Mass. Youth Hit By Car Suffers Fractured Leg

A 9-year-old Lexington, Mass. boy, vacationing with his family at the beach, was struck by an automobile on Ocean boulevard early Sunday evening, suffering fracture of the left leg, police reported.

Paul Alley, 19, of Medford, Mass. operator of the vehicle that struck James A. Leffer of Lexington, reported to police that the boy stepped abruptly from behind a parked car on the boulevard and that he had insufficient time to stop his car and avoid hitting the youth.

Police reported that the youngster suffered a fractured left leg and following treatment was removed to a Boston hospital. Police said they are continuing an investigation of the circumstances of the accident.

The night before the opening of the Carnival Week there will be the usual brilliant shoot of fireworks in front of the beach bandstand.

Serving as a prelude to the celebration, a special display of fireworks is scheduled for the evening of the 26th. This will be followed by the official opening on the 27th, featuring the selection of "MISS HAMPTON BEACH" for 1953. Buy Parking
Area Tickets**

For the convenience of rooming house and hotels guests at the beach, it was announced this week that a series of tickets may be purchased that will entitle the user to a week's parking in either of the two town-owned parking lots.

In view of the fact that some of the rooming houses in the Casino area do not have parking facilities for their guests, the Board of Selectmen felt it would be only equitable to make available parking areas for them. The strips of tickets, which may be purchased at the hotels and rooming houses, are for the exclusive use of the establishments.

The selectmen emphasize that the tickets are not being sold on a cut-rate basis, similar to bridge tickets, but only as a convenience for vacationists and hotels owners who are a disadvantage in not having parking area for their guests. A strip of ten tickets sells for \$1.50.

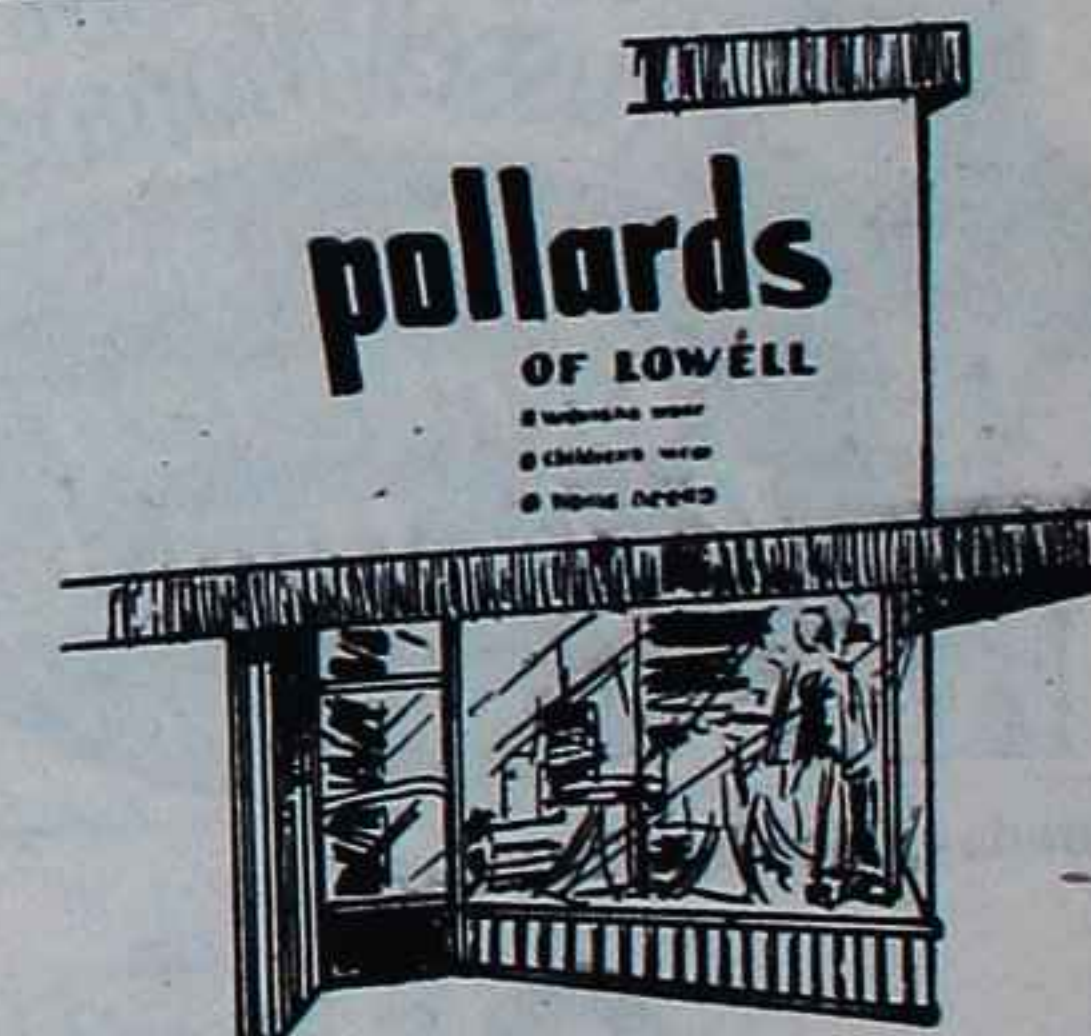

appeared that the source of the material sifting up the channel entrance to the harbor was sand from Hampton Beach and that both he and Underwood discussed with the Beach Erosion Board the possibility of designating the harbor as a borrow area for replenishing the sand on the beach. The memorandum also indicated that the Board had taken samples and determined that the sand there is satisfactory for use on the beach.

Satisfactory Solution

It was the opinion of Underwood and Bousquet that that this would be a satisfactory solution as it would permit the Corps of Engineers to submit their report on the harbor and making it clear that the harbor problem is being solved

incidental to remedying the beach erosion situation.

In studying the harbor matter, Bousquet said in his report to Senator Bridges, that "it is quite obvious that commercial navigation would not justify the cost of improvement of this locality." It was pointed out that other larger ports in this area would "practically preclude" the classing of Hampton harbor as a "harbor of refuge." He also said it was doubtful if a project for harbor dredging and clearance could be developed on the basis of recreational boating.
