




Beach Water Ski Jumper Winner of N. E. Title

Scoring with jumps of 45 and 46 feet, Wanda Toppan of Hmpton, won the women's New England Water Ski Jumping championship, at Lake Paugus, Laconia, Sunday. Miss Toppan represented the Hampton Beach Water Ski club in the championship events.

Forced to compete in a combined women's and girls' class, fifteen year old Wanda took 137 points on her two jumps, and led her nearest rival, Barbara White. by five points at the end of the competition.

More than 2,000 spectators were on hand to watch the event, a prelude to the Estern championships that will be held at Lake Opechee, Laconia, on August 10-12. Winners from this event qualify for the Nationals, held this year at Laporte, Indiana, the last week-end in August.

In the senior division capturing first place was Frank Clark, 16, of Lowell, Mass., with his rendition of the song "He."


A close second was taken by Emma Figueroy of Lakewood, N. J., with her guitar instrumental to "I Wanna Be A Cowboys Sweetheart."
