Week's Events Include Gala Parade With 30 Floats

Worcester Girl, Working At Beach, Raises \$600 For Fund

A young Worcester, Mass., school teacher whose father was instrumental in raising \$600. at Hampton Beach for the Central Massachusetts Disaster Relief Committee.

Miss Helene Manning of 765 Main street, Worcester, organized a Tag Day Drive with the aid of Charles F. Butler, secretary of the Hampton Beach Chamber of Commerce and John J. Dineen, president of the Hampton Casino Associates, Inc.

Headquarters for the Tag Day were in the Chamber of Commerce office, where 37 volunteers assembled during their time off from work to obtain collection boxes and tags. Miss Manning, a substitute teacher in the Worcester public school system, is employed in the Casino Novelty shop during the summer. Her father was killed while visiting a house struck during the tornado.

Containers were placed in 19 restaurants along Ocean boulevard. The largest return was approximately \$100 from patrons of the Casino Ballroom. This marked the first time any fund drive ever was held there.

Mr. Butler termed Saturday's

drive a great success and said that it was especially appropriate since such a large percentage of people from the Worcester area have been able to contribute while spending their vacation at Hampton Beach. The check was mailed to the Disaster Relief Committee Monday when a final count was made.

A brother and sister team put their talents together in an adagio act at the beach amateur hour Monday night and took first prize in the senior division.

Winners were 18-year-old Paul Jackman and his 9-year-old sister, Kay of Everett, Mass.

In the junior division, Carolyn Snell, 12 and Walter Moss, 12, of Exeter won first prize with their rope skipping act.

Paul Kennedy, 8, of Dorchester, Mass., won second prize with his singing and Cathryn E. Clark, 8, of West Hartford, Conn., took the third prize with a dance routine.

In connection with the traditional Carnival Week which this year opens on the 27th of August and continues through the 2nd of September, John J. Dineen, president of the Casino Enterprises and general chairman of the committee in charge, promises seven consecutive days of just plain fun and frolic.

Henry J. Hamel, who acted as producer and director of the very successful Carnival promotion last year, has been retained to again serve in that capacity. He will provide the professional touch to those feature events such as the solemn coronation ceremonies, the selection of Miss Hampton Beach, and the colorful Carnival Ball.

Serving as a prelude to the celebration, a special display of fireworks is scheduled for the evening of the 26th. This will be followed by the official opening on the 27th, featuring the selection of "Miss Hampton Beach" for 1953. This event, always highly competitive and sometimes controversial, rates one of the high spots on the program. The winner will lend her charm to many of the events to follow throughout the week. Application forms are still available at the Chamber of Commerce office for those young ladies who wish to compete for this title.

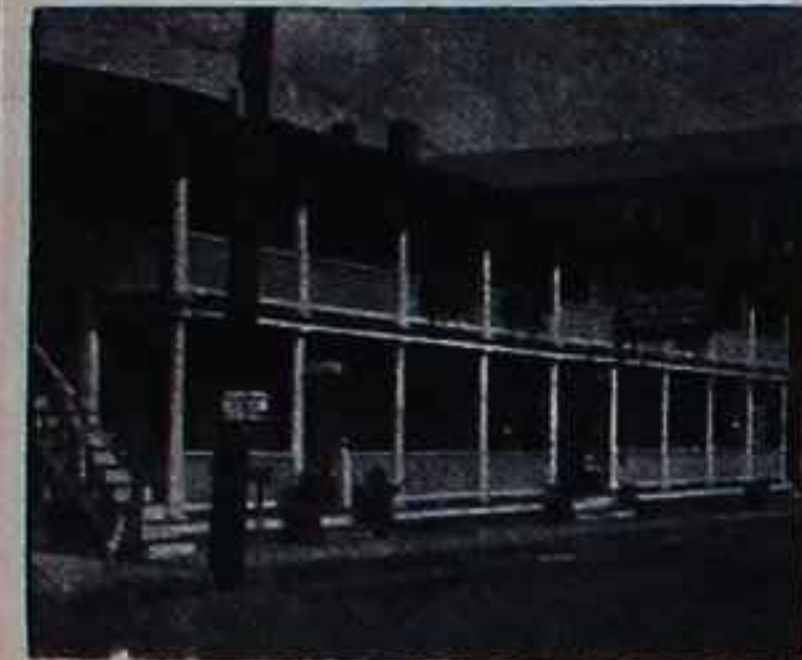

Two men who swam to the youngster's aid also missed possible drowning when after reaching him they encountered difficulty in swimming against the tide.

The trio was saved when their plight was called to the attention of lifeguards at the Rye Beach club who manned a lifeboat and brought Robert Eaton, the boy, Wilfred Marrama, 32, Leominster, Mass., and an unidentified man safely ashore.

According to officials both men attempted to swim out to the youth and bring him in. Marrama reached him first, but he could not swim with young Eaton against the tide.

Paul Caswell and Philip Drake, both of Rye, manned the Rye Beach club's lifeboat and succeeded in bringing the trio to shore.

Earlier in the day the boy's mother, Mrs. Catherine Eaton, was taken to the Portsmouth hospital when a beach umbrella, swept by high winds, fell on her head causing a laceration which required several stitches to close.

Observers said the boy was floating on an inner tube at Jenness Beach in Rye when a strong ebb tide carried him more than a half a mile from shore.

After the lifeguards brought the trio to shore, the boy was taken to the Portsmouth hospital where he was treated for immersion and later released.

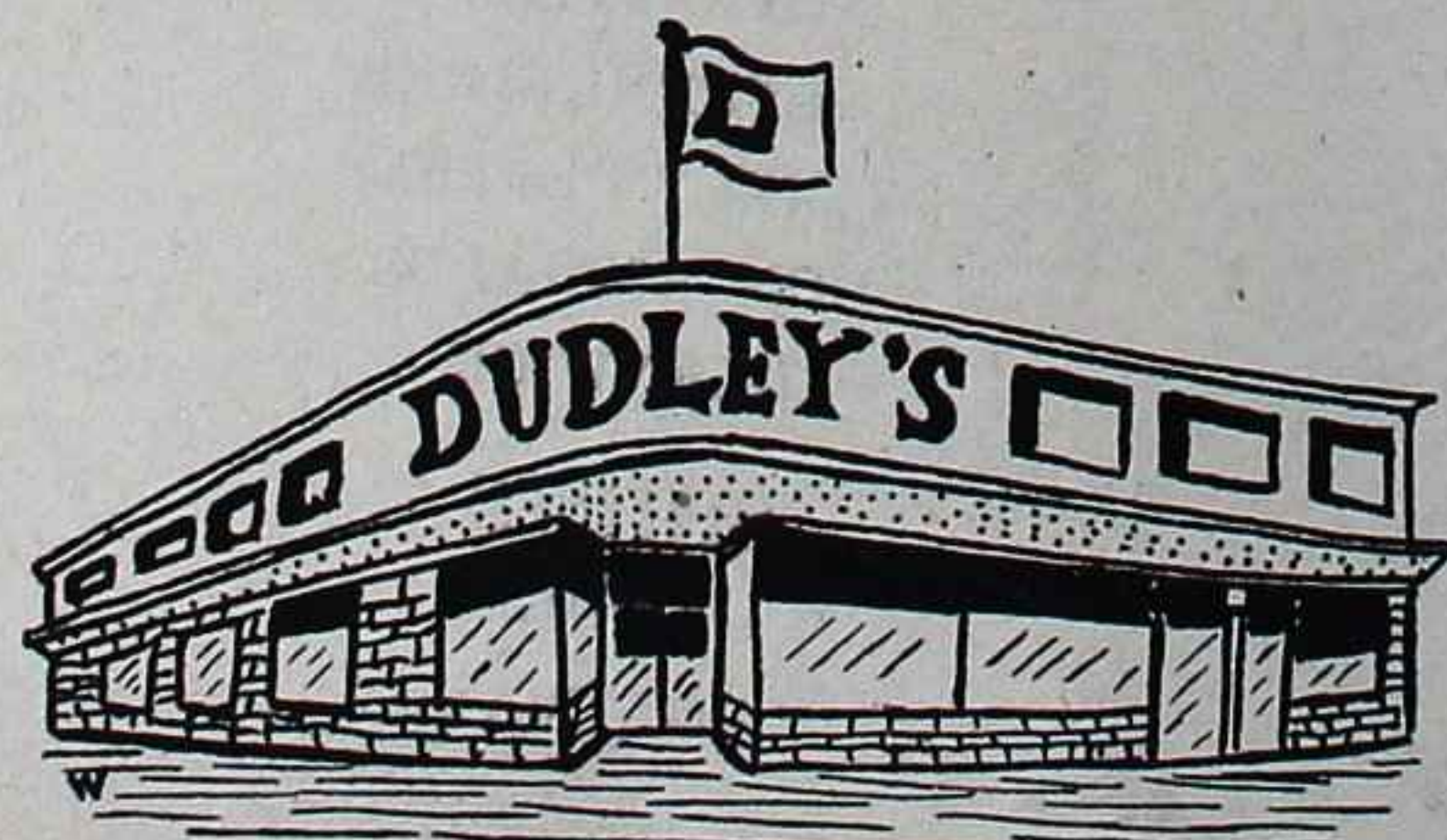

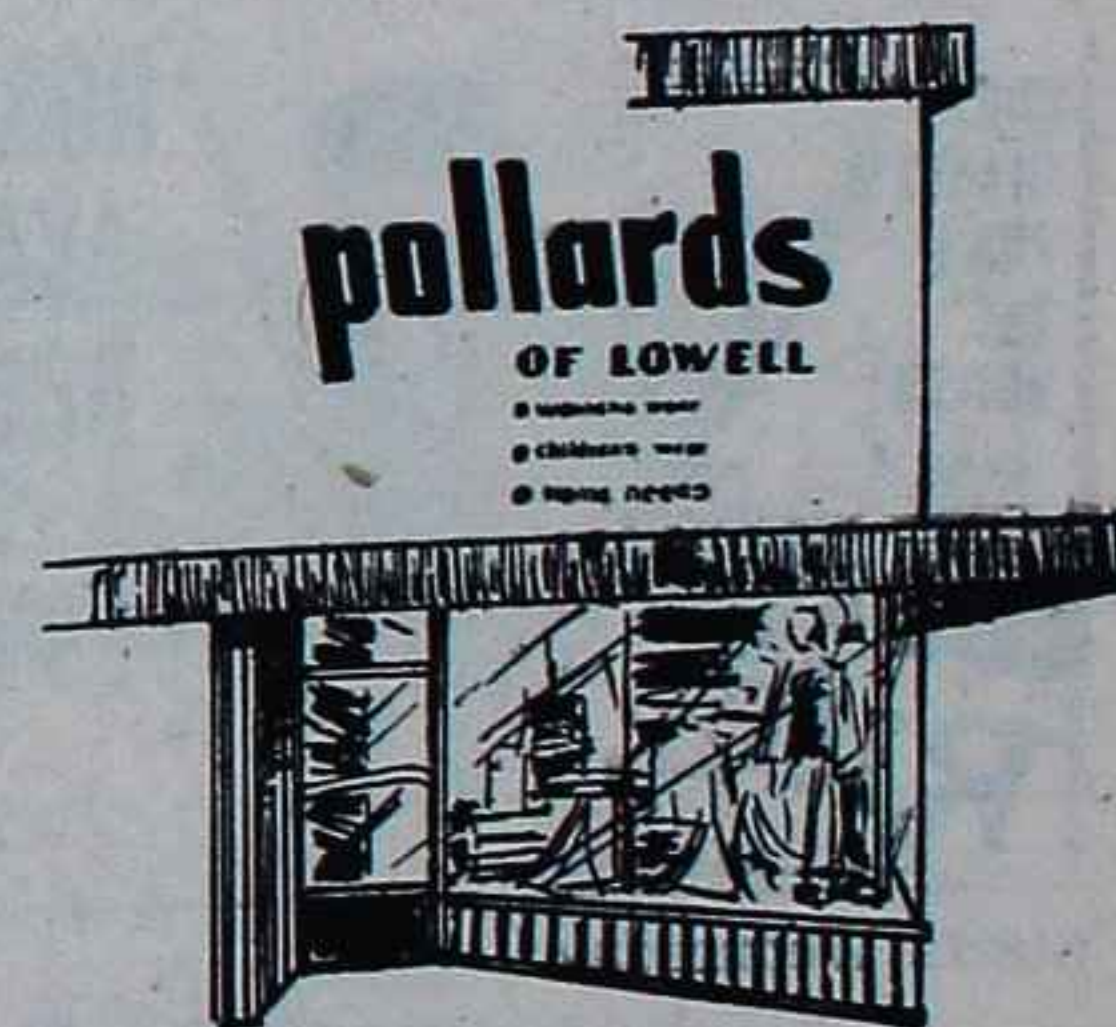

'Dame Nature' A Study Of Youth, At Playhouse

When a pair of 15-year-old children discover that they are going to have a baby, you have a situation that is tragic and at the same time highly amusing because of the naivete of the characters involved. This is the theme of the delightfully entertaining play, "Dame Nature" currently being viewed at the Hampton Summer Theatre.

The bewildered young father comes from a wealthy home that suffers from quarrelling parents. In his loneliness, he finds solace in the company of an equally lonely, orphaned shop girl. The results are apocalyptic for the children, for the parents and for the doctor. Old Max, the window cleaner, beautifully played by Raymond Johnson, was the only one who fully understood and sympathized with the children's serious problem.

Nancy-Louise Marshall gives a lovely and delicate performance as Leonie Perrot, the little mother, and Louis Beachner displays his versatility by creating a most effective father. As Andre Brisac, he portrays a young boy in short pants and is most convincing in a tragically beautiful role.

James Arenton does his usual fine job as the indifferent and marrelsome parent while Lucie Lancaster, for the fourth time portrays an indignant mother, gives her best performance of the season. Local interest is stimulated in "Dame Nature" by the appearance

of three Hamptonites in the cast. Billy Weinhold makes his bow as a Very Small Boy, Dickie Lavigne returns to the ranks as Beer, and John Donaldson plays Uncle Lucien.

The lines of the play are extremely witty and although, the basic theme of the play sounds tragic and sordid it is done on a very high plane. The innocence of the "children" and their adaptation and adjustment to a most adult problem provides many humorous situations which provides laughter all through the play.

Beneath the humor, Birabeau carries the tender seriousness of the play which will touch your heartstrings. You will find yourself loving the "children" as Old Max. The ending is egalitarian. The presence of the baby levels off all the characters and asserts the equality of all men.

Jack Evans was particularly strong in his supporting role of Batton who shares the secret of the approaching blessed event with Old Max.

Others in the cast are Wally White, John Waggaman, Frederic Koester, Catherine Coffin, and Ben Morse.

You will find "Dame Nature" a wonderfully entertaining evening. It will make your cheeks ache with laughter and your throat tighten with emotion. It is a pleasing — inoffensive — naughty but nice comedy.
