Background on the Subject: Hunting kayaks have been in use by the indigenous peoples of the Arctic Region for over 4000 years. They were originally made of animal skins that were tightly stretched over frames made of driftwood or bone. The design and maneuverability of these vessels made it easy for our early settlers to hunt game or waterfowl.
