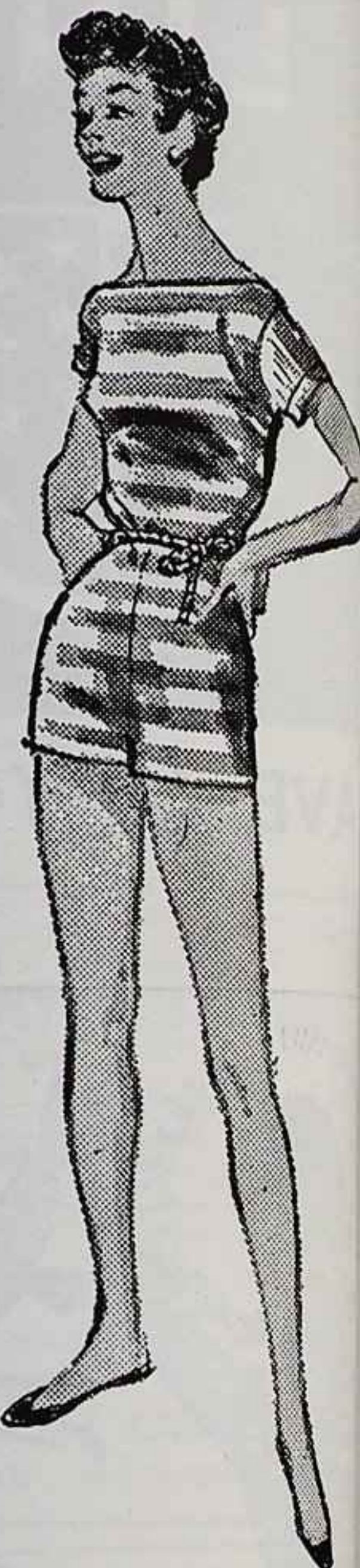

## Beauty Queen Contest Aug. 2



Eighteen lovely young ladies from all sections of New England and Canada, have already entered the contest to select "Miss Hampton Beach of 1956" which will be held next Thursday evening, August 2, at 7:00 p.m. from the bandstand.

This year, something a little different will be done. In previous years, Miss Hampton Beach was chosen the last week in August. This year, however, she will be selected the first week so as to let her reign throughout the entire Festival month.

The queen will be chosen August 2nd, but will not be crowned until August 30th.

As usual George Hagopian, official photographer for the Chamber of Commerce, and Dick Hand, of WBZ-TV, will be on hand to take pictures and movies.

This year the girls will be given a card with a number on it, and when they step out on the bandstand, the master of ceremonies, Bill Elliot, will call off only their first name, their number and age. They will proceed out onto a special raised platform, and then return to a designated place on the bandstand. The field of beauties will gradually narrow down until the judges have picked a queen.

On August 30, the queen will be crowned, with a king for the queen to be chosen at the last moment. The queen will then proceed to the Casino Ballroom for the Coronation Ball, where she will be surrounded by a full court of approximately 125 lovely young ladies.

The judges will be announced later, it was reported by Mr. Henry Hamel.

The queen will receive a \$200 savings bond, and will ride on the Chamber of Commerce float in the beauty parade on August 24, and will ride on the float in the Children's Day parade on August 25.

## Lifeguards Preserve Beach Safety Record



Lifeguards at Hampton Beach had their work cut out for them during the past week to maintain their perfect safety record, as shifting sands produced riptides which endangered swimmers in the center of the beach, but the alert crew have managed to prevent any serious accidents.

The first rescue, as recorded by police, was off D street at 10:35 a.m. on July 10 when two youngsters, Alan Mutart and William Vareschi, both of North Adams, Mass., were carried out to deep water on a float, got panicky and jumped off.

Lifeguards Hobbs and Donovan noticed the man and swam out to bring the two in to shore. Other than being tired and nervous the boys were alright.

On July 12, Nancy Krieger and Susan Fling, both of Exeter were carried out into deep water by the strong undertow in the water opposite D street. Joseph Delphia of Pittsfield, Mass., and Leon Janus of Palmer, Mass., went in after them, but were stranded also. Lifeguards went in after them and the Krieger girl had to be brought in by boat as she was not a good swimmer. After a rest the four swimmers were back on the beach.

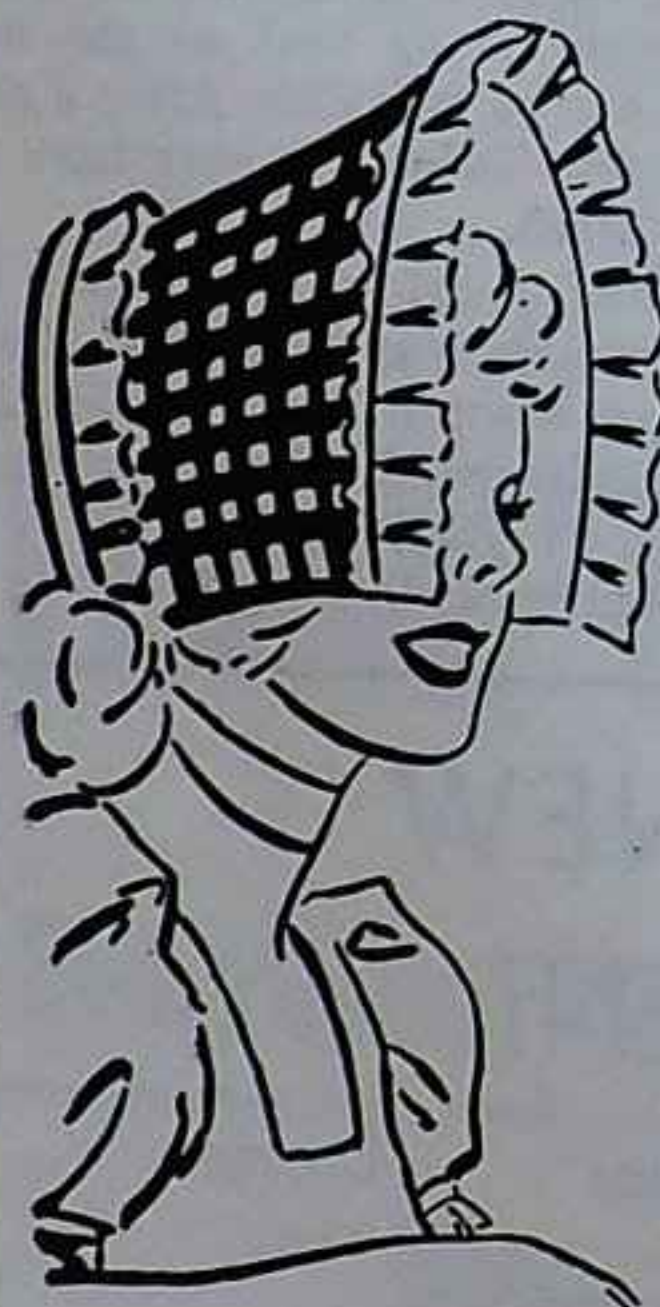

Marsh highway, a new traffic artery connecting Glade and Island Paths at Hampton Beach, was opened for a short time and then closed again to traffic as town officials deemed it inadvisable to use until guard rails are installed.

Acting on advice of town Counsel John W. Perkins the Selectmen have closed the new road, designed to relieve traffic congestion during church services Sunday morning, until protection guard rails can be installed along the sides of the steep embankment.

Selectman Donald A. Ring stated today that although the original \$8,000 appropriations for the new roadway had been expended, the board felt that an additional sum of \$1,000 for guard rails was warranted and that installation would be started immediately.
