Swimming Ban

A swimming ban has been put into force on the northerly side of Hampton River channel as requested by officials of the North Atlantic Dredging company, it was learned this week.

Continuous water traffic and other water operations in that vicinity make swimming dangerous there, a spokesman said. The ban is expected to be maintained until completion of dredging work in the channel and harbor mouth.

The restricted area begins immediately south of the state bath house and runs parallel with the channel to the bridge and beyond to where the dredge is now operating.

A patrolman is to be stationed in the restricted vicinity to enforce the ban, it was reported.


