# 200 Air Force Cadets Relax At Beach


The 817th Air Division, Pease Air Force Base, was host to some 300 Air Force Academy cadets from Colorado Springs, Class of 1964, for five days this past week.

Of the 42 entrants originally signed up, 35 appeared for the contest, eight of whom were eliminated in the first round of judging.
