Heavy Fog Along Seacoast Keeps Coast Guard Busy

The heavy fog which enveloped the entire seaboard over the past weekend kept the men of the Hampton Coast Guard busier than usual. The fog trapped boats at sea and hampered search for the disabled vessels. A report of a 16-foot skiff with two persons aboard being overdue started the Coast Guard. The local Coast Guard cutter was sent to search for the craft which was two hours overdue. While on routine search the Coast Guard found the Lady Mar II, with three persons on board, disabled southeast of Hampton. The 18-foot cabin cruiser, operated by Eugene Carter of Woburn, Mass., was taken in tow to Hampton harbor. The Coast Guard cutter returned to sea to continue the search for the overdue skiff. However the search was again interrupted when the 26 foot cruiser, Dee-Art, was found lost at sea in the fog. Upon towing the Dee-Art to shore, the Coast Guard learned that the missing skiff had turned up safely at Seabrook. Still another call took the Coast Guard cutter to Hampton Beach where Robert Silver of North Shore boulevard reported sighting an object, which appeared to be a mine, floating towards shore. The Coast Guard, however, found it to be a deep sea fishing troll buoy. They took this to Hampton Beach. Mrs. Oscar Page of Fremont reported that the cruiser Jean Marie with her husband aboard was four hours overdue from a trip to the Isles of Shoals. The cruiser was eventually found and escorted to the Hampton pier.

On Saturday, the Hampton Coast Guard was sent two and one half miles out to sea in response to an urgent radio message from the Anne Josephine, a party fishing boat. Elizabeth Laugon of Williamstown, Mass. had become ill and requested help. She was transferred to the cutter and brought ashore at State pier. The fire department was called and responded with the rescuator. However, the Coast Guard reported that when she reached dry land, the woman refused medical assistance. She told them she would see her own physician.

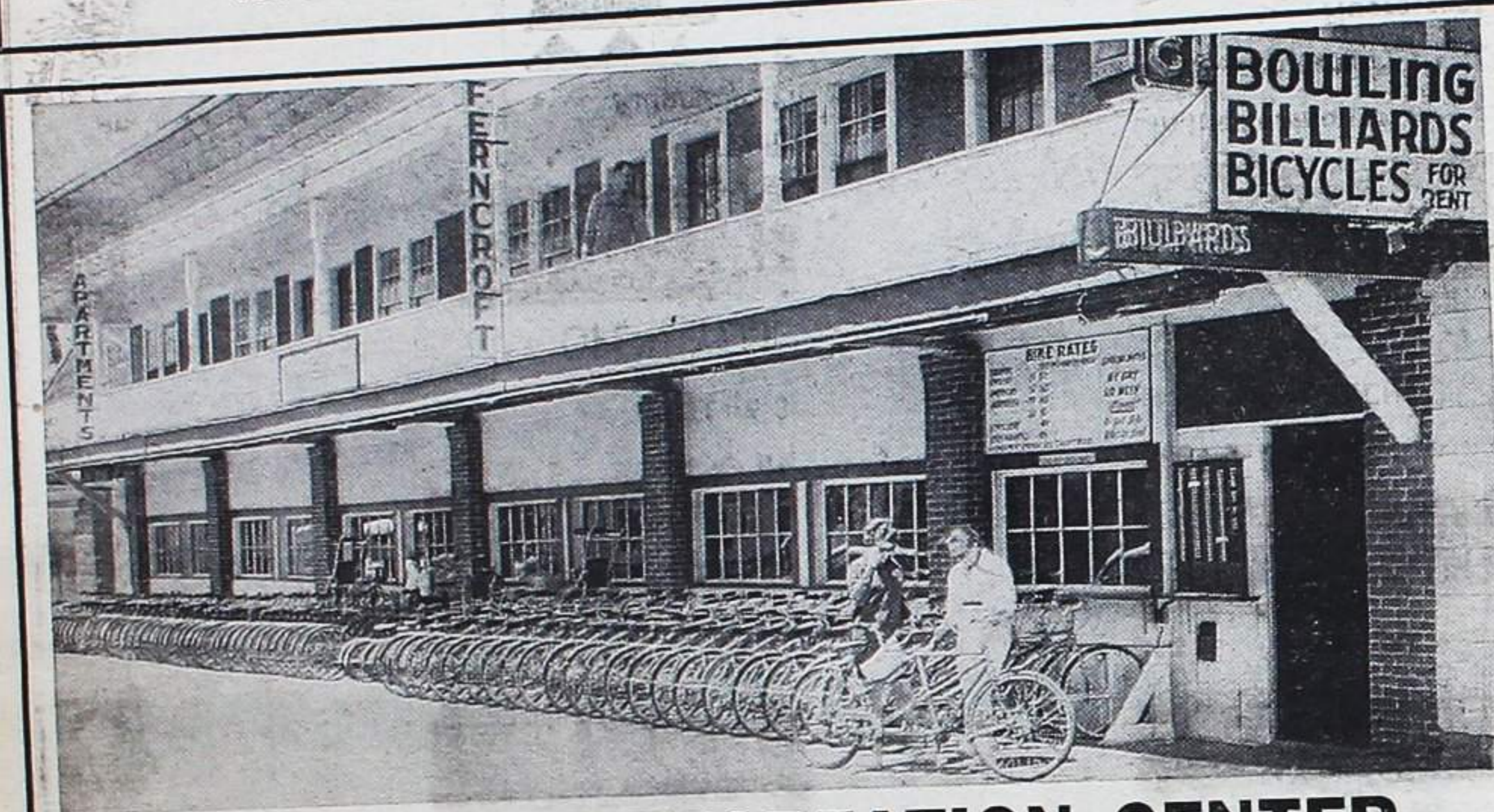

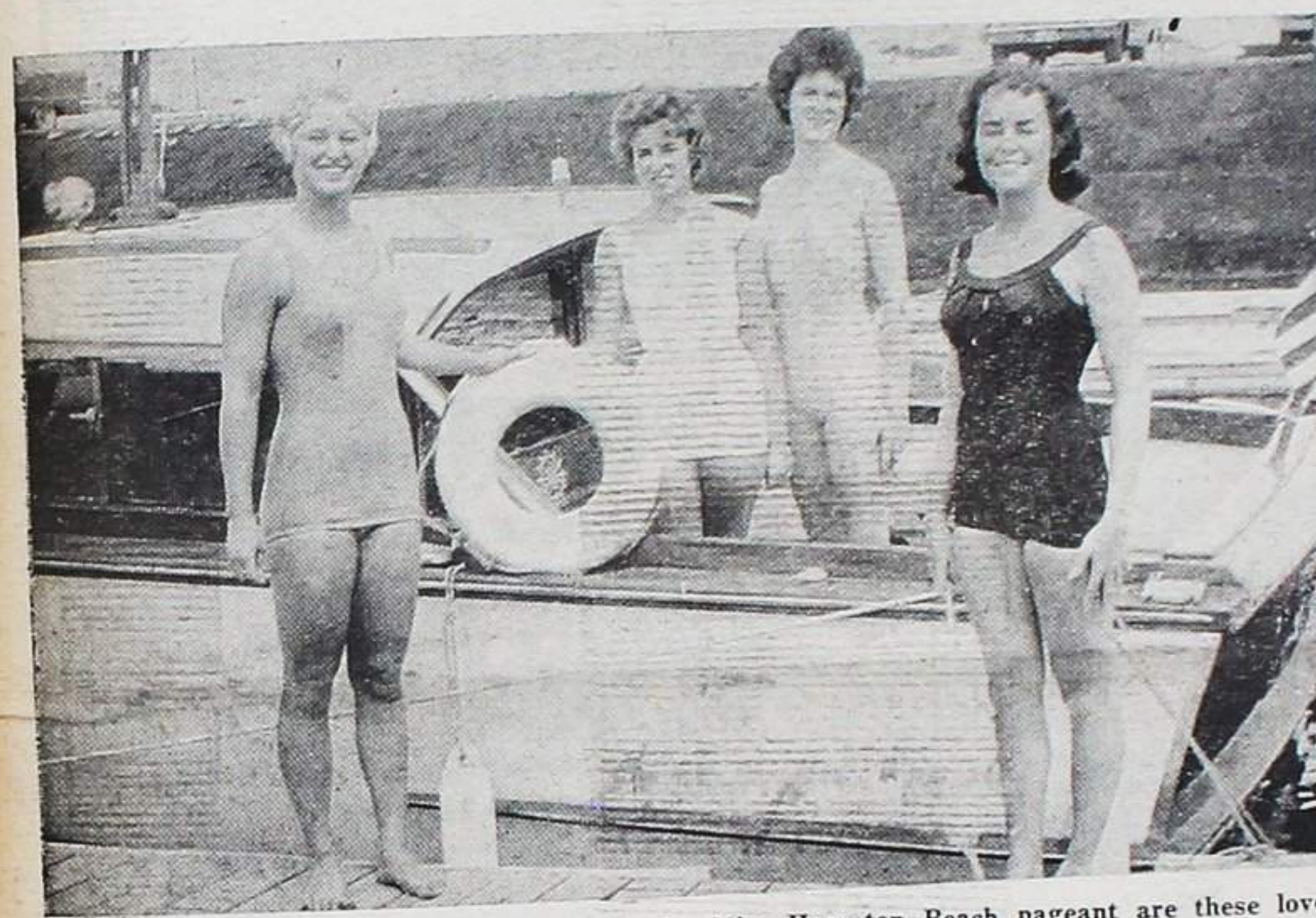

"Suzie Wong" Story
Is Poignant, Racy

Have a struggling, young Canadian artist rent a room in a Hong Kong brothel and then permit him to fall in love with one of the Oriental "ladies-of-the-evening" and you have yourself a problem — you, also, have "The World of Suzie Wong" which is currently playing at the Hampton Playhouse. "Suzie Wong" is amusing and poignant at the same time. The frank and open dialogue and action of the activities that take place in a brothel provides an entertaining diversion from the touching story of the unusual love affair. The disturbing feature is that Paul Osborn — as he portrays all the prostitutes as having "hearts of gold" and being basically good girls. Some day a writer will portray the most ancient of professions in its true color and he will have a real story to tell.

Juleen Compton creates a charming, petulant and sensitive "Suzie" and is complemented with a strong performance from Ian Sullivan, as the "in-residence" artist. Although the artist does a constant burn over Suzie's professional activities, he resists the steady pressure that Suzie exerts in his direction.

The "work" that Suzie does is the barrier. Oddly, the author at no time brings in the difference in color as a problem. Through the entire relationship no mention is ever made of consequences of a white and yellow marriage. This important adjustment is completely ignored. And, further, the "gollyana" ending is hardly in keeping with the virile potential of the story. As a serious drama on a sordid subject, the play is painfully feeble.

However, as an entertaining management of a sexy plot, the play pulls no punches and has many worthy scenes. Topsy in this department is the drunk scene hilariously played by Joel Thomas, as Ben. It is a gem of good acting! Also, Mary Mon Toy strengthens the cast considerably as Minnie Ho. Her singing voice is not powerful but very sweet in her solo.

Peter Bosche, as Ah Tong, plays a strong supporting role that added much to the balance of the cast. Also, Katherine Helmond was most convincing as the British art critic — attractive and unattached — but she failed to convince the artist that sharing a life with a Chinese prostitute was not the right path for a successful career in art.

From a production point of view, Robert Green's stage settings proved most effective and the technical difficulties of a revolving stage and rapid changes of scenery did not materialize. On opening night — the nightmare of all companies — the operation was smooth and the results pleasing.

The lines and situations of "Suzie Wong" are racy — and at times border on the crude — so this is not a production for children. Since the entire action takes place in a brothel, it is not difficult to imagine that the play lends itself to a quantity of sexy material, complete with drunken sailors, so leave the youngsters home with the TV when you come to see "Suzie Wong". —hlp

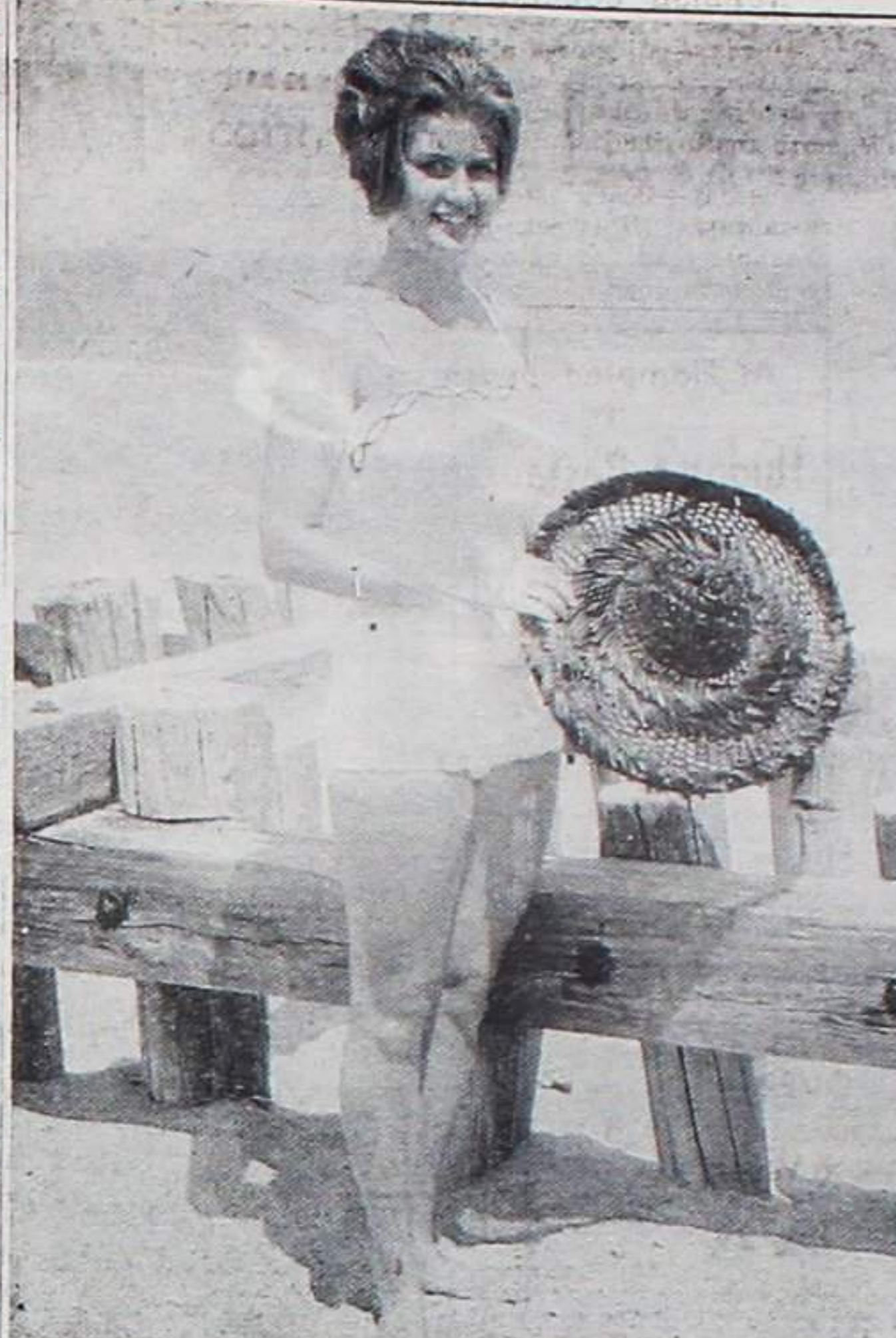

by two flashlight batteries and a B battery. It contains five tubes.

The detector may be worked either by leaving the sound on or by turning the sound off. Jackie stated that she leaves the sound on and by using the ear phones, she can hear the sound stop when metal is detected. This is by far the more accurate method, according to her.

Mrs. Hussey may be seen by early risers, almost daily, on the beach between the police station and C street. Her working hours are from 6 to 7:30 a.m. After the beach season is over, she will join with a few other part-time beachcombers in the area and work a half a day at a time.

She has found, among other things, watches, rings, bracelets, birthstones, coins, earrings, pearls and emeralds. She averages three to five dollars a day and has found as much as seven dollars in one day's work.

Her biggest thrill is helping persons find things of sentimental value. Because of the fact that her services were so much in demand, she now does this for hire whenever her time permits.

One of her greatest satisfactions was the finding of a diamond ring in the sand at North Beach last summer. The lady who had lost the ring returned to the grateful owner.

Jackie, at present, has a beautiful 1962 girl's class ring which she believes belongs to a Lawrence High school graduating student. The girl may have the ring by contacting Jackie and identifying it by giving the proper initials engraved on the inside.

The metal detector which she uses weighs about eight pounds, but Jackie says it becomes very heavy at times. The machine will detect a half dollar up to 12 inches deep and a small dime or similar object as deep as three inches.

Beachcombing after a storm is a particular challenge because the sand is usually well washed and turned over. The salt water leaves the coins a deep black color.

Jackie graduated from Hampton Academy and High school and is at present associated with her mother in operating Kimball's Real Estate, I street, Hampton Beach. She, her son Sandy, and husband, Charles, live at the beach year round.

Green gulls were turned loose on the Massachusetts North Shore, brown gulls in Maine, yellow-orange gulls in Boston harbor, blue gulls on Cape Cod and Rhode Island and black gulls on Martha's Vineyard, Elizabeth Island and some areas of Connecticut.

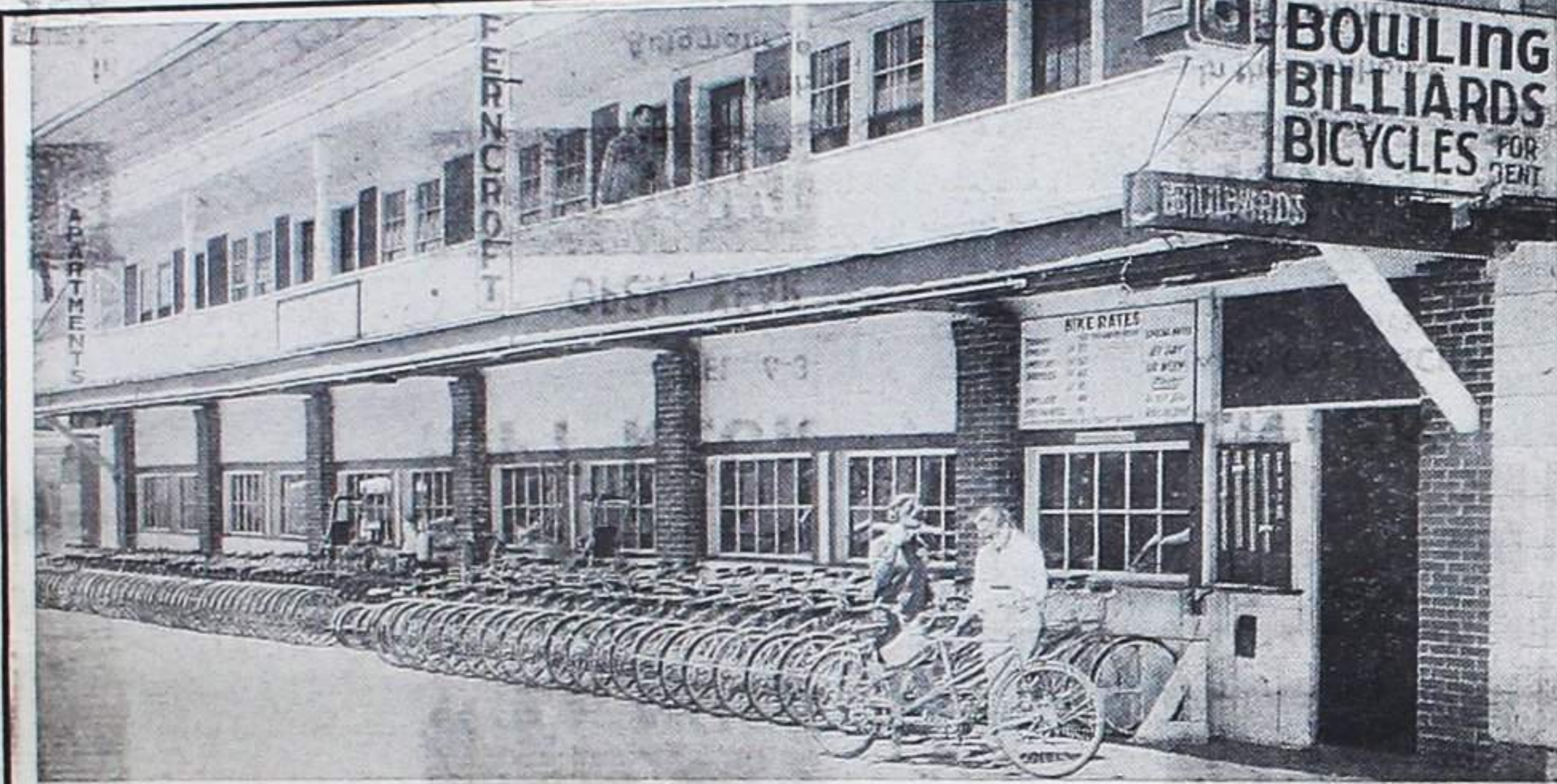

N. H. Girl Wins Beauty Title

The new queen, who was prominent in the beauty pageants at the beach last year, received plaudits from the crowd each time she appeared on stage Tuesday evening, wearing a shining gold bathing suit which enhanced her 35-21-35 measurements. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Nicholas Kay of Main street, Plaistow, and was graduated from high school this year. She plans to attend Chandler's School for Women in Boston this fall.
