Dry Weather

Blamed For 3

Sunday Fires

Three small brush and slash fires plagued the fire department Sunday afternoon, but more trouble was encountered in heavy Sunday traffic than in actually fighting the fires, according to Fire Chief George Lamott.

The department answered a call in the latter part of the afternoon for a small marsh fire at Boar's Head. Once the apparatus negotiated the boulevard-long line of cars the blaze was promptly brought under control.

Earlier in the day the department responded to a brush fire in the 12 Shares area on Little River road and to a slash and wood fire on Locke road. There was relatively no loss in either blaze, according to the fire chief.

Chief Lamott warns that incendiary fires are forbidden in Hampton and that as a result of Governor Gregg's proclamation Sunday night, all outside burning is prohibited until further notice.

Also on Sunday afternoon the fire department resuscitator was called for emergency treatment of an 80-year-old Mass. woman who suffered a heart attack at the beach. Though firemen worked for almost an hour and a half, the woman failed to respond to treatment. She was Mrs. Thomas Anderson of Woburn, Mass. County

Medical Referee Wendell Clare attributed the cause of death as a heart attack.

Hampton Youths

Given Probation

Two Hampton youths have admitted their guilt in the destruction of property at the Hampton River Boat club and have made satisfactory restitution to the owners of equipment at the club that was destroyed or taken, Chief of Police John Malek said today.

The boys' ages are 13 and 14 and have been put on probation to the police chief for six months, it was learned. Chief Malek said that the No Trespassing signs on the boat club property will be strictly observed and unauthorized persons are warned to keep off the property.

The weatherman has practically guaranteed perfect beach weather for the July 4 weekend and with this prediction in mind, space on the sands of Hampton Beach should be at a premium.

Though the exceptionally dry weather has been a boom to local merchants and hotels owners, it has proved an anathema in other parts of New Hampshire where State Forester William H. Messeck, Jr. has termed conditions "serious" and said it will take at least an inch of rain to lessen the present fire danger.

Authorities at the U. S. Weather Bureau said the immediate forecast is for "fair and warm" weather. Yesterday no major rain storms appeared on the weather maps.

Crowds at the beach yesterday seemed well ahead of last year at this time and police reported traffic as running heavier than expected.

Next Monday night will see the beginning of the weekly amateur shows at the bandstand. Winners of the 7 p. m. show will be eligible to compete in the final event during Carnival Week beginning August 27. Normally nine contestants participate in each show and cash prizes of \$2, \$3 and \$5 are awarded to the winners.

The weekly display of fireworks will begin promptly at nine o'clock this evening in front of the Casino. The weekly display will continue right on through Labor Day. Evening concerts begin at 8:30, and there are three daily concerts.

Heat Factor In

Woman's Death,
Man Is Revived

Heat was given as a contributing factor in the death of Mrs. Thomas Anderson, 80, of Woburn, Mass. Sunday afternoon at Hampton Beach and in the collapse of James Rockvitch, 65, of North Randolph, Vermont later in the day.

Rockvitch readily responded to treatment after being moved to the first aid room at the police station and he was later released.

A resuscitator was rushed from the beach fire department in an attempt to save Mrs. Anderson's life, but an hour and a half's work failed to revive the woman. The county medical referee listed her death as a heart attack, the police reported.

Other reports show that a near-record number of children turned up at lost at either the police station or the Chamber of Commerce, but none remained longer than a half hour before a somewhat distraught and perspiring parent turned up.

Chief Malek estimated that over 3500 admirers turned up Friday night to hear Julius La Rosa at the Casino and on Saturday over 5000 jammed into the ballroom to the youthful Arthur Godfrey discovery. La Rosa has been a regular singer on the Godfrey TV show for the past year.





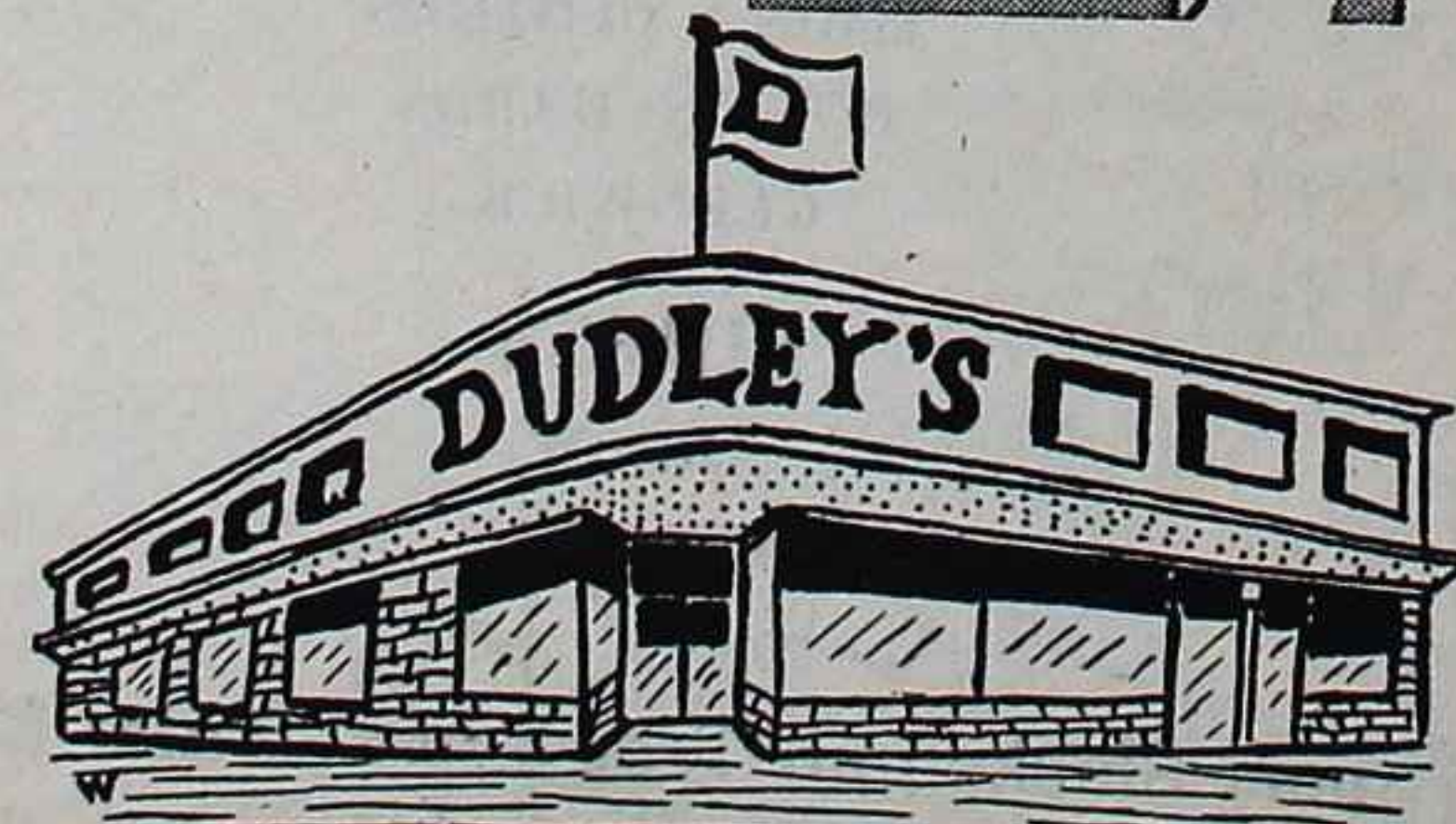

'I Am A Camera' At Playhouse Rated 'Unusual'

"I Am A Camera" — with the shutter open — introduces to Hampton Summer Theatre audiences John van Druten's outstanding adaptation of Christopher Isherwood's "Berlin Stories," with its searching remorse and tender romance that stimulated Broadway theatre-goers for two years.

Set in a Berlin rooming house in the early days of Nazism, when Jewish persecution was budding, author Christopher Isherwood was the "camera" recording events and emotions which were later to become his famous collection of stories of the German capital. The writer is portrayed in the play in the leading male role, mainly biographical, but fictionalized to some extent by van Druten to meet the dramatic needs of good theatre.

A main theme and sub-theme are carried through the story. Sally Bowles — a role made famous by Julie Harris — is the indecisive Bohemian nymphomaniac who loved men — with money — but never really found lasting fulfillment even when it was offered in its true

and sensitive form. She couldn't pick up the chips when they were stacked at her feet. Gertrude Doolittle gives the challenging role of Sally the full treatment and does an excellent job as the tart whose

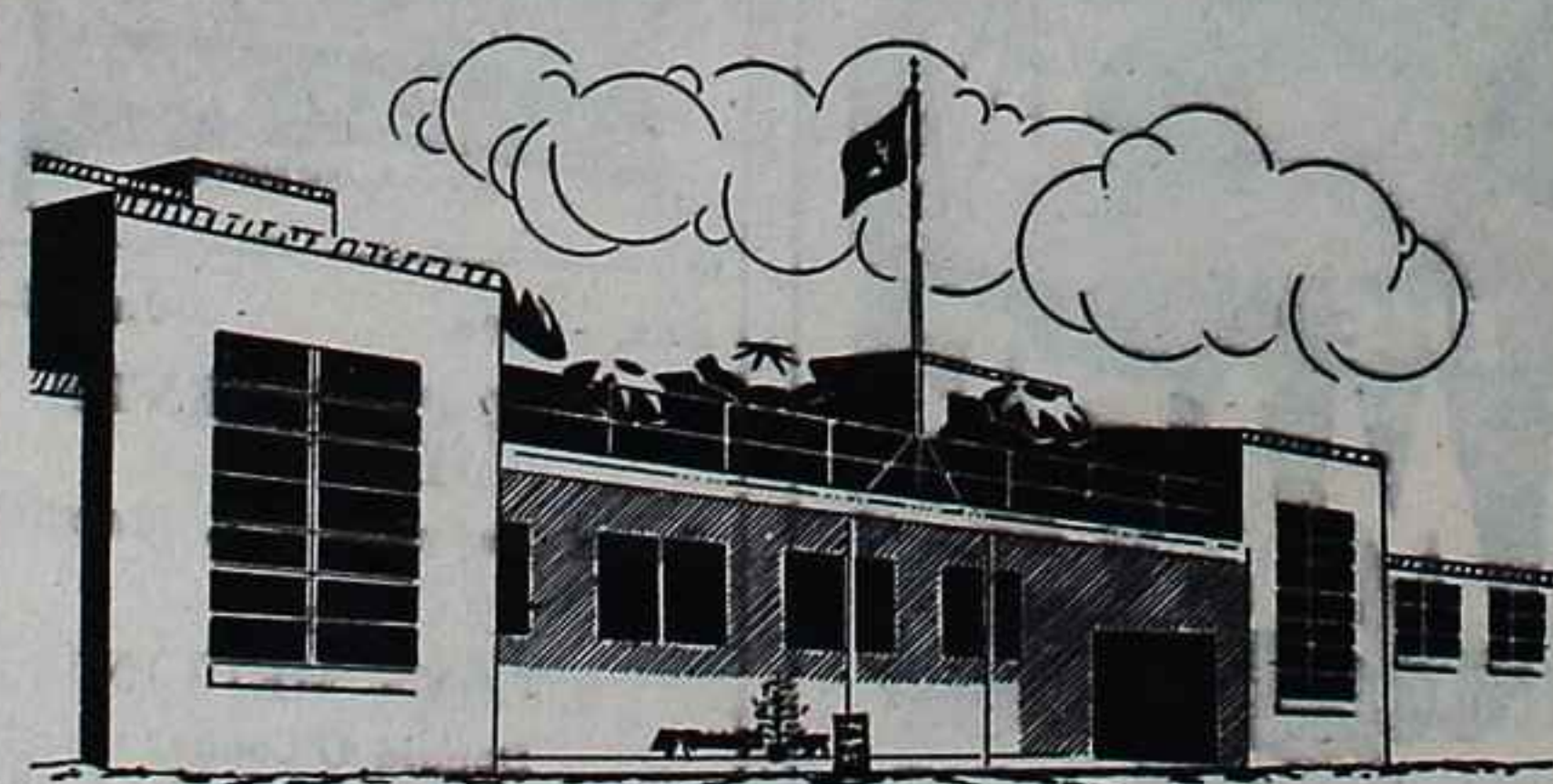

platonic relationship with Chris Isherwood provides the main theme of the play.

The sub-theme evolves around a love affair between the Jewess Natalia, the supposedly Aryan, Fritz, played against an explosive background of Nazi persecution of the non-Aryans. Mary James' feeling for the role of Natalia was outstanding giving a most convincing performance in a beautiful role. She was ably supported by Ben Morse as Fritz.

As Christopher Isherwood, Louis Beachner gave an exceptional sensitivity to the part that was completely lacking in either the Broadway or road productions of "I Am A Camera." His delicate feeling for the difficult shading of Isherwood, gives an entirely new meaning to the role that Hampton Summer theatre audiences will have the rare opportunity to enjoy.

Perhaps, in the face of Julie Harris, as Sally Bowles, previous Isherwoods seemed overpowered, but certainly Beachner's interpretation reveals a complete understanding of the character. His acting and diction were flawless. His rendering of van Druten's lines was without peer.

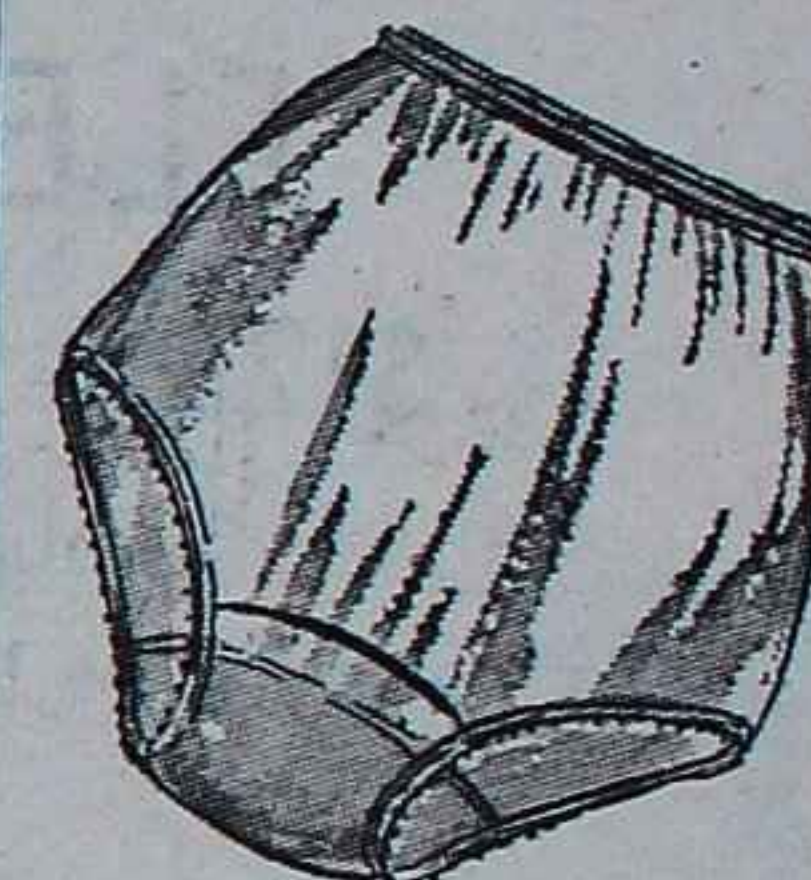
