Governor Wesley Powell has proclaimed July 2 through July 8 as Boat Safety week in the state of New Hampshire. # Route Across Marshes Planned

Governor Wesley Powell recently announced that he and his Executive Council hope to reach a decision July 3rd on the location of the long awaited road from the Exeter by-pass to the beach.


Throughout the winter and spring months, plans for the proposed expressway have continued in the planning stages. Following an expression of opinion of the voters of Hampton and Hampton Beach during the spring, stating that they were not in favor of a northern route as proposed by the State Highway department, new plans were formulated for a so-called southern route by Commissioner John Morton and his department.

On June 9, a capacity crowd of more than 200 persons filled the Marston school, Hampton, to overflowing to take part in a public hearing on the revised southern route.

Governor Wesley Powell, as he had previously promised the citizens of the area, personally conducted the hearing. All the members of the Executive Council were in attendance.

The governor, in his opening remarks, stated that if the present lay-out was accepted that work on the northerly or Exeter end would undoubtedly begin late this summer and work on ROUTE
