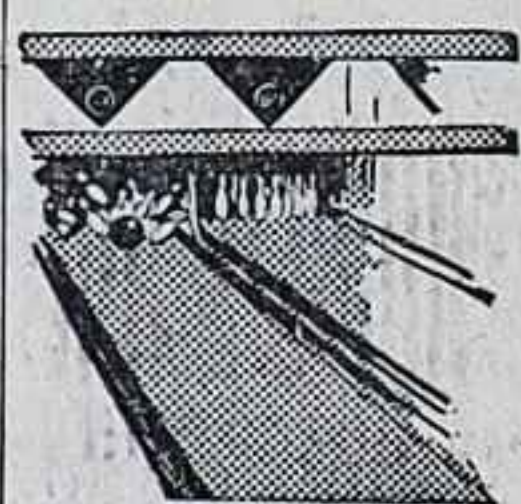

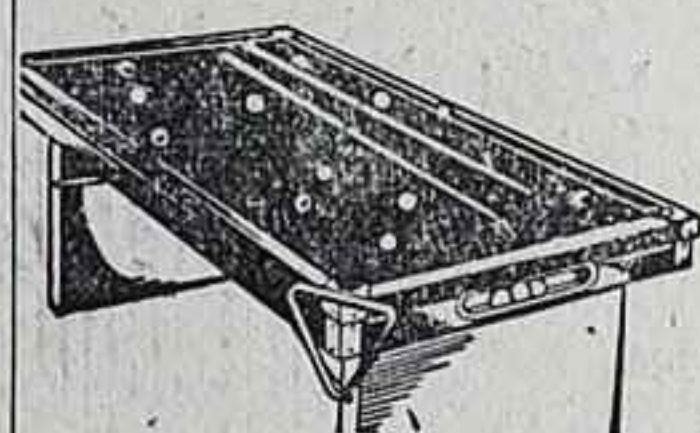

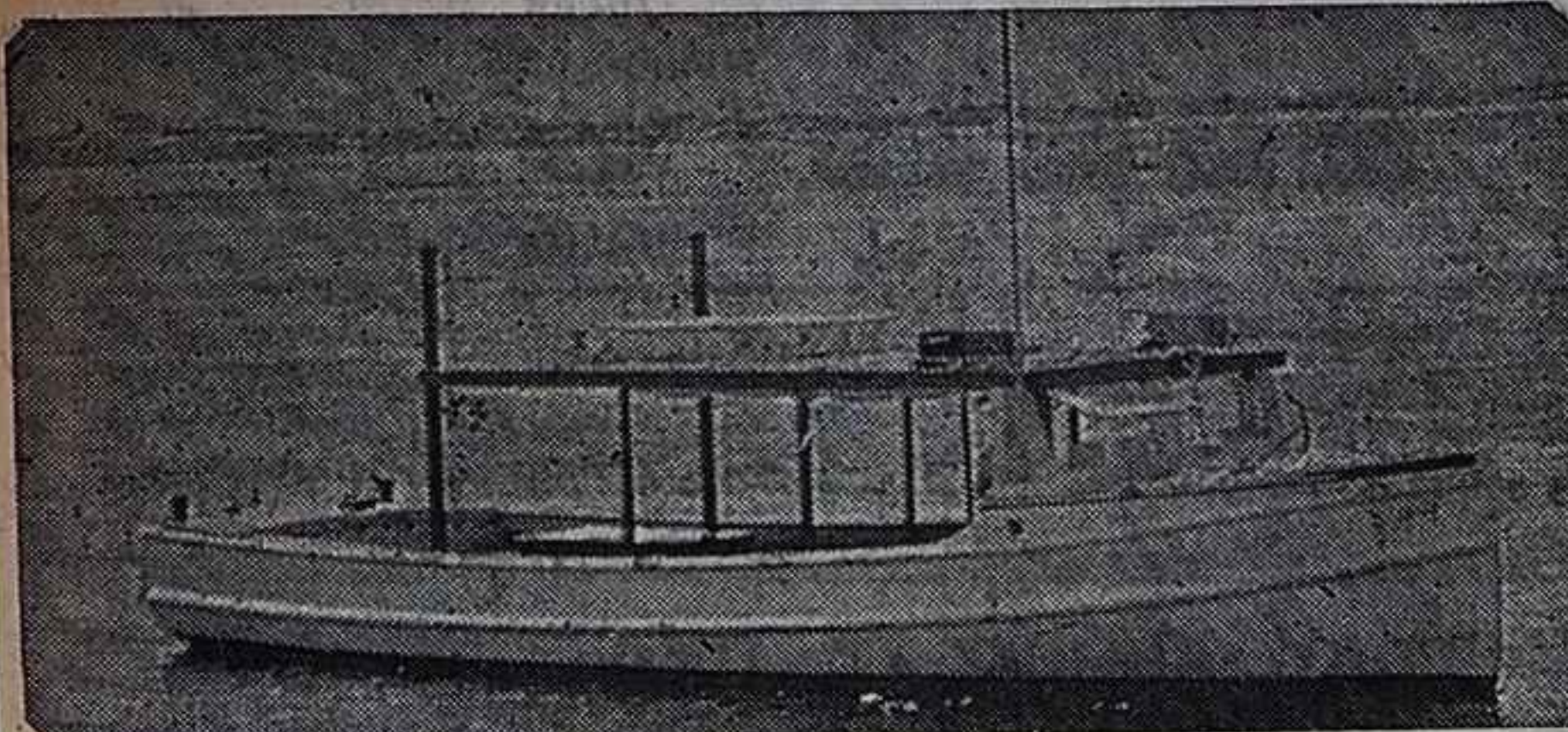

## Rites Wednesday For Beach Hotel Owner

HAMPTON BEACH — John W. Dignon, 58, owner of the Avon Hotel, B street, and life member and director of the Hampton Beach Chamber of Commerce, died Sunday, August 14, at Exeter Hospital.

Mr. Dignon was born in Charlestown, Mass., Nov. 19, 1901, the son of the late John W. and Mary T. (Haley) Dignon. He leaves two brothers, Frank T. of Billerica and George H. of Methuen, Mass., and one sister, Miss Marie Dignon of Billerica, Mass.

A graduate of Burdett college, Boston, Mr. Dignon has been the proprietor of the Avon Hotel for 20 years. He was very active in civic affairs, being a member of the Exeter-Hampton Lodge of Elks, the Hampton Beach Hotel association, Our

Lady of the Miraculous Medal church and its Holy Name Society, and the Knights of Columbus of Lowell, Mass. For many years he served as director of the Hampton Beach Chamber of Commerce and was recently honored with a life membership in that organization.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at 9:30 a.m. from the Sturgis Funeral Home followed by a high mass of requiem at Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal church. Burial was in Foxhill cemetery, Billerica, Mass.

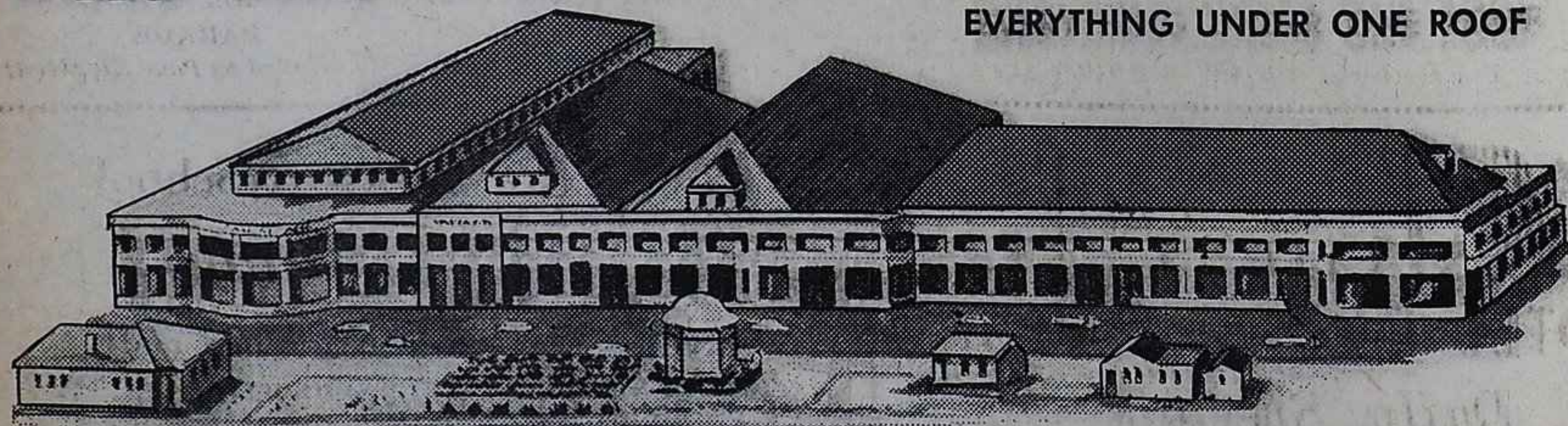

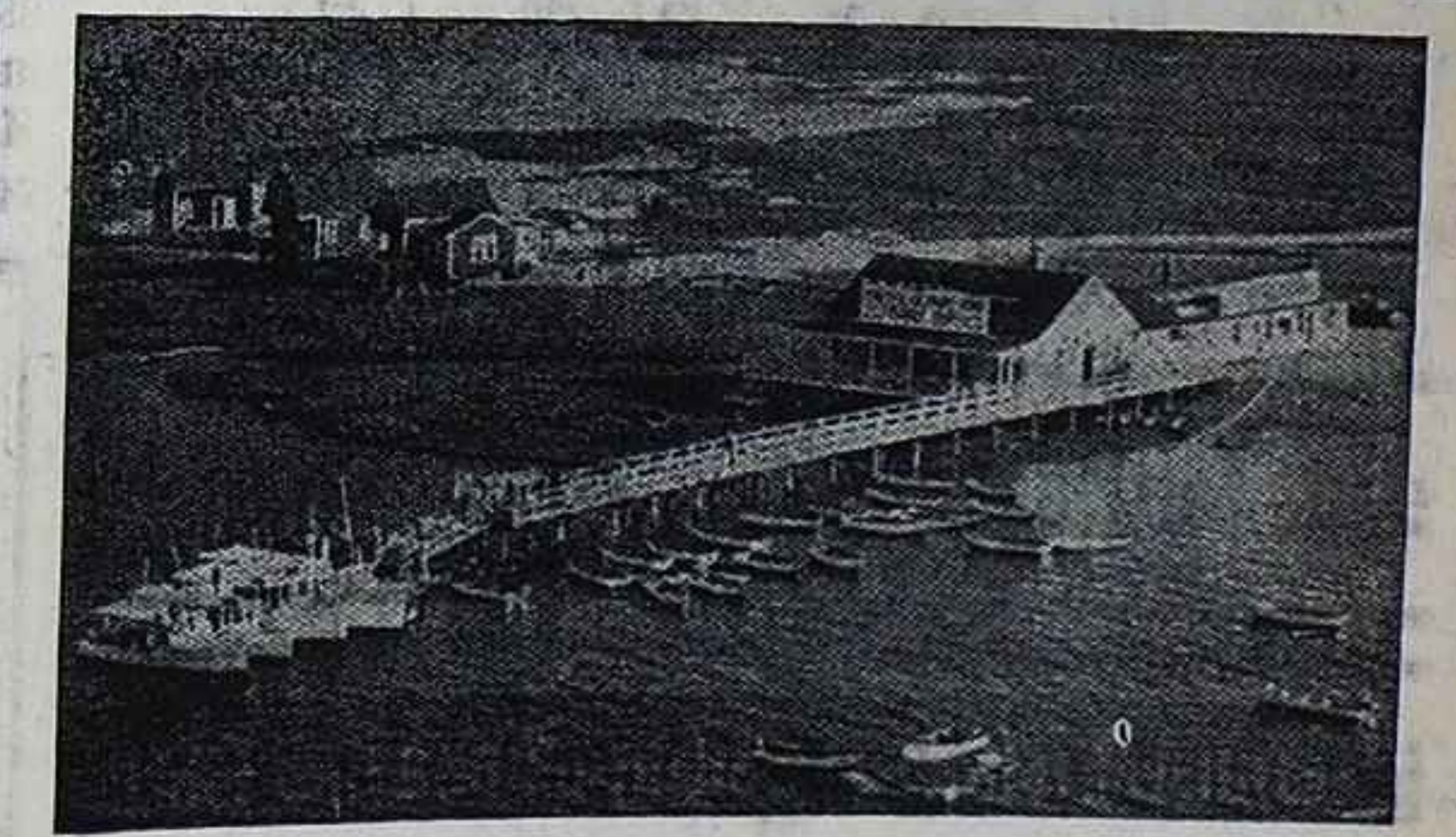

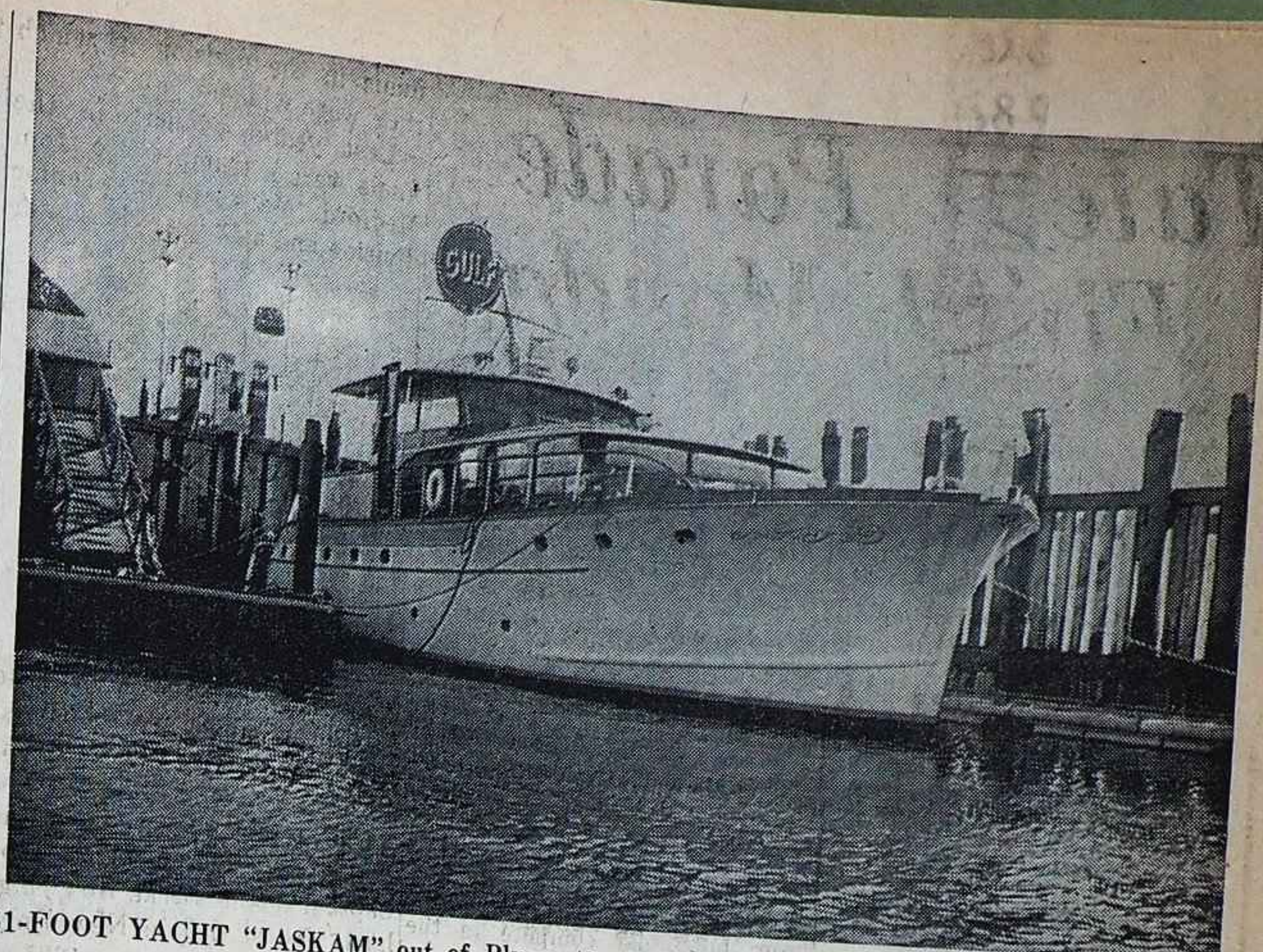

## Blaze Threatens Heart Of Beach

The Hampton fire chief and the deputy state fire marshal are today continuing their investigation of the fire that ripped through five buildings on H street early Sunday morning and damaged two others. Chief Perley R. George stated that he still strongly suspects arson.

Owners of the cottages, dozens of roomers and neighbors were interrogated at the fire station Monday and Wednesday by Deputy State Fire Marshal Herbert L. Whitney of Peterborough and Chief George, who are being assisted by Hampton Police Chief John A. Roden. Meanwhile the Red Cross

completed assistance to 10 individuals who were in need of food, clothing and maintenance as a result of the blaze. Many others received immediate aid from friends and still others, vacationing here, returned to their homes after the fire.

No estimate of personal property loss was available, but Chief George said after interviews with the owners of the destroyed buildings that property damage was estimated at \$55,000. The three properties burned out on the south side of the street were roped off Monday as danger areas, while owners of the two burned cottages on the north side of the street boarded up the doors and windows of their charred houses. All five of these buildings were declared a total loss.

The Pigmy cottage and the Sunset motel also reported fire damage. Several neighboring cottages reported damage to furnishings from the intense heat and from smoke, but no significant fire damage.

The fire started about 2 a.m. at the rear of the Fireside, a three-story rooming house owned by Mr. and Mrs. Harold McCurdy, owners of the Tides hotel, and leased for the season by James Malone, Chelsea, Mass., and James Greene, Dover. Within 30 minutes the building was completely enveloped in flames and the blaze spread to the adjoining cottage, the Roberta, owned by Mrs. Anna Burton of Hampton.

As the Fireside fell, burning embers were carried by the breeze igniting a third cottage on that side of the street and two on the opposite side of the street. They were the Duncan cottage, owned by Mrs. Mable

Swett of Haverhill, Mass.; the Carroll cottage, owned by Mrs. Anna C. Carroll of Allston, Mass.; and the Dinsmore cottage, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Mark C. Batchelder of Braintree, Mass.

The fire was first discovered by Miss Paula Plante, 17, of Providence, R. I., a roomer at the Fireside who is employed at the beach. She told investigators she returned to her room about 2 a.m. and saw flames leaping from a barrel up the back of the house. She aroused all residents of the house, who with neighbors formed a bucket brigade in an effort to put out the blaze.

Another witness told investigators that a fire extinguisher failed to operate because it had been "used" at a party the previous week.

An unidentified person attempted to telephone the fire department about 2:10, but dialed one wrong digit and reached the home of Gov. Wesley Powell in Hampton Falls. The governor in turn called the fire company and reported the blaze. Somewhere in the chain of communication the H street location was misunderstood as Eighth street, and the fire trucks were more than a mile up Ocean boulevard toward the North Beach before they were diverted by radio. An alarm from H street came in just after the trucks pulled out.

The blaze was brought under control within an hour with assistance from North Hampton, Seabrook, Salisbury, Amesbury and Newburyport fire departments. Amesbury and Newburyport came without being called, Chief George said. Five firemen were either overcome by smoke or suffered in-

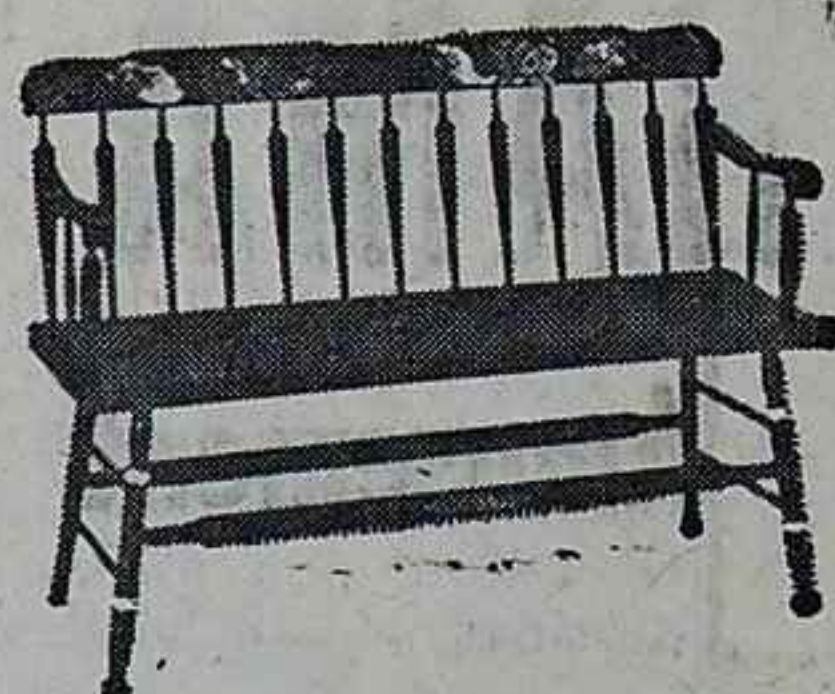

The girls were the first of three bicycle groups, organized by the American Youth Hostel of New York, to stop here on their 750-mile pedalling jaunt through New England.

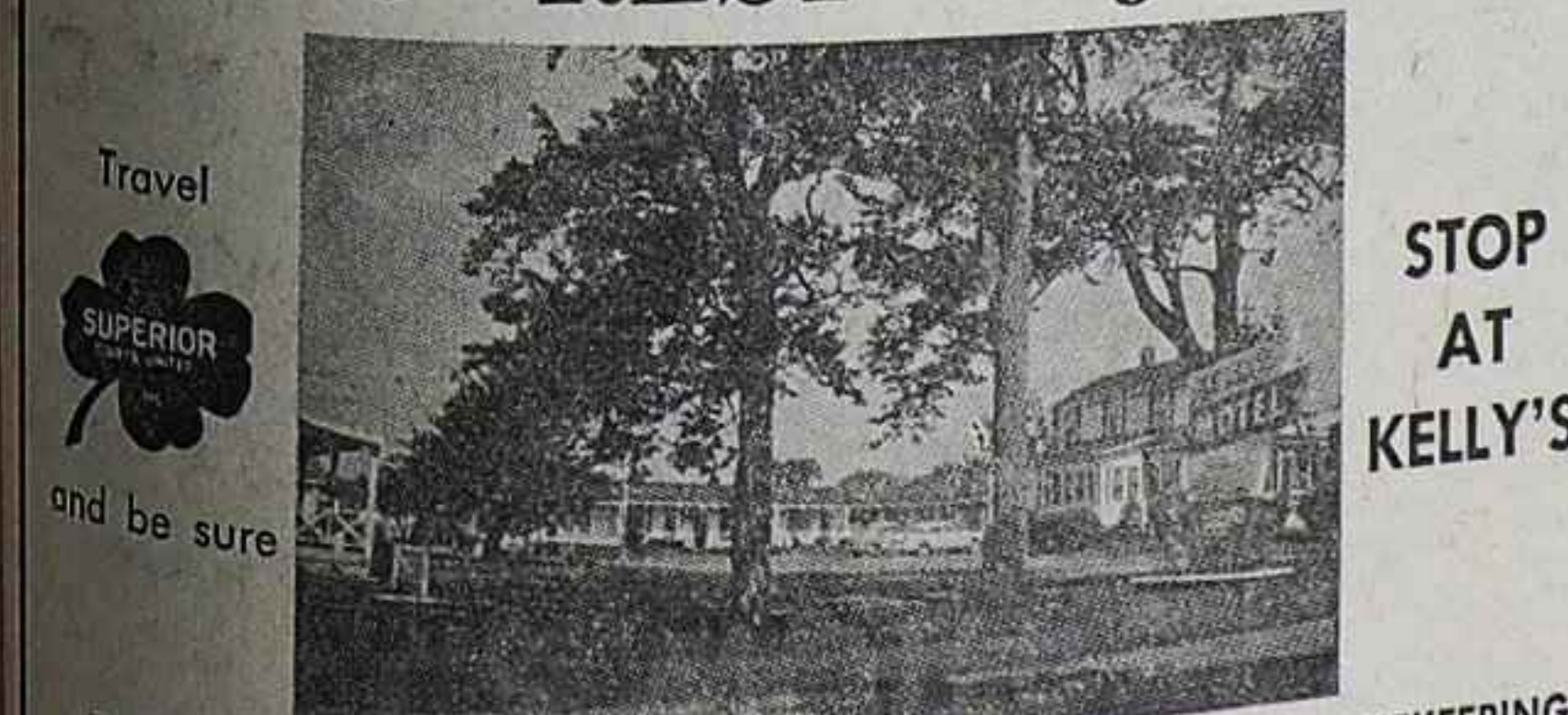
The girls stopped for one night at the Tropical Inn before continuing to Cape Ann and Gloucester and finally to their destination — Boston. They

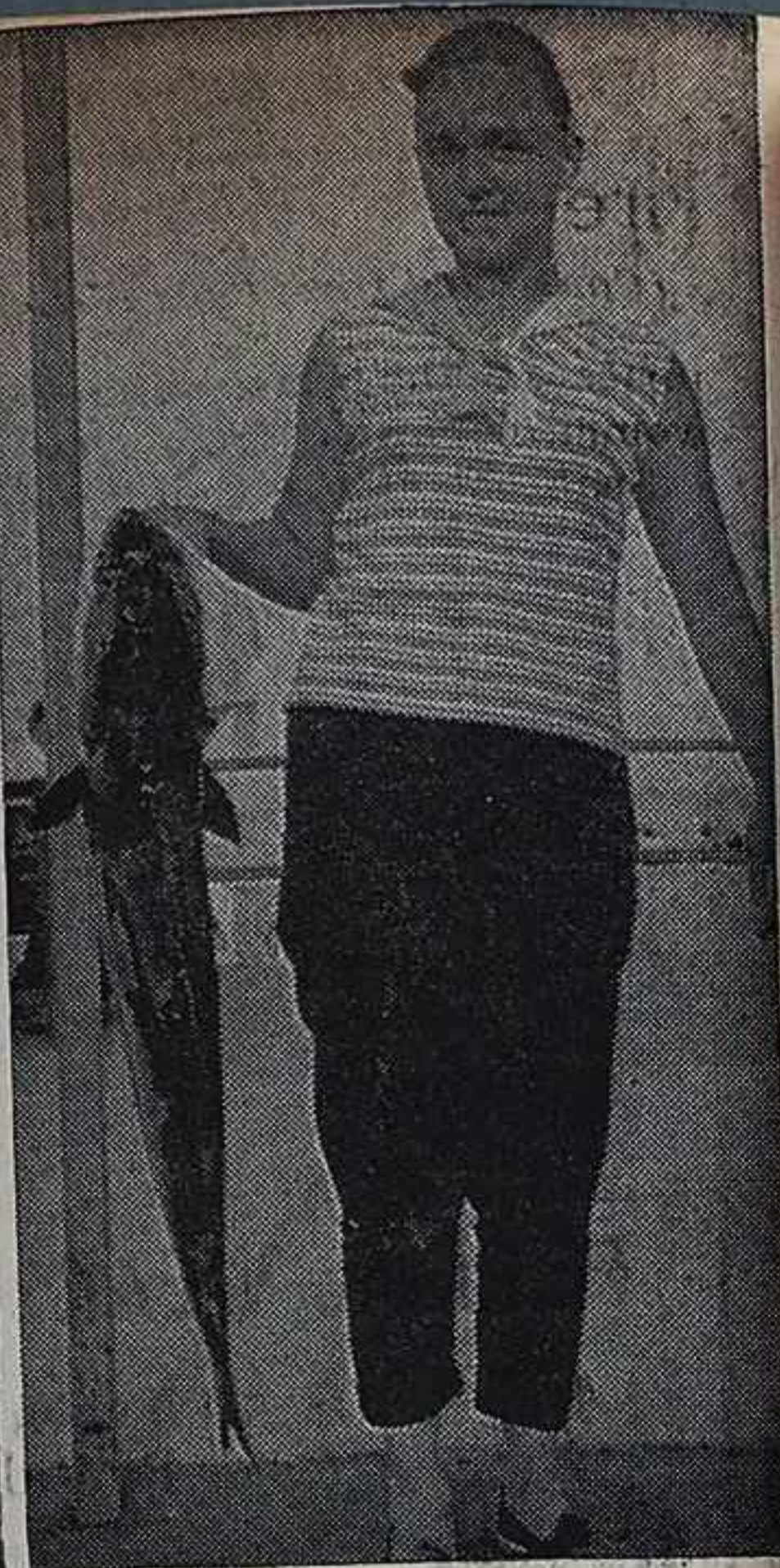

injuries in the blaze, and three women collapsed from shock.

Seabrook Fire Chief Henry Kendrick fell through the roof of the Carroll cottage and suffered burns to his face and hands. He was treated at the fire station, three blocks away, by Dr. Roger N. Blake and returned to the scene.

Also treated for burns were Earl Blatchford, William Stickney Sr., and George Goodwin, Hampton firemen. Stickney drove himself to Exeter Hospi-

tal while the others received first aid at the fire station and returned to the scene. Herbert A. Trofatter Sr. was overcome with smoke, but was revived at the scene.

Mrs. Harriet McCurdy, owner of the Fireside, collapsed and was taken to Anna Jaques hospital in Newburyport, where she is still a patient. Mrs. Margaret Walker of Dorchester, Mass., and Mrs. Margaret LeBlanc of Exeter were both taken to Exeter hospital for treatment and discharged later Sunday.

Thousands of vacationists flocked to the H street area during the fire, but were held back by police. Fire Chief George praised the work of Police Chief Roden and the officers who stayed on the scene 14 and 18 hours to control spectators and the heavy influx of traffic Sunday. Chief George said firemen were at no time hampered in their work by the crowds. He also pointed out that many vacationists volunteered their services in handling hose and in moving parked cars from the fire area.

There was no accurate count of the number of people who had to flee the fire-swept buildings, but 21 fire homeless reported to the police station, where police, Red Cross workers and hotel owners cooperated to find accommodations for them. A number of the homeless were given shelter at the Tropical Inn, F street, the Hollingworth hotel, B street, and the Westfield rooms, Nudd avenue.

Roy W. Gillmore, disaster chairman for the Hampton branch of Red Cross, Mrs. Edwin L. Batchelder, Hampton Red Cross chairman, and Douglas E. Hunter, Hampton Civil Defense director, were instrumental in quickly finding temporary housing for the fire victims, and providing needed attention. Mrs. S. Richard Strand, execu-

utive secretary of the Exeter District chapter, and Mrs. Aiva Johnson of Manchester, national staff member of Red Cross, set up temporary headquarters at the Chamber of Commerce office this week to conduct interviews with fire victims and offer aid.

Later Sunday morning, at the request of Chief Roden, Gov. Powell called out National Guardsmen from the Headquarters Detachment of the 197th Field Artillery Battalion, Portsmouth, to relieve Hampton police from guard duty at the danger area. Guard was dropped

Sunday night when the area was roped off.

Chief George noted that the fire was the first major conflagration at Hampton Beach since the Dudley block and many other buildings in the C street area burned down, July 6, 1950.

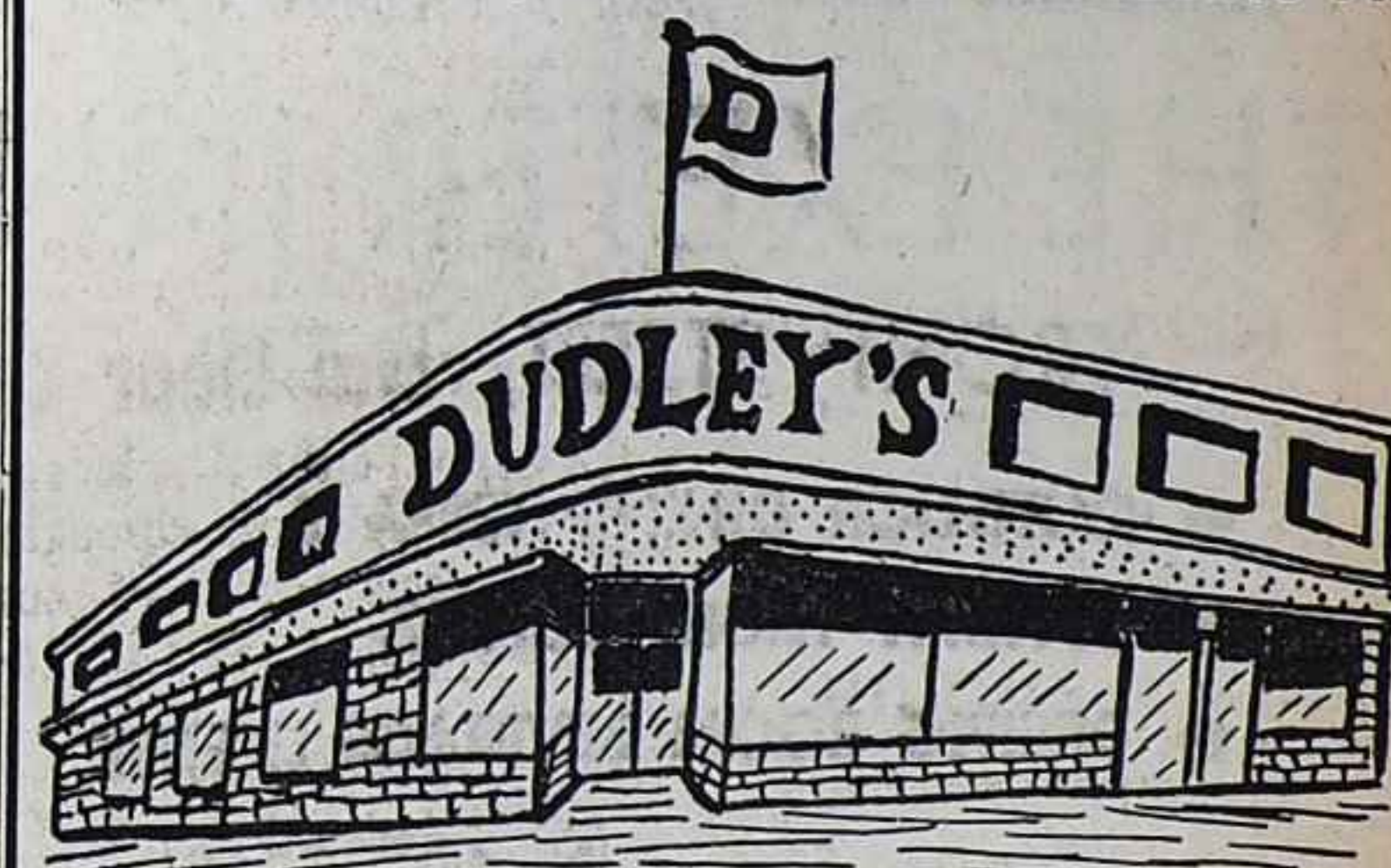

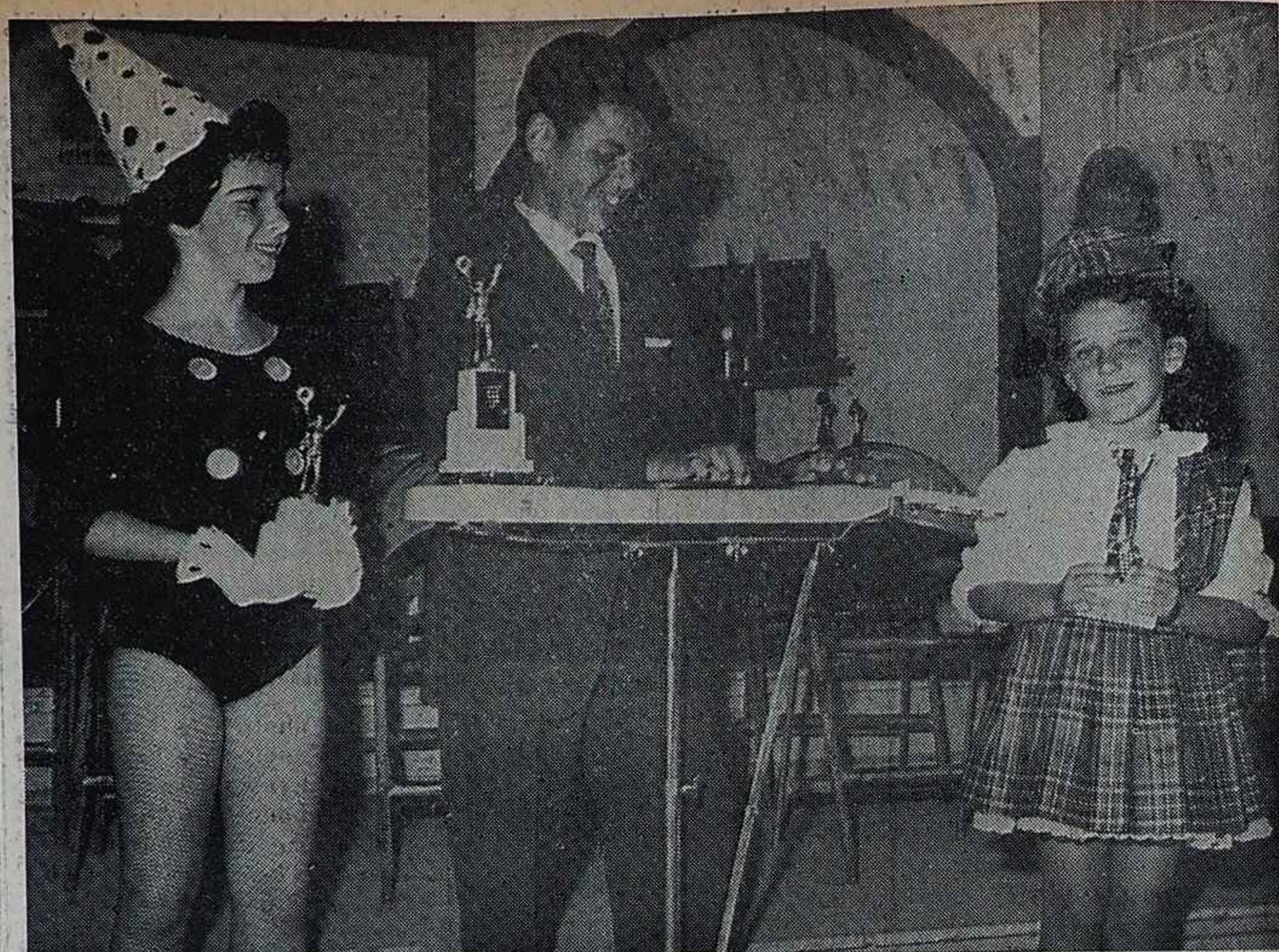

## Hampton CG Unit Assists In Air Force Jump Tests At Sea

The Hampton Beach Coast Guard unit assisted Tuesday in Air Force test parachute jumps by four men into the ocean near the Isles of Shoals.

Operating the local station's 30-foot utility boat, BM/C Frank A. Christoph, station chief, and SA Andre Lambert picked up the last of the four jumpers, Senior W/O Edward

J. Murray of Paterson, N.J. The first three jumpers were picked from the water by the 40 footer from the Merrimac CG station, while the Portsmouth CG boat stood by with official Air Force and Coast Guard observers.

The jumps were made as part of a program to test pressure and survival suits for F-106 jet fighter pilots. The gear weighed 75 and 90 pounds.

Other Air Force jumpers were: CWO Ed Rice of Seattle, Wash.; and Capt. Jon T. Matsuo of Honolulu. The Army man was Capt. Jack F. Angel of Purcell, Okla. The latter, ordinarily assigned to the Army Quartermaster Research and Engineering Division at Natick, Mass., is currently on temporary duty at Lake Patterson.

Matsuo and Angel jumped from about 5,000 feet and delayed about five seconds before opening their chutes. Rice and Murray bailed out from approximately 10,000 feet and delayed about 25 seconds.

The men jumped from the aircraft one at a time. The second did not jump until the first man had been picked up by one of the three Coast Guard boats assigned to the drop area and not until the surface craft had resumed their original positions.

Four more jumps scheduled Wednesday, but were postponed due to rain. The second test was rescheduled to today, weather permitting.

When the tests are completed each member of the team will make a report on the survival equipment they tested.

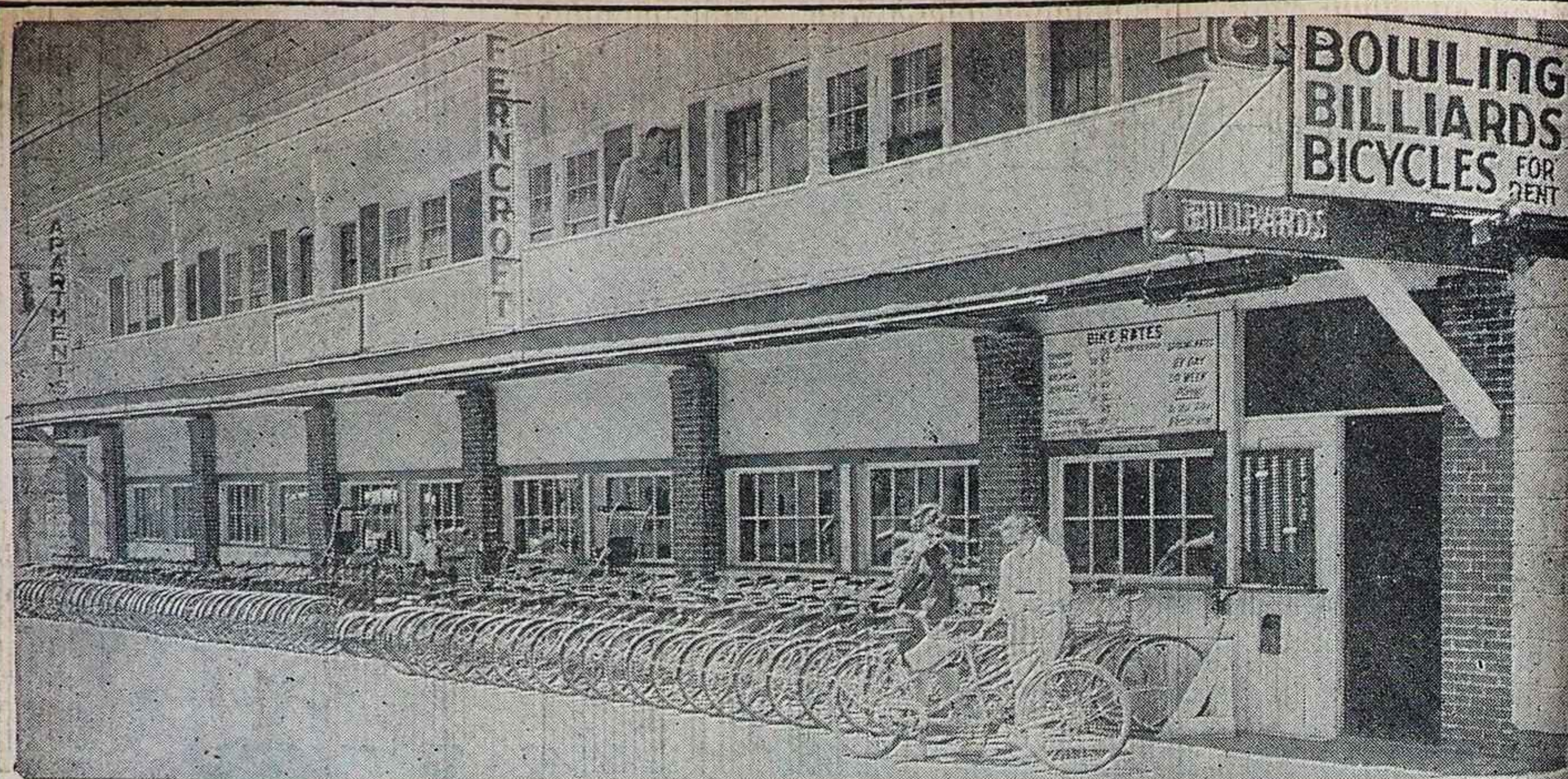

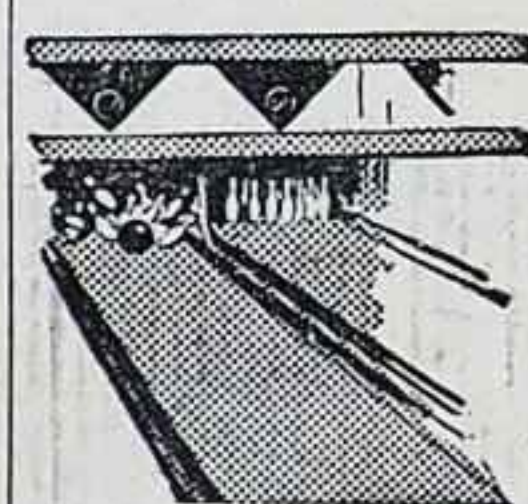

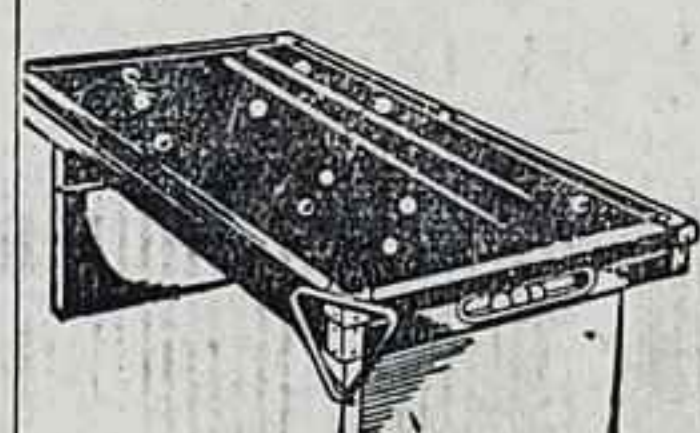
