
a plump three or four pounder. It is
a mistake to use a smaller bird;
one has to eat too long to acquire

a sufficiency. Let it ripen in the
refrigerator for about 48 hours to
engender the full flavor. The actual
cooking is a comparatively simple
process but one must faithfully fol-
low the rules. Cover the pieces
generously with butter or margar-
ine; sprinkle with salt and a smid-
gen of pepper; then dust with
flour. Get an old-fashioned iron
spider moderately hot; use bacon
fat for grease and place the cut

sides down. Now here is the place
where most cooks make the big
mistake. Don't fry the chicken on
top of the stove. Put the frying pan
into a 350 degree oven and bake
for just about one hour. That is the
way the countryman likes his fried
chicken. He is objective; he has
tried many methods. If he can have
approximately two thirds of a four
pound chicken for his share, ne
makes a very satisfying meal.
