

Boating as a sport has gained tremendously in popularity throughout the nation.

Here in New Hampshire a 41% increase in boat registrations has been realized since 1950. A total of 32,643 boats -both inboards and outboards -were registered by the Public Utilities Commission in 1958 as compared to a total registration of 13,332 in 1950.

Registrations for 1959 are currently running about 1,000 ahead of registrations received to the same date last year which seems to indicate that this season there will be more boats than ever on New Hamp shire's lakes.


