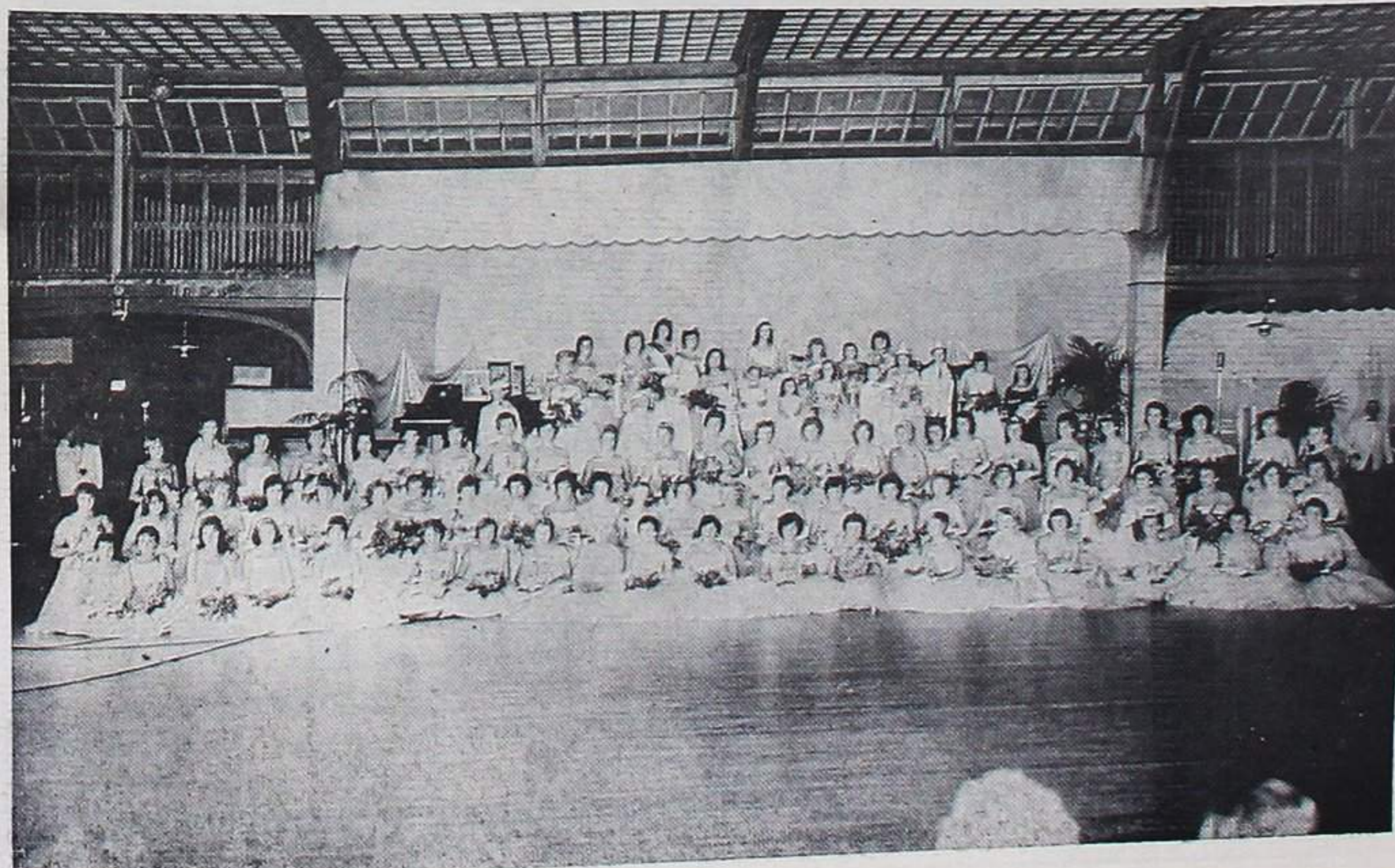

Beach C of C Head Has Busy Schedule

The central agency for community development of business, industry, the professions and all civic interests, doing jobs that no individual can do alone, is the Chamber of Commerce.

Heading the Hampton Beach Chamber of Commerce as its president this year is one of the pioneers of the hotel and restaurant business at Hampton Beach, Ralph Moulton.

Back in 1906, Ralph Moulton came to Hampton Beach from Haverhill, Mass. looking for work. He found employment at Joe Leavitt's hotel and continued to work there for 13 years.

Ralph noted that the Moulton family is no stranger to Hampton as descendants of Ralph had lived in Hampton for many years. A large boulder is located at Tuck Memorial park in memory of the Moulton family. For many years, Ralph's uncle John drove a stagecoach from the Whittier Hotel to Haverhill.

Ralph later went to work at the Janvirin Hotel near the center of the beach and after a short time he bought the hotel and set out on what eventually

proved to be a very successful business career. His first move was to rename the hotel to the Moulton, a name which has been famous at the beach for many years. He remained in business at the Moulton through two fires and the depression, rebuilding each time when necessary.

In 1944, during the "black out" days of World War II, he bought the Ashworth Hotel. Not finding enough work to keep him busy during the winter months, Ralph purchased the Pennsylvania Hotel restaurant business at St. Petersburg, Florida. He also bought and ran the Royston and Moulton Hotel's at St. Petersburg. For several years he ran all five establishments simultaneously until his retirement in 1956.

Ralph has been a director of the Chamber of Commerce at Hampton Beach for more than 35 years. This year, his fellow members honored him by electing him president of the Chamber. So enthused was Ralph with the new job that he and his wife, Gertrude, returned from their Florida vacation a month earlier than usual to do all they could in promoting and helping Hampton Beach this year. Ralph said that he intended to hold the presidency for only one year and that he would give it all he had.

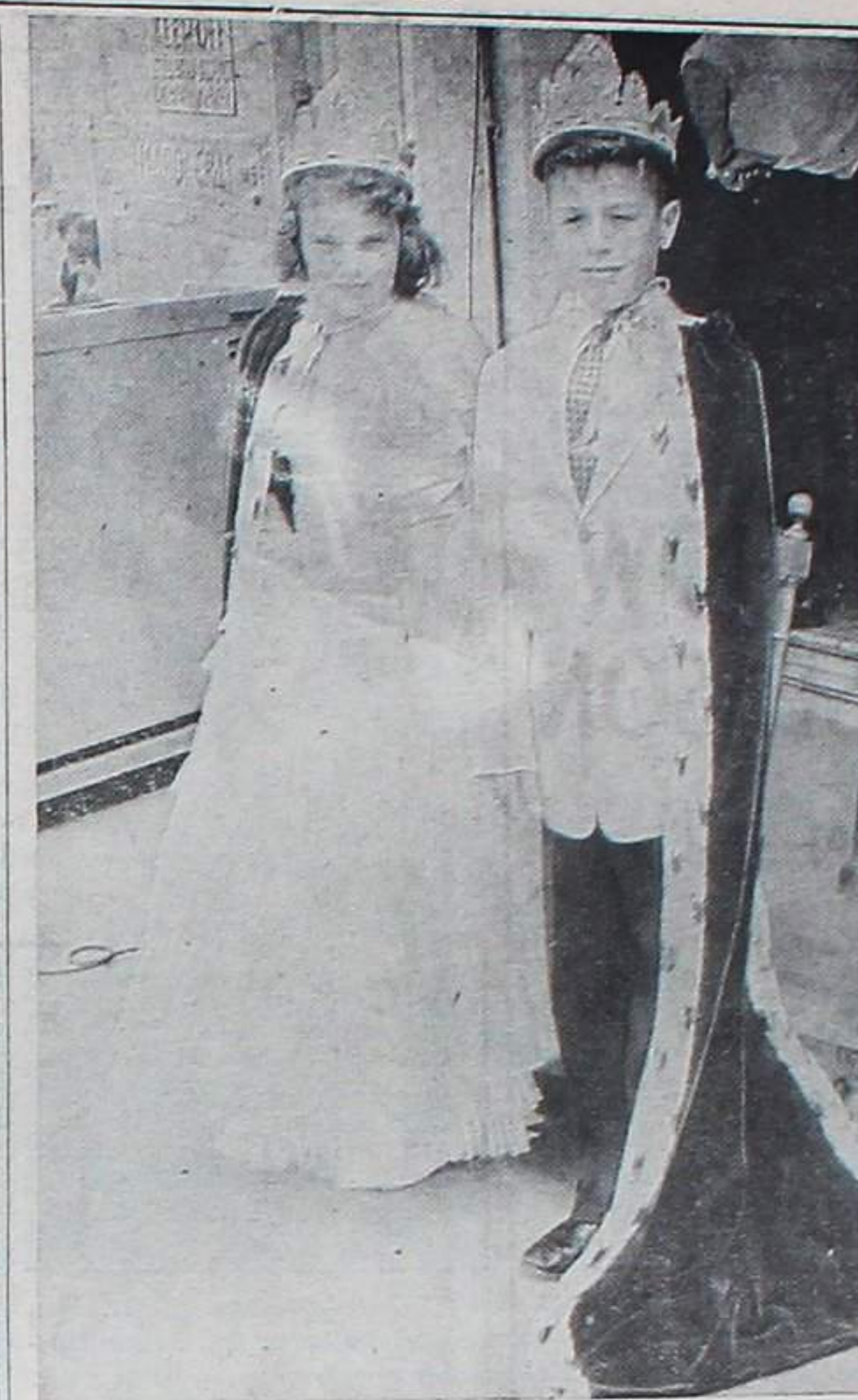

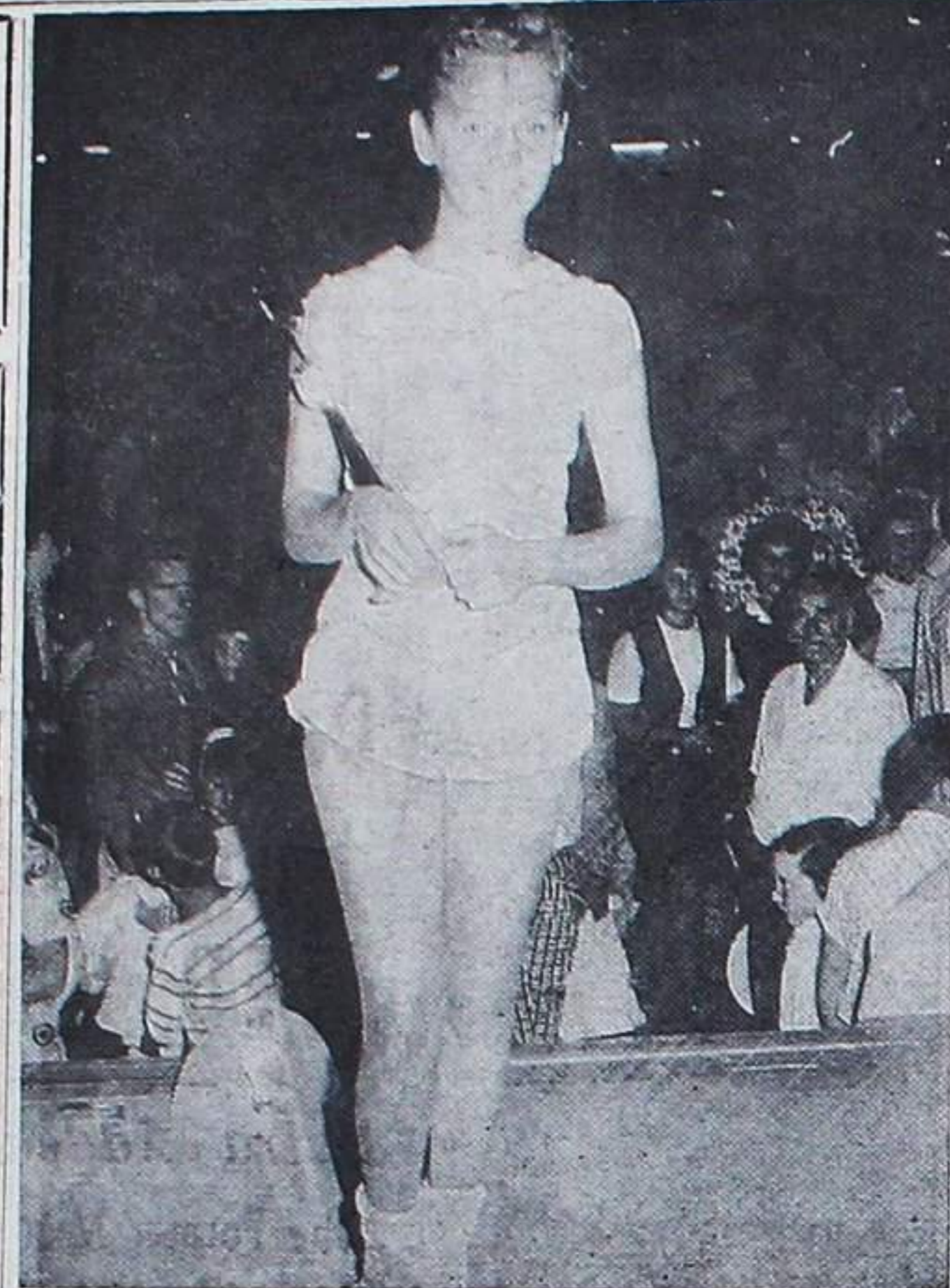

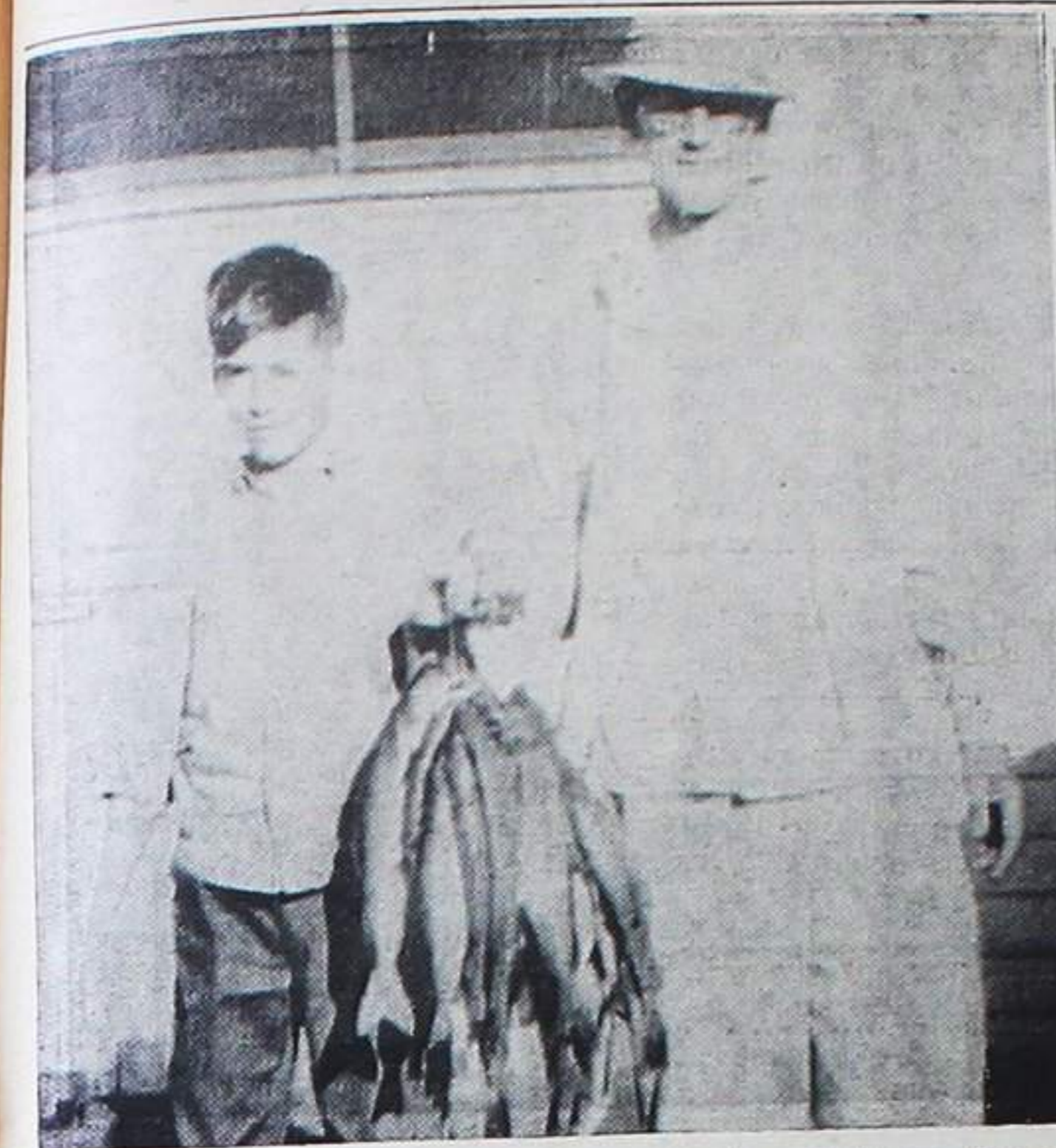

Clam digging licenses may be purchased by residents for a fee of \$2. This entitles the licensee to take one peck of clams per day.

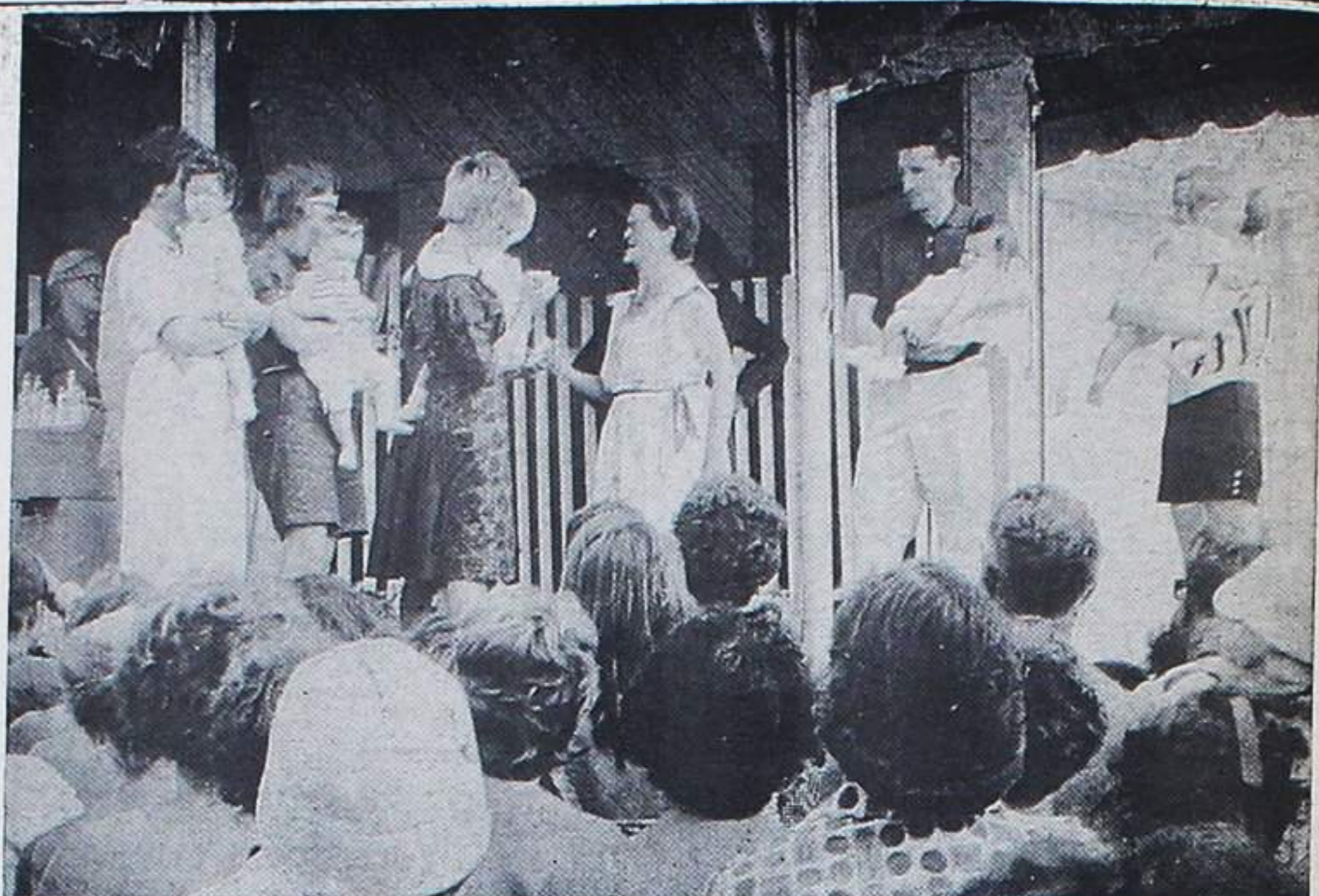

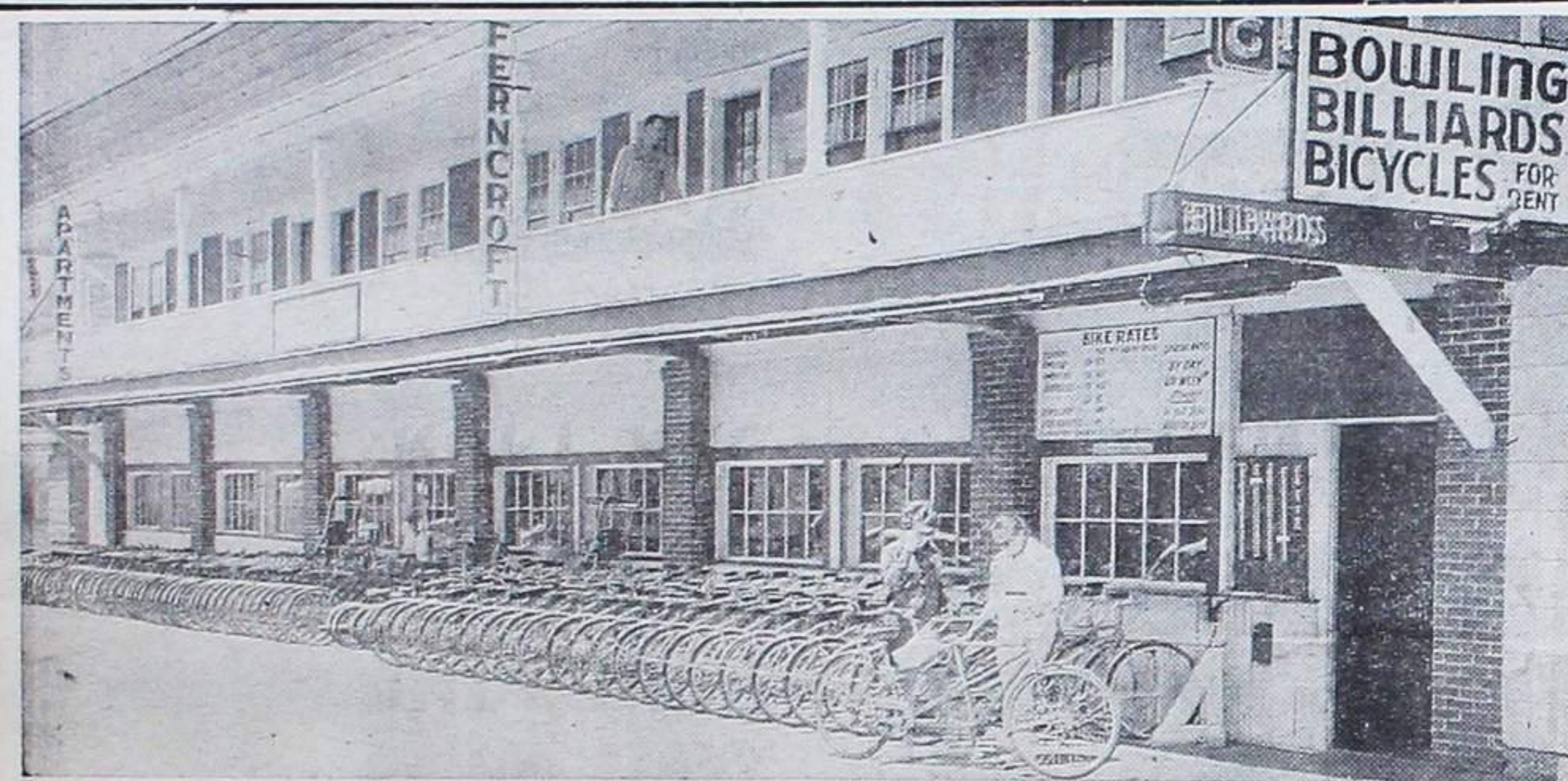
