





Injured In Fall From Busmobile

Stepping from a moving vehicle almost resulted in a fatal accident Monday night near the Coast Guard station at Hampton Beach. Mary Malory, 70, of Dracut, Mass., was rushed to Exeter hospital in the police department ambulance suffering from a compound fracture of the leg, head lacerations, and shock after she fell from the Busmobile while try-ing to get off before it stopped.
