
The Junior King and Queen, John McLean and Ellen MacGrady, and their court were presented.

A total of 1306 applications have been sifted to 1112, some 240 of which will arrive after opening day from Brandywine and Monticello.

Of 192 trainers who applied for stalls at the Fall meeting, 169 have received assignments either on the grounds or at nearby farms.

Horses will start arriving on Tuesday, September 5.
