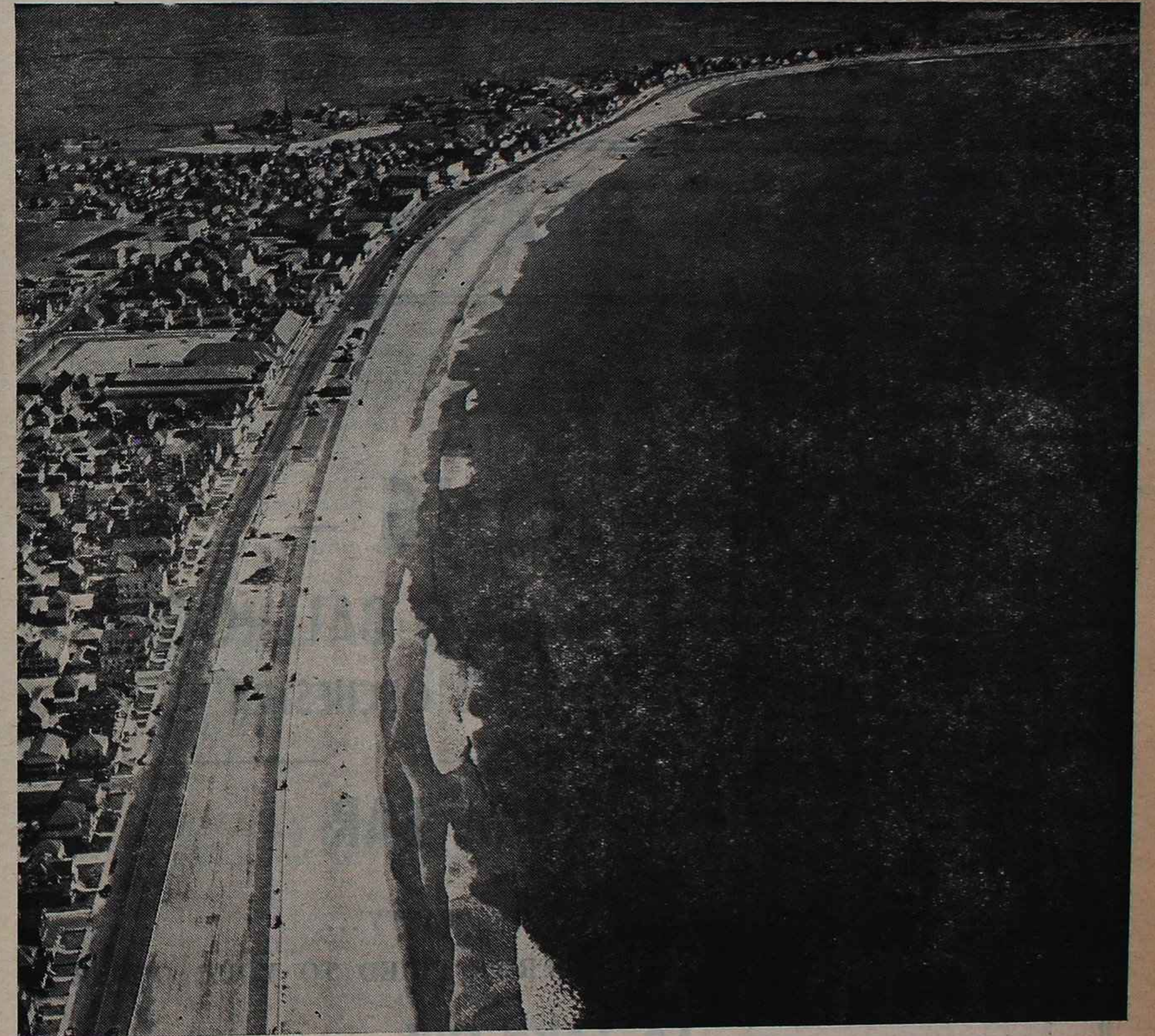

**Beach Visitor
Succumbs From
Long Exposure**

Patrick Killoran, 63, of 42 Vernon street, Worcester, Mass., died Sunday afternoon at the Exeter hospital where he had been taken Saturday, after being missing from his cottage at Hampton Beach for five days.

Killoran was discovered in a nude condition in a thickly-wooded section located off the Seabrook marshes. He had come here on July 2 with his wife and children for a week's vacation, and disappeared early last Monday morning from his cottage on River avenue in the southern end of the beach.

A search which began after his family reported Killoran's disappearance was abandoned in the middle of the week after a Coast Guard helicopter failed to find any trace of the man.

Late Friday night, Police Chief John J. Malek received a tip that some Seabrook boys, who were swimming that afternoon in the vicinity of South Main street in Seabrook, had talked with a man answering Killoran's description. The Worcester man was found about a mile from where the boys saw him Friday.

Chief Malek, with the cooperation of Police Chief Abner J. Eaton and Fire Chief Henry Kendrick, both of Seabrook and Coast Guardsmen from Hampton Beach, organized a posse of 30 persons Satur-

day morning.

About 3 o'clock Saturday afternoon, Killoran's trousers were discovered, and, soon after, his belt, one shoe, and the top of his pajamas. Killoran was found minutes later by Seabrook Police Officer Asa H. Knowles, and Hiram Beckman, Jr., and Frank G. Randall, also of Seabrook.

Medical referee, Dr. W. P. Clare of Portsmouth, Sunday night reported that Killoran died of traumatic shock, with contributing factors including exposure, multiple insect bites, dehydration, starvation, and wandering about while mentally incompetent.

Killoran was employed as custodian of the Rice square Grammar school in Worcester. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Mary Killoran, four daughters, and two sons. The body was taken to Worcester for services and burial.

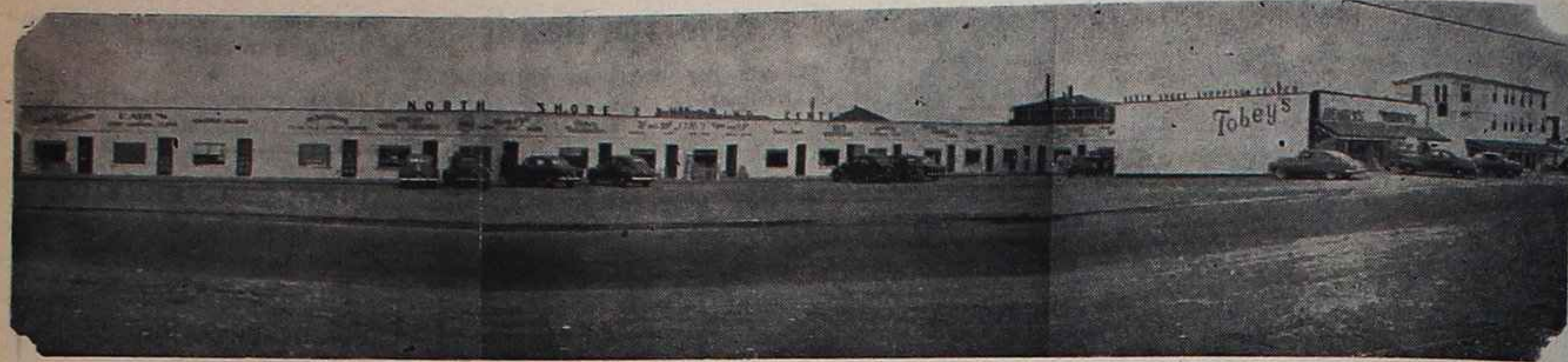
