

Lifeguards at Hampton Beach had their work cut out for them during the past week to maintain their perfect safety record, as shifting sands produced riptides which endangered swimmers in the center of the beach, but the alert crew have managed to prevent any serious accidents.

The first rescue, as recorded by police, was off D street at 10:35 a.m. on July 10 when two youngsters, Alan Mutart and William Vareschi, both of North Adams, Mass., were carried out to deep water on a float, got panicky and jumped off.

Lifeguards Hobbs and Donovan noticed the man and swam out to bring the two in to shore. Other than being tired and nervous the boys were alright.

On July 12, Nancy Krieger and Susan Fling, both of Exeter were carried out into deep water by the strong undertow in the water opposite D street. Joseph Delphia of Pittsfield, Mass., and Leon Janus of Palmer, Mass., went in after them, but were stranded also. Lifeguards went in after them and the Krieger girl had to be brought in by boat as she was not a good swimmer. After a rest the four swimmers were back on the beach.
