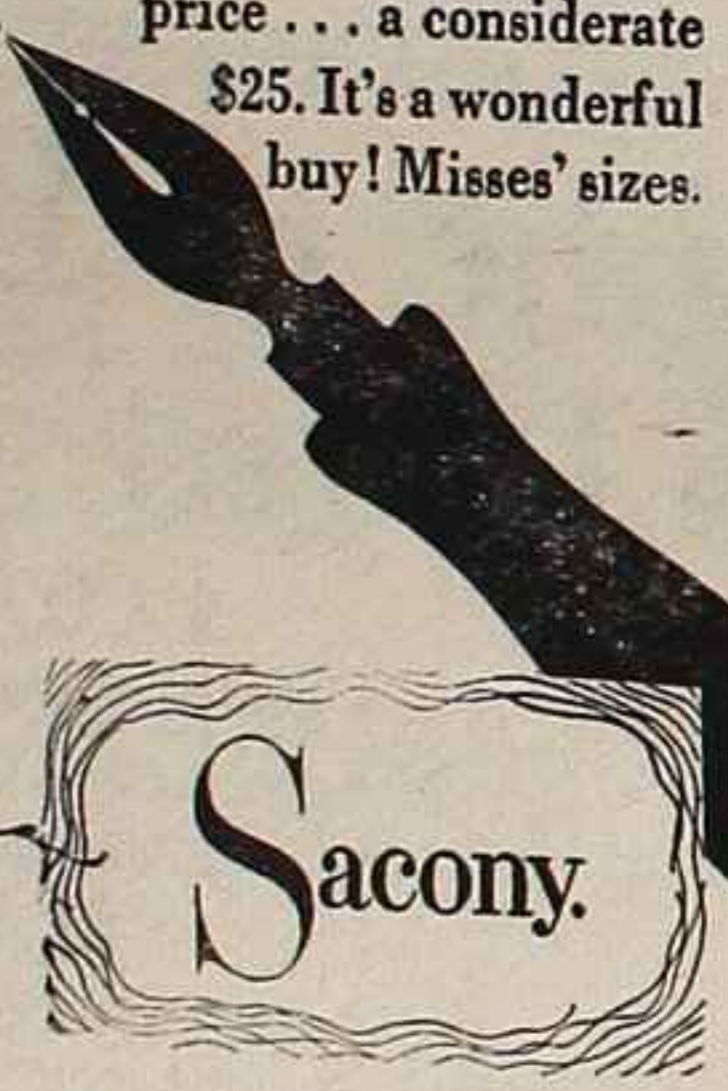

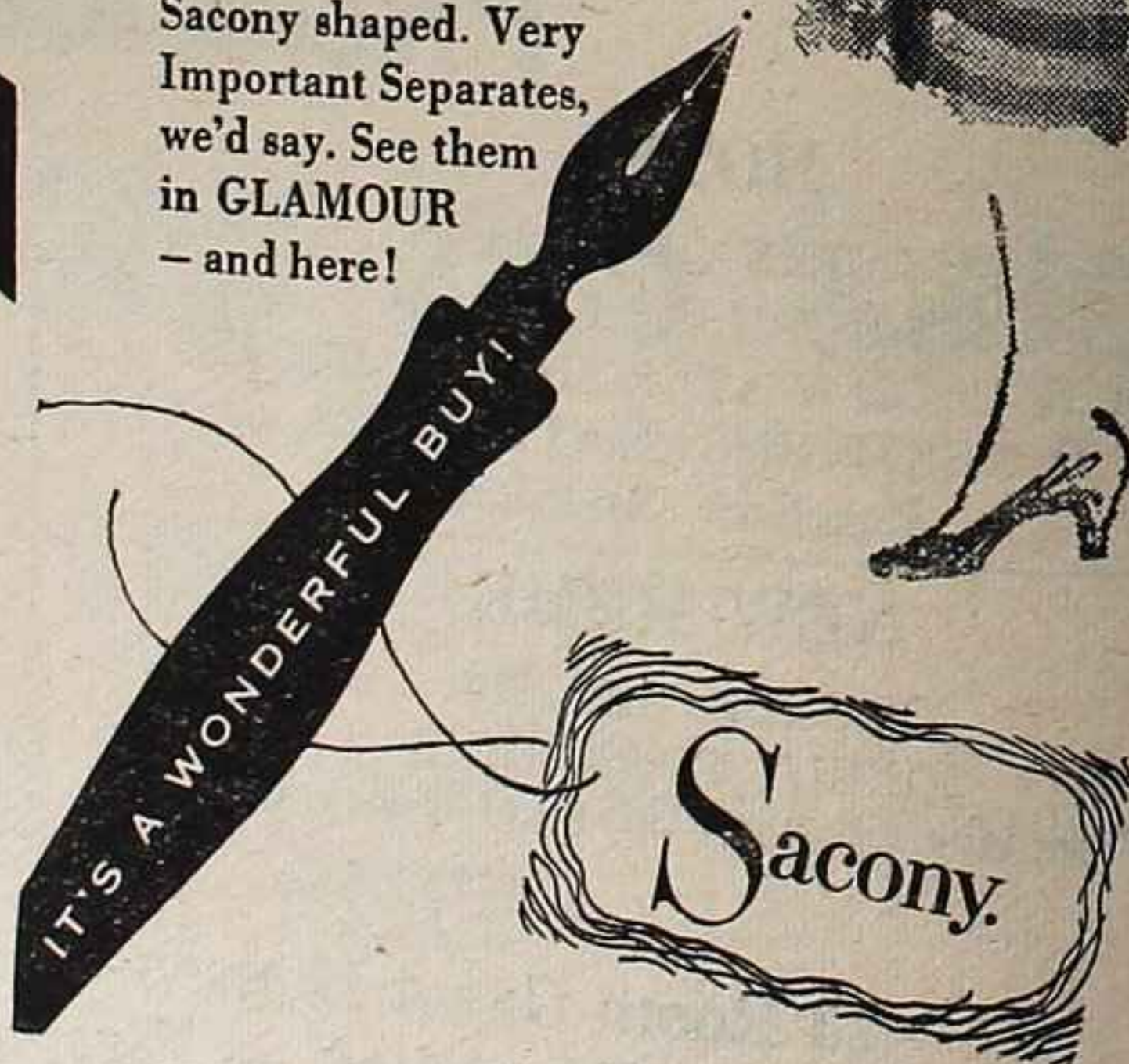

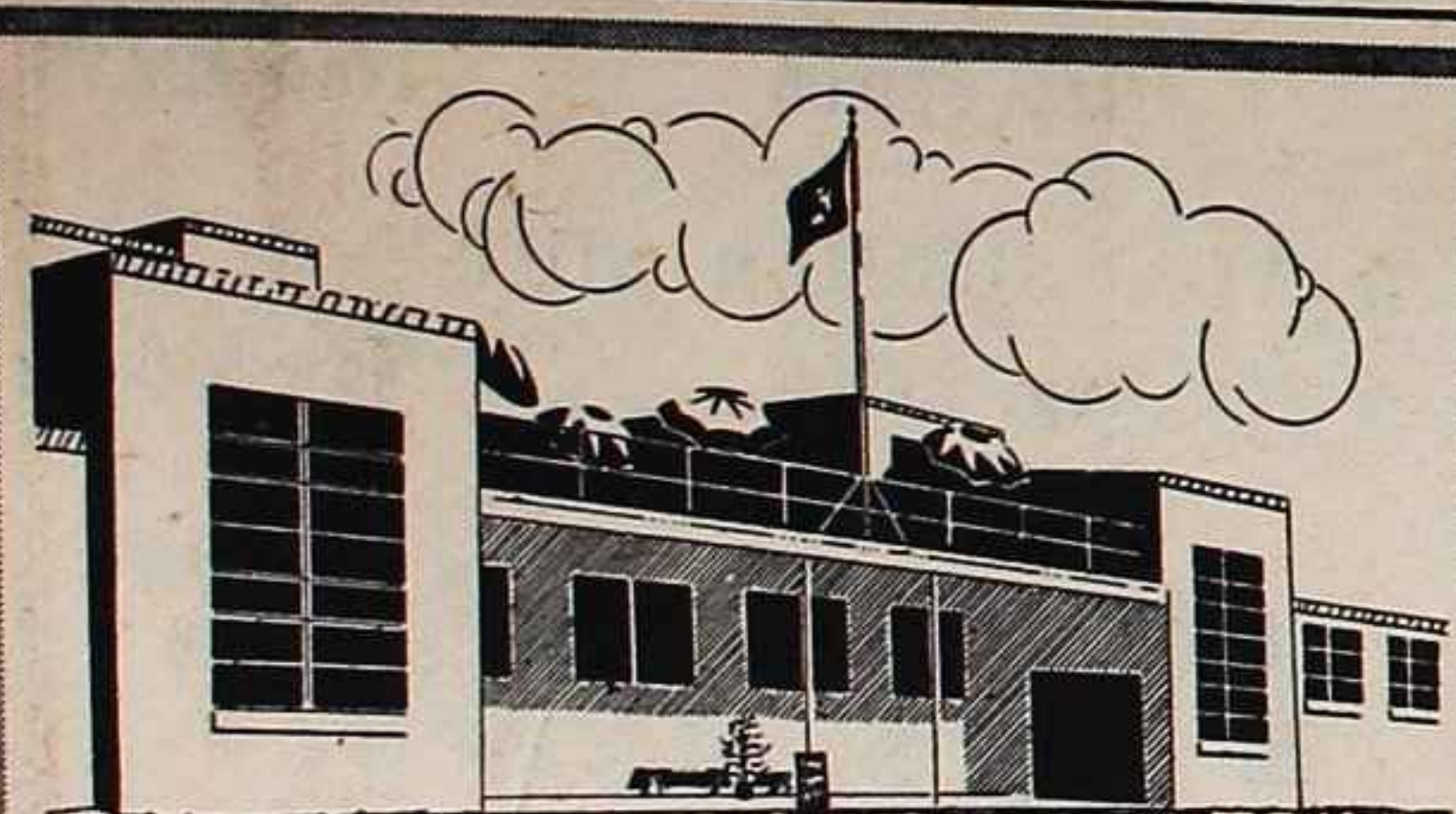

Westerly Breeze Causes Two Near Beach Drownings

Strong westerly winds were the cause of two near drowning accidents at Hampton Beach this week as inflated rafts and inner tubes proved a hazardous sport.

A Hampton youth, James J. O'Shea, 12, of Winnacunnet road, was rescued Wednesday morning about 11:30 when he slipped off an inner tube which was rapidly being blown out to sea by the strong land breeze.

The youngster was drifting off shore in the vicinity of 10th street, North Shore when he evidently got panicky and slipped off his inner tube into water over his head. As he went down he was seen by two North Beach residents, Elwood Thalkeimer of North Arlington, N. J., and Burton Langman of Philadelphia, Pa., who went to his aid.

The two men had just pulled the local youngster out of the water when the Coast Guard amphibious "duck" which had been summoned by residents of the area, arrived on the scene. Artificial respiration was started on young O'Shea, but when it was found that he was still conscious he was taken to the Coast Guard Station, where he was treated for immersion.

Another victim of the strong westerly breeze, Lorne R. Ingham 20, of Northbridge, Mass., was rescued Tuesday afternoon two miles off shore by the Coast Guard "duck."

The Bay State youth was spotted by Seaman Faagugu Saloi from the lookout tower of the North Beach Lifeboat station after he had cleared Great Boar's Head and was rapidly drifting out to sea on his inflated raft.

Before the "duck" could reach the youthful mariner, he was nearly two miles out to sea and was clinging to a lobster buoy to prevent being blown out to sea further.

Young Ingham was brought into shore by the "duck" none the worse for his experience. The Coast Guard "duck" effected another rescue as darkness was falling Tuesday evening when an "unidentified" life guard enjoying a busman's holiday went for a sail and was becalmed just off shore. Strong searchlights on the amphibious craft added color to the dramatic rescue.

Construction Crew Plunges 50 Feet Into River Wednesday

Five workmen were plunged into Hampton river Wednesday afternoon when a staging on which they were working on the new toll bridge collapsed, hurling them into the water 50 feet below.

Although it was a fine day for a swim, being one of the hottest of the summer season, the workmen did not appreciate the accidental swim. Three of the five men received injuries while two others escaped with only a ducking.

The three most seriously injured were William Guy and Frank Guy, brothers, 2 Bromfield street, Newburyport, and Furner Eaton of Seabrook Beach. Uninjured were Louis P. DeBeaulu, 226 Valley street, Portland, and Richard Noel, 9 High street, South Portland, Maine.

The five men were part of a crew of eight working on the draw mechanism near the center of the new bridge when the accident happened.

Fortunately Clarence Perkins, a lobster fisherman from Seabrook, was passing under the bridge at the time and managed to pull the Guy brothers and Eaton into his boat. The other two men were able to swim ashore.

All five were taken by the Hampton Police department to Dr. Roger N. Blake's office in Hamp-

ton center for treatment. The Guy brothers and Eaton were later taken to the Exeter hospital.

The five men were employed by the Berke, Moore Construction company, which is installing the draw mechanism on the new toll bridge.

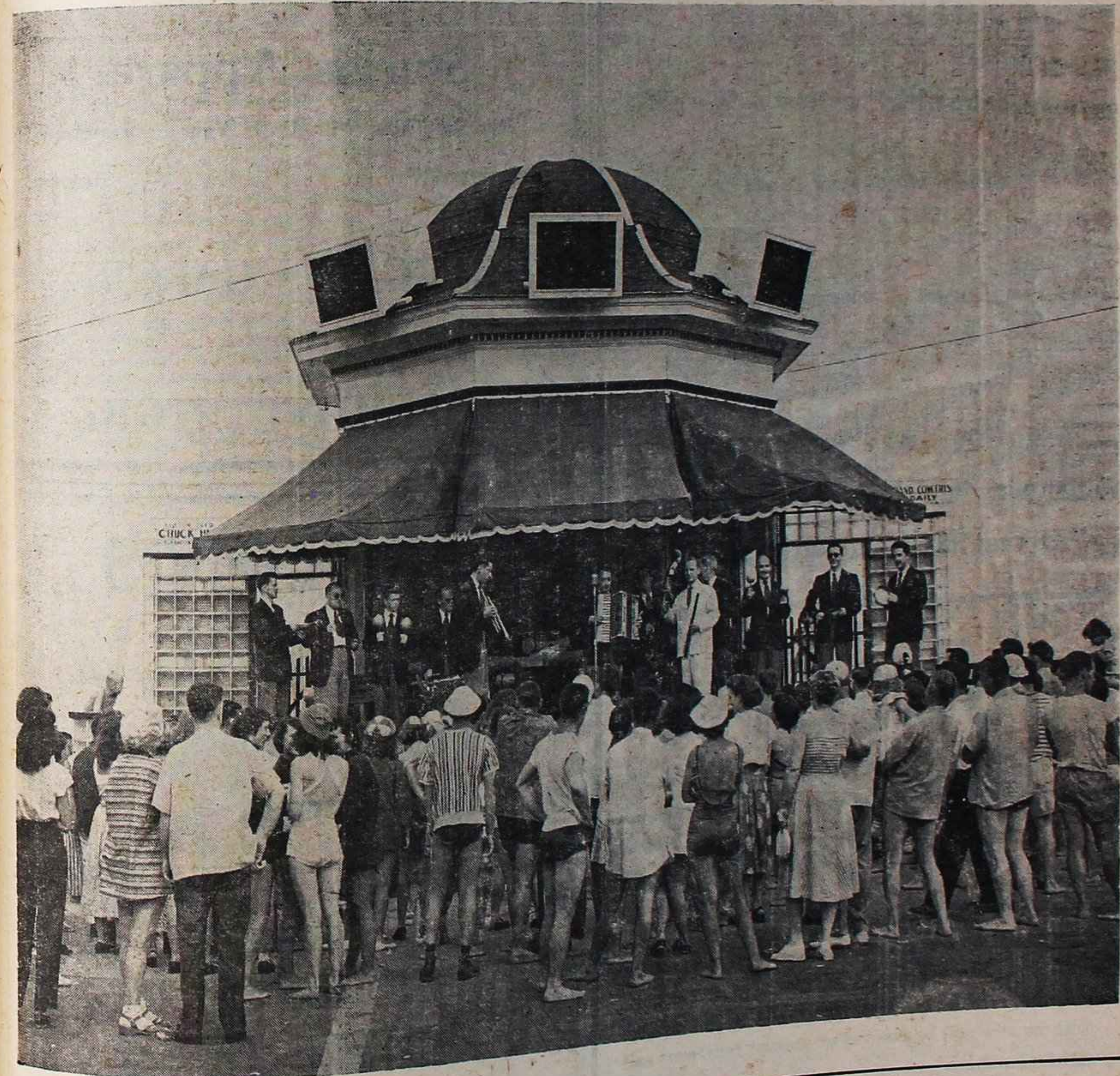
