Gala Program Planned For 31st Annual Carnival Week

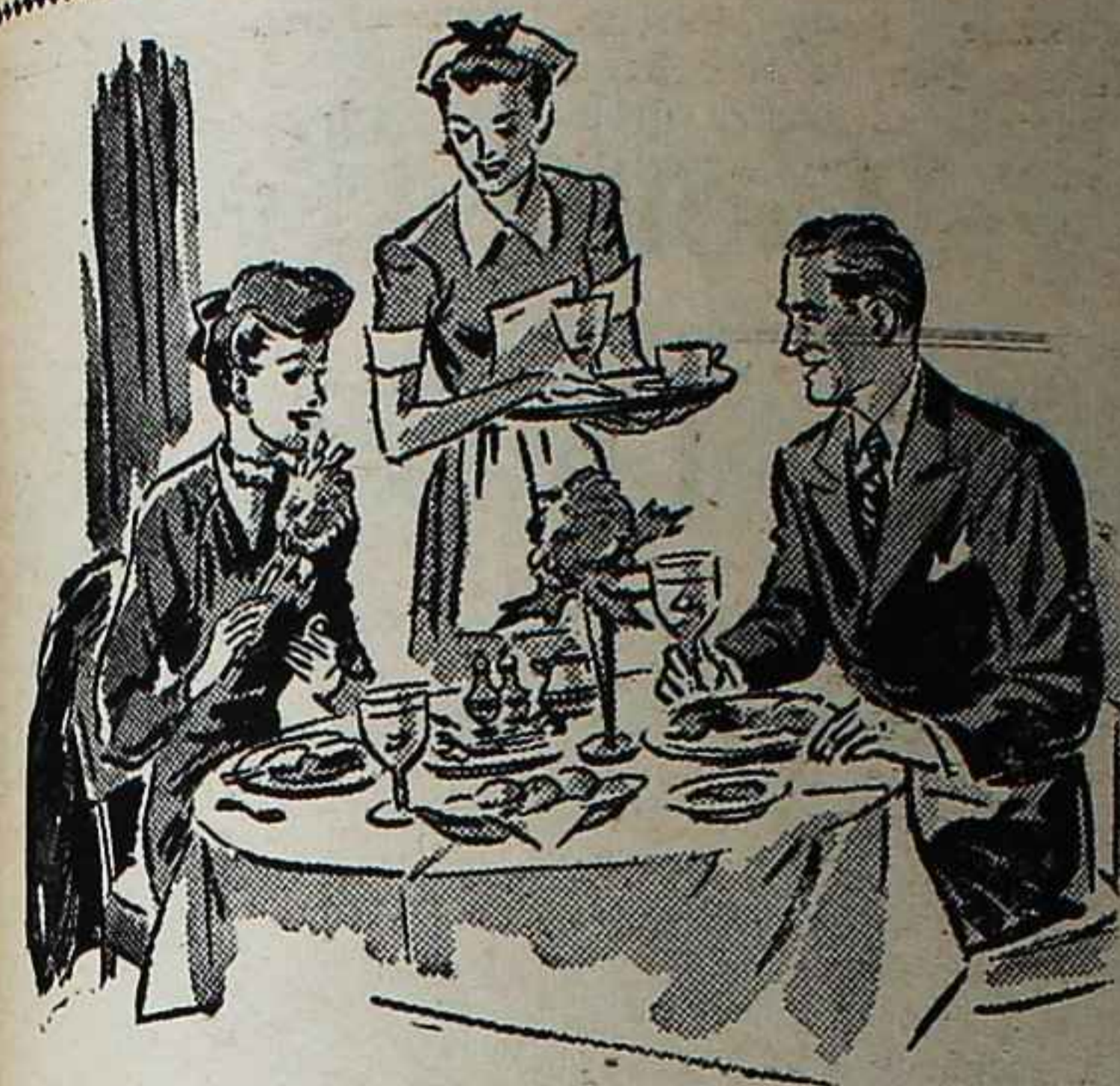
