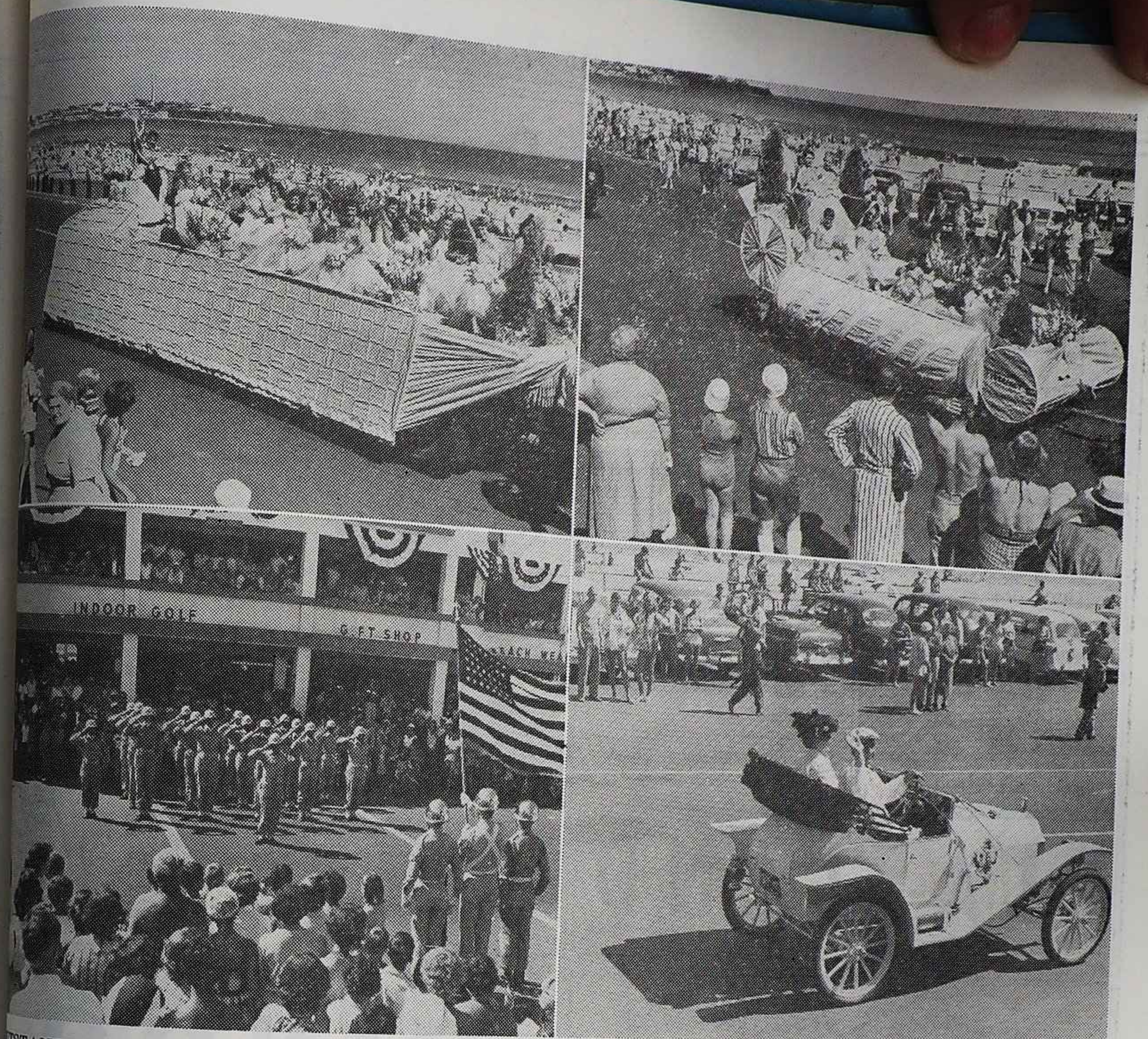

### Canadian Woman Saved From Surf By Policeman

A Canadian woman was saved from drowning last night at Hampton Beach through the heroic efforts of a member of the Hampton Police department.

Mrs. Dorothy M. Mitchell, 53, Brantford, Ontario, owes her life to the quick thinking of Police Officer George Leslie who plunged into the heavy surf, clothes all, to haul her to safety

after a heavy undertow had swept her out beyond her depth directly behind the beach police station.

According to Police Chief John J. Malek, who had high praise for the heroic action of the policeman, Officer Leslie had just rounded the corner of the station shortly after 7 p.m. last night when he heard the screams of Mrs. Mitchell's fourteen-year-old son, who was with his mother at the time.

Officer Leslie ran into the surf without stopping to remove any of his uniform or his gun and holster, because he could see the

woman was in desperate trouble. Only her arms were above water as Leslie reached her and managed to grab hold and drag her towards shore.

Halfway in he was joined by a Navy man, Robert Stark, attached to the Portsmouth Naval Base, who assisted in bringing Mrs. Mitchell to shore, where Officer Leslie, a male nurse, applied artificial respiration.

Officer Leslie accompanied Mrs. Mitchell to Exeter Hospital where authorities reported this morning that she was "very much better" and hoped to be released today.

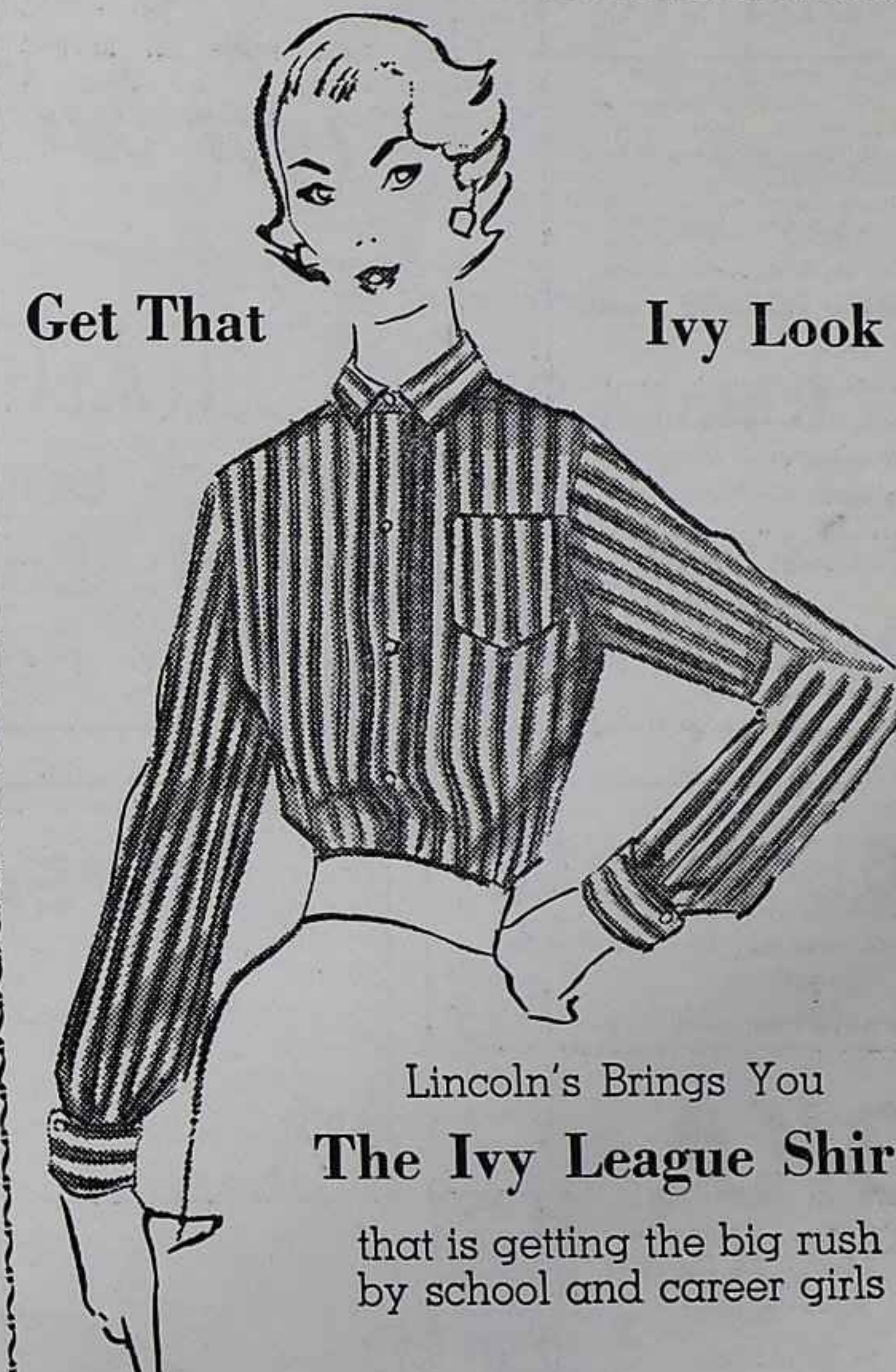
