

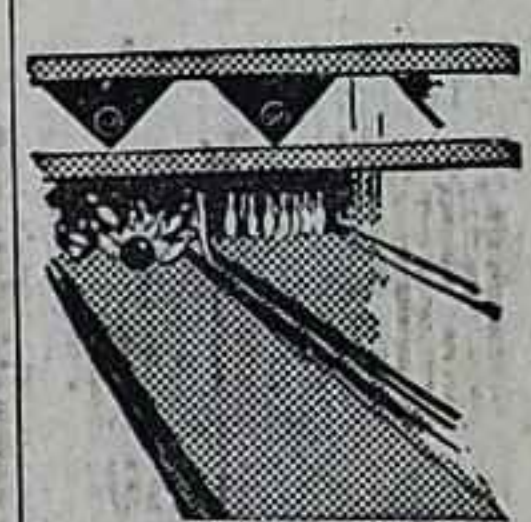

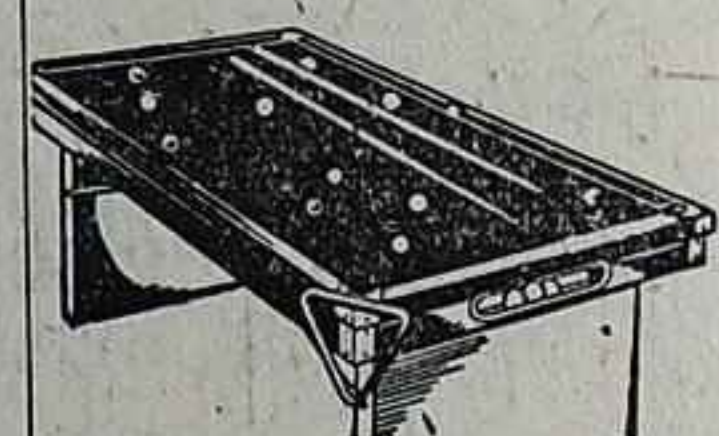

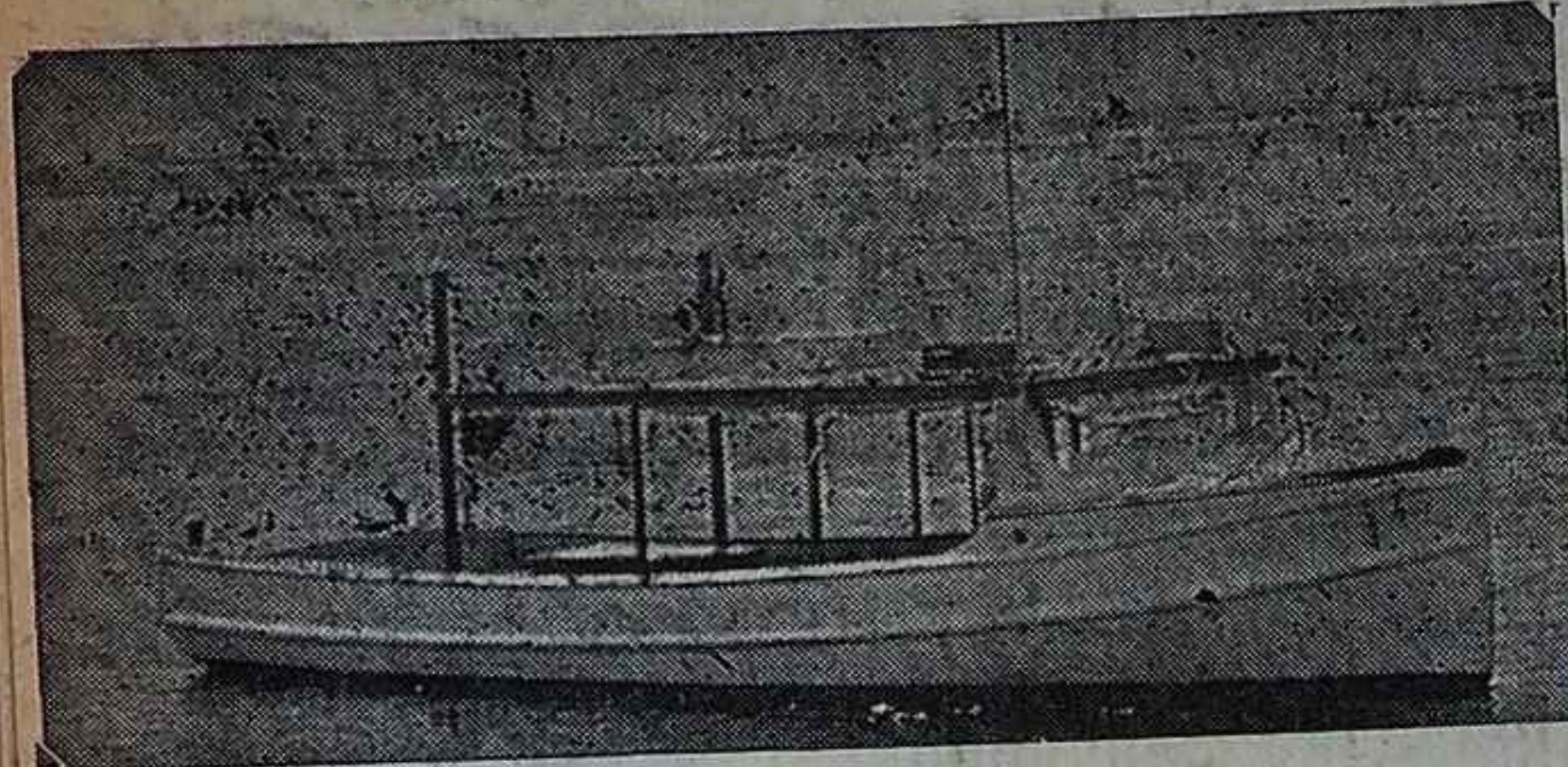

# Beach Parade Stirs Interest In Mardi Gras Week

An impromptu Canadian Day parade was staged at Hampton Beach Friday as a preview of the official Canadian Day to be held here August 21 as a special feature of Mardi Gras Week.

Films for television in Boston and Montreal were shot to give people here and in Canada an idea of the fun in store for them during Mardi Gras.

A bagpiper and a drummer from the Granite State High School showed up in kilts to lead the parade. Richard Rau of Stratham, a student at Exeter High school, played the pipes and Randel Blake of Hampton, a student of Winnacunnet High school, played the drums for hundreds of Canadians and Americans who fell into the line of march.

Pretty Denise Lileberte, 22, of Quebec City carried the Canadian Flag and Miss Barbara Gahan, 16, of Cranston, R.I., carried the American Flag as the marchers filed down Ocean Boulevard from the bandstand a short distance and then turned abruptly onto the beach and marched back along the water's edge.

To get the crowd warmed up for the parade, sisters Ann and Shirley McCormick, 19 and 17, of Montreal led the singing of many verses of "Allouette" from the bandstand.

On the official Canadian Day

at Hampton Beach, Sunday of Mardi Gras week, there will be a special speaker from Canada, to be announced, as well as such other features as a pie eating contest, a horseshoe pitching contest, two performances by young Paul O'Keefe, and a barbershop quartet concert.

Young instrumentalists, a steel guitarist and a pianist, were top winners in the Monday night talent show at Hampton Beach.

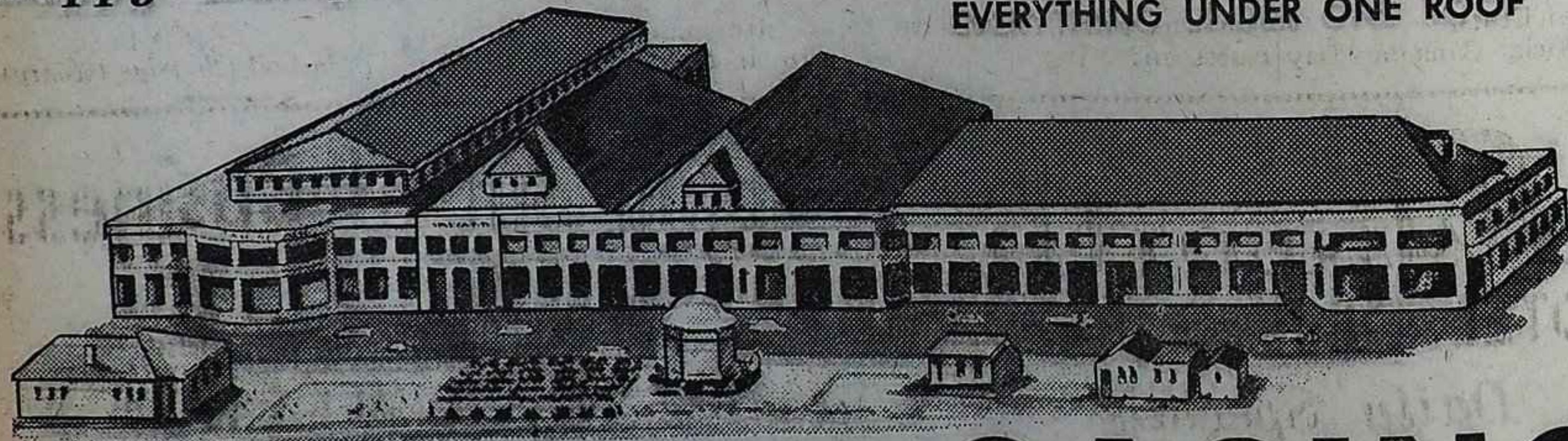
Johnny Calce, 14, of Worcester, Mass., plans to make a career of his talent for playing the steel guitar. He won first prize in the junior division by

## Four Stolen Cars Recovered At Beach

Four stolen cars were recovered in Hampton by local police between July 29 and August 2. At 3:40 a.m. August 2 Sgt. Jon Lovejoy on patrol discovered a 17-year-old youth parked in a car at the end of Johnson avenue at Hampton Beach. When the youth was unable to produce registration papers for the car, which had New York plates, he was taken to police headquarters for questioning.

Police said Ronald Boyd, 22 Sherman street, Old Saybrook, Conn., later admitted stealing the car he was driving from a hotel parking lot in Old Saybrook. Registration papers found later in the vehicle gave the owner of the car as Morse Associates, Inc., of New Rochelle, N. Y. Boyd was turned over to Connecticut authorities.

While on patrol early July 30 Sgt. Harold Buttrick and Officer Spencer Sullivan came upon a car on Island path that was apparently having trouble. The three occupants of the car all juveniles from Somerville, Mass., were taken to the police station for questioning when they acted suspiciously.

Under interrogation by Police Chief John A. Roden later, the youths admitted stealing the vehicle July 29 in Cambridge, Mass. The car was owned by Monique Grose of New York City. The boys also admitted

breaking into another car in Cambridge and stealing gasoline credit cards. They were turned over to Cambridge authorities.

Friday afternoon, July 29, Officer Joseph Farnsworth was on meter patrol duty when he came upon a car he had ticketed for a parking violation at the same meter 24 hours earlier. He reported the registration of the vehicle for a check, and it was learned that the car was stolen in Massachusetts the previous day. The owner was listed as John J. Kelly of 14 Harvard street, Taunton, Mass.

On August 1, James H. McGrady of 532 Winnacunnet road reported that a station wagon owned by him and his partner was stolen from where it was parked on Winnacunnet road. Less than 20 minutes later the vehicle was spotted parked along Ocean boulevard by Sgt. Buttrick and Officer Neal Wiggin.

No lead was available in either of the latter two cases as to whom was responsible for the thefts, police said.

The county court allowed Anthony Taylor "to sell wine and strong water" at his inn or ordinary, established in 1654, two miles from the meeting house green in Hampton.

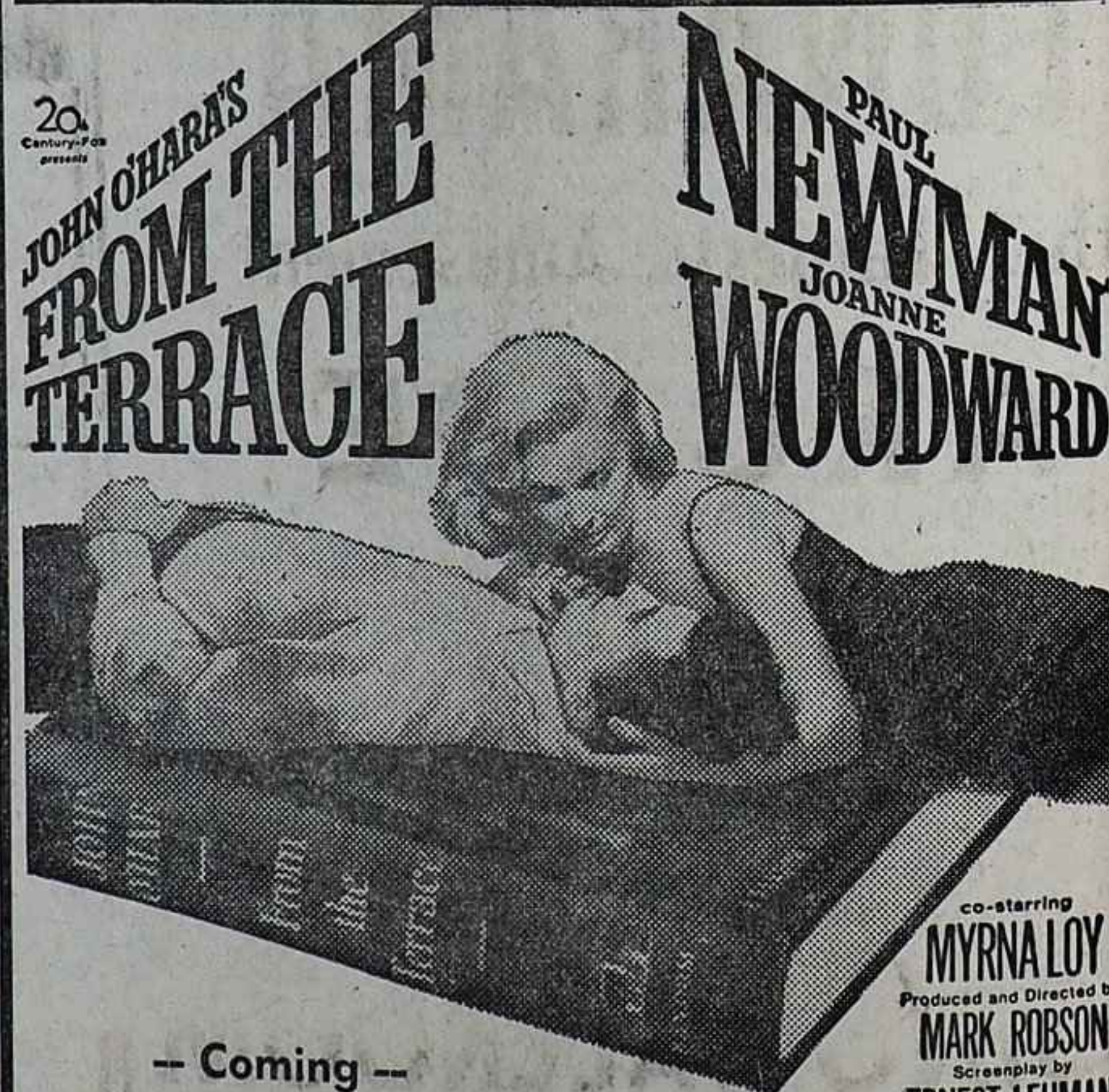

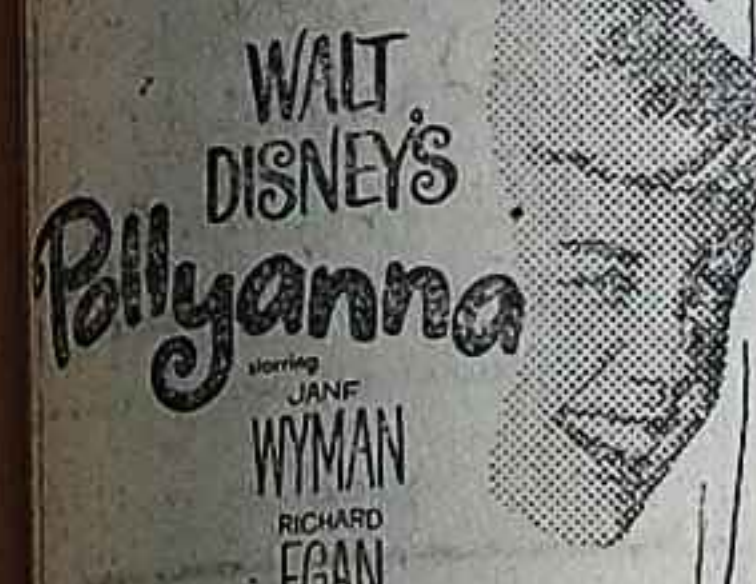

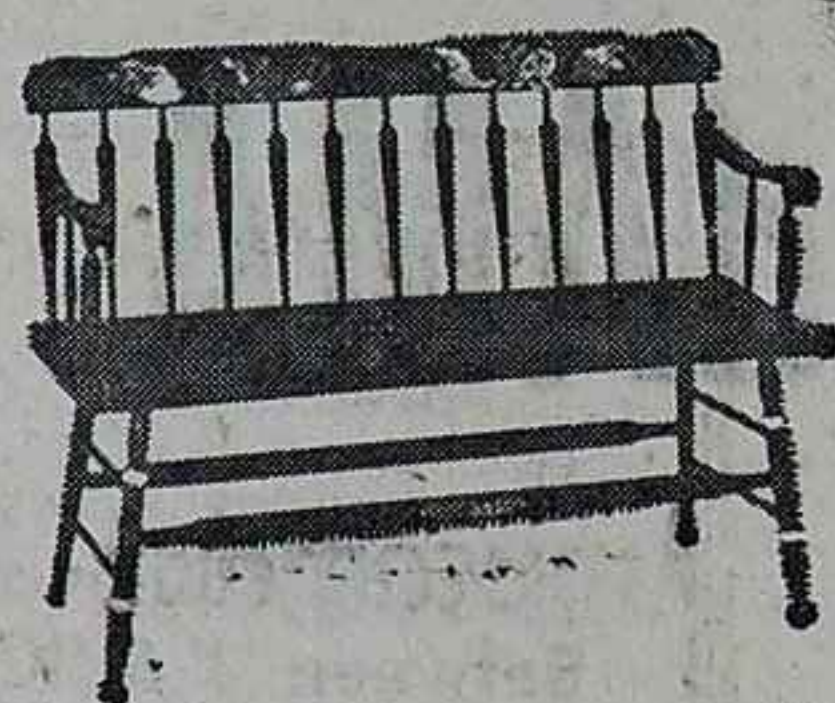

### Beach Canvass Is Underway By Coff

Chamber of Commerce directors met Friday morning at the fire station for a kick-off coffee to launch their 1960 contributions drive.

During the weeks ahead teams of directors will be canvassing beach businessmen in an effort to raise \$15,000 to cover the year-round expenses of the Chamber, according to William I. Elliot, executive secretary. Elliot stated that with additional promotion expenses this summer, the cash balance at the end of the summer will be \$4,000 under what is needed for winter operations, unless the contributions drive brings in the additional funds.

He explained that appropriations of \$15,000 by the precinct and \$10,000 by the town are earmarked for advertising and for band concerts, leaving the Chamber itself to raise about \$36,000 a year to cover the cost of remaining band salaries, fire works, promotional programs, and salaries of its office personnel.

A contributions formula for businessmen will be used as a guide by directors in the drive. The formula was approved by board of directors last spring and specifies "suggested" minimum contributions based on the type and size of business operation.

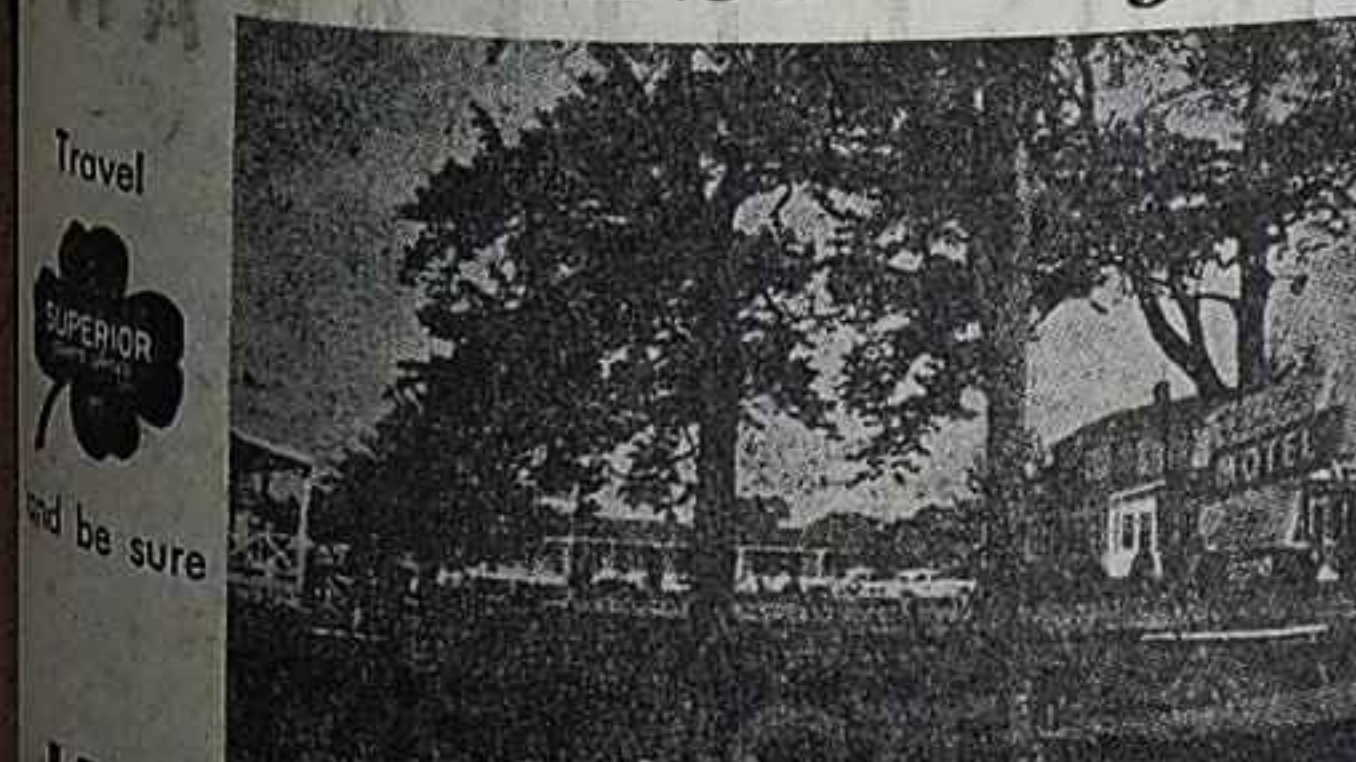

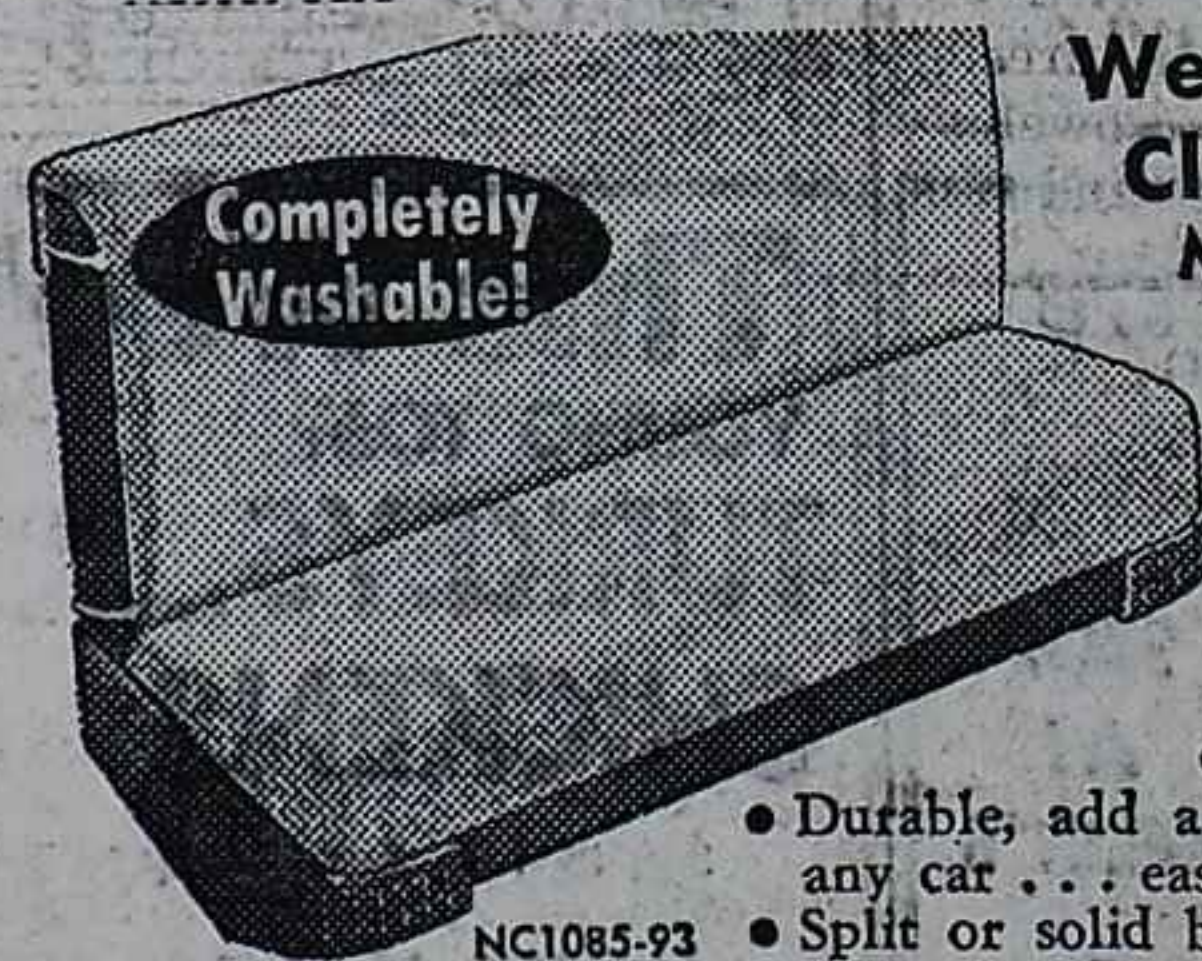

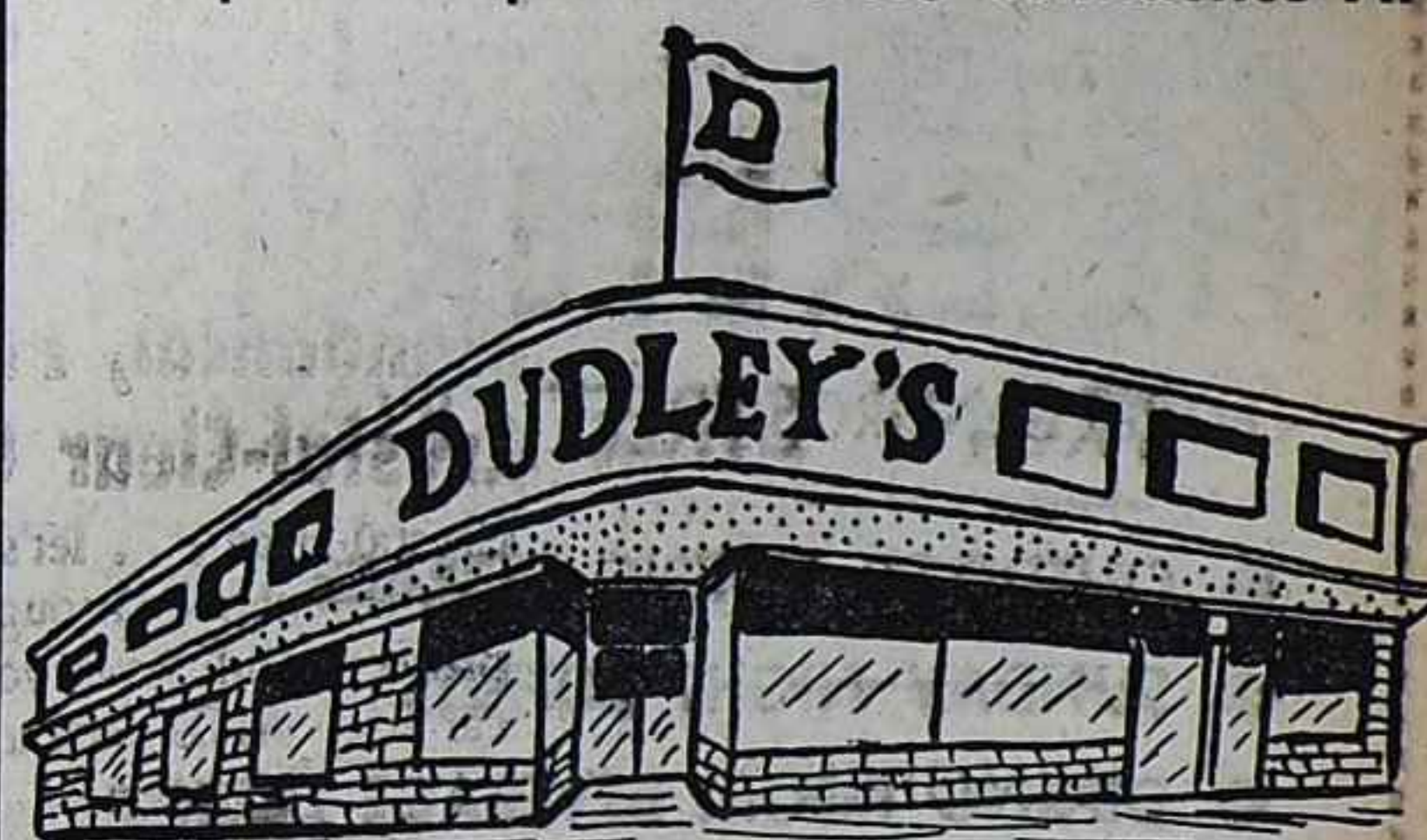

"Pajama Tops" is one of those amusingly clever plays that shoots punch lines with the speed of an ack-ack gun which kept an opening night audience in hysterical laughter. It might be defined as a prolonged burlesque skit that depends entirely upon situation rather than character.

The cast was well-balanced with Ailsa Dawson and Dennis Drew, as the Chauvinets, and Dorothy Rice and Richard Ken-

edy, teamed up as the La-touches. The frustrated Inspector Legrand was played by Fred Hoskins.

However, the biggest laugh producer was Sam Lloyd, as Leonard. Combining facial expressions, expressive gestures and tonal inflection, Lloyd made the best out of each line, stealing every scene in which he appeared. He outshone a shiny cast. Also, in the maid's role of Claudine, Juleen Compton captured the male audience with her attractiveness and the combined audience with her acting.

A garrish, colorful stage setting by Allen Klein and the liberal use of color in the costuming added to the merriment of the play.

There is never a dull moment in "Pajama Tops". The jokes fly thick and fast and the plot becomes more and more farcical with each succeeding act. It was a great credit to Alfred Christie's fine directing that the opening night of such a fast-moving comedy should come off with so few hitches.

Again—this is not a children's play! It is a sophisticated plot of amours and paramours and sexy situations. However, it is not the morbid Tennessee Williams type of treatment. The application of light, gay and singularly funny—and typical of the American version of the French attitude toward love. "Pajama Tops" is designed for laughter—and produces plenty of it. —HLP
