





## New Aerial Fire Truck Arrives

The new \$24,000 truck was purchased by the Hampton Beach village precinct by a vote of 30 to 7 at its annual meeting, March 26, after a lengthy debate on the need for such a purchase. The cost of the vehicle is equivalent to 33 cents on the precinct tax rate for the next 12 years.

Fire Chief Perley R. George said the hydraulically operated ladder on the new truck can be extended 65 feet in any direction. The aluminum alloy ladder can be extended full length horizontally, as well as vertically, for rescue from ice or

In emphasizing the need for the new ladder truck, Chief George said the ladders and other equipment on the old truck were 33 years old, al-
